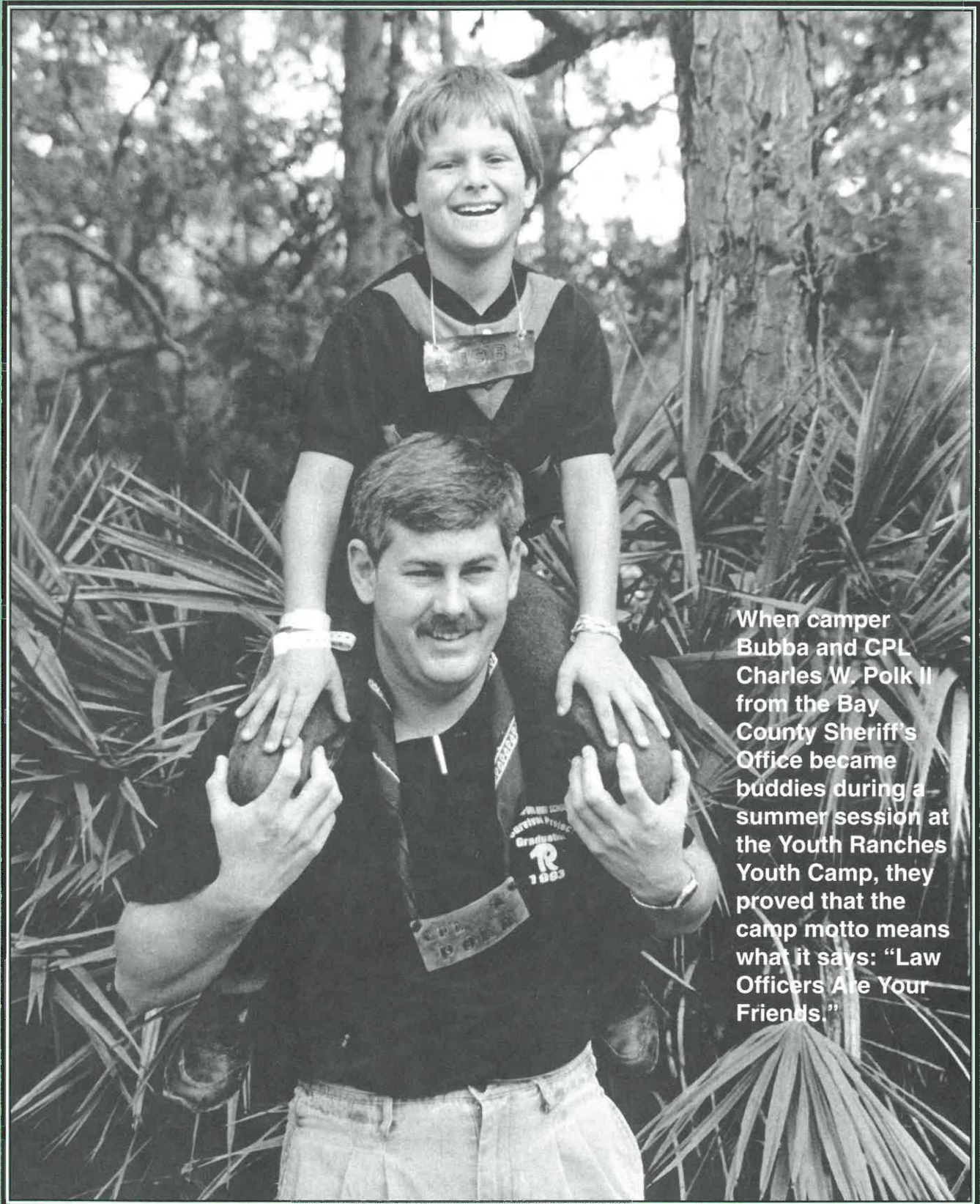

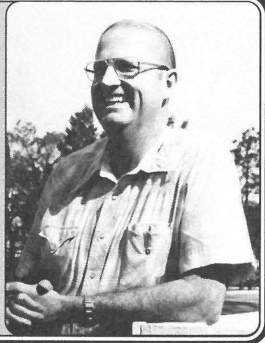

How are we doing as a staff and agency?

Two events took place recently to reassure me again that we, as a staff and agency, are doing a highly creditable job.

First, another yearly "quality assurance" review by the staff of the agency revealed that we are on target in our effort to serve troubled boys and girls and their families with quality and effectiveness.

Over the years, we have developed this evaluating system that helps us to know how we are doing. It involves teams of staff members evaluating each other's program work, but not their own. For example, the Boys Ranch program activities are evaluated by an on-site team from the other Youth Ranches programs over a period of several days.

Secondly, we know we are doing well because the Youth Ranches has just undergone a focused reaccreditation review. An exit conference with the evaluating team members leads me to believe that we should have a minimum number of deficiencies.

The reaccreditation team was comprised of peers from all over the nation who spent several days on the various Youth Ranches campuses.

"Changing of the guard" begins with arrival of President-in-Transition

At six feet, three inches and 220 pounds, C. T. O'Donnell II, is a big man with a big challenge. He also has an impressive resume, and an extensive child-care background that helped him to be chosen as the next President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Mr. O'Donnell came down from the hills of Appalachia to the lowlands of the Suwannee River Valley in mid-August, and, by the time this issue of *The Rancher* comes off the press, he is expected to be sitting in the office formerly occupied by Youth Ranches President Harry K. Weaver.

Months ago, Mr. Weaver began making preparations to vacate his office in the front wing of the Youth Ranches Office of the President building, and he is currently occupying a remote office somewhere in the vicinity of the warehouse. However, he has retained the title of President, and Mr. O'Donnell has been designated President-in-Transition.

Mr. Weaver has made it clear that he wants the Weaver-to-O'Donnell transition to be as smooth and painless as possible. To achieve this, he has begun to fade into the background, but will continue full-time

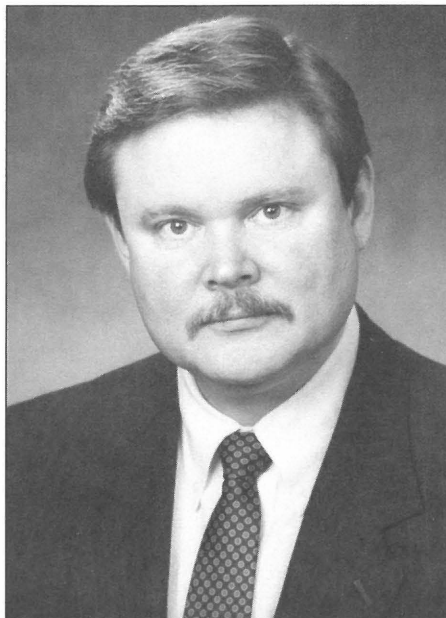

employment until he retires on or before October 1, 1994. In the interim, he will be present and prominent — helping his successor in every possible way.

Thus begins the final phase of an orderly exit process that started to percolate after Mr. Weaver revealed his retirement plans to key staff members and the Youth Ranches Board of Directors in 1989.

Thereafter, a nationwide search for a new president was launched. Ads were placed in national professional periodicals, and almost 600 bulletins were mailed to appropriate agencies and individuals.

This produced responses from 36 viable applicants. Then a Youth Ranches staff committee narrowed the field to five well-qualified finalists, and the Board of Directors

selected three of the finalists for interviews. Ultimately, C. T. O'Donnell II, Chief Executive Officer of the Florence Crittenton Home and Services, in Wheeling, West Virginia, emerged as the number one candidate. He was hired recently after Board Chairman Geoffrey Monge, Sheriff of Sarasota County, was authorized to negotiate an employment agreement.

Currently Mr. O'Donnell is on board as the Youth Ranches President-in-Transition; and Harry K. Weaver still has his hand on the helm. On or before October 1, 1994, Mr. Weaver will officially retire — ending a Youth Ranches career that already spans more

than 31 years — and Mr. O'Donnell will be installed as the new president.

C. T. O'Donnell II, was formerly the Chief Executive Officer of Florence Crittenton Home and Services, a multi-service, multi-site agency with 175 staff members. It serves two states and approximately 1,500 clients annually.

Early this summer, over 500 young boys and girls shared Dougie's enthusiasm at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp. Like many of the other youngsters, Dougie needed to experience personal success to build his self-esteem. He needed a chance to excel in a nurturing environment surrounded by people who care.

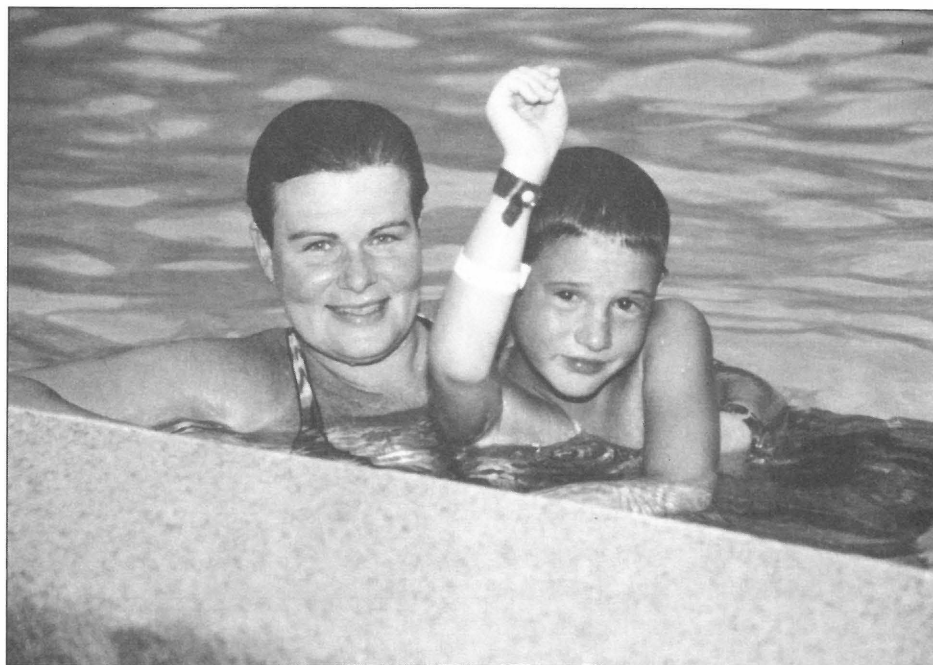
Dougie is a child with a natural sense of enthusiasm and excitement; so much so, that he needs constant attention. If he does not receive positive reinforcement for his behavior, he will seek it through negative words and actions.

From the moment he got on the bus to go to camp, everyone knew his name. Not long into the trip his behavior had earned him a seat right beside Mr. Collins, a counselor who also serves as a camp lifeguard. It was quickly apparent that little Dougie would be a mighty handful.

Soon after arriving at the Youth Camp, Dougie and the rest of the Cheyenne Campsite campers hiked up to the beautiful pool. They were ready to jump in and cool off, but safety standards require a swimming test to determine each child's ability level. Beginners and non-swimmers must stay within a certain safety zone for their own protection. More experienced swimmers are given the freedom to play in a deeper area of the pool.

In an effort to help the lifeguards monitor their areas, each child is given a brightly colored wrist band denoting the level of accomplishment. This system also enables the lifeguards to quickly identify those children who need further instruction and swimming lessons.

Mr. Collins tested the boys and was not surprised to find out that his bus ride buddy, Dougie, needed to work on his swimming skills. He introduced Dougie to Miss Mann, a veteran Waterfront

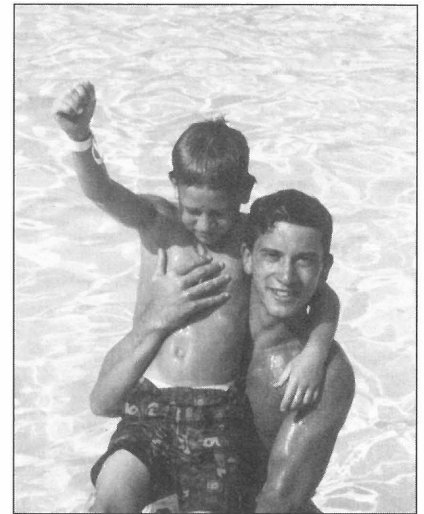
Coordinator at the Youth Camp, then encouraged Dougie to work hard and listen carefully to Miss Mann. Maybe, just maybe, Dougie could move up to the intermediate level by the end of the session.

Dougie and Miss Mann worked hard on the basics of swimming: kicking, breathing, and stroke. Every once in a while he would glance at the lifeguard's chair. He needed to be sure Mr. Collins was keeping a watchful eye on him.

In no time at all, Dougie's skills improved. His perseverance was motivated by his desire to succeed, and by the faith and confidence Mr. Collins had instilled in him. Soon he was ready to be re-tested. The challenge this little fellow faced was to swim across the pool and back in water over his head.

His group leaders had been watching his progress with great interest. When they sensed his anxiety, they immediately began to give words of encouragement and support. Dougie asked Mr. Collins to get in the water and be waiting for him at the end of his test. Miss Mann offered to swim right by his side in case he had any trouble. His campsite buddies gathered around to cheer him on to success.

Dougie nervously approached the side of the pool and slipped into the water. It was a big moment. He took three deep breaths, almost whispering . . . "Ready, Set, Go," and burst into the middle of the pool. His strokes were not perfect, but definitely productive, as he moved across the water. Miss Mann was at his side, but he never reached for

her. He never quit.

When Dougie reached one side of the pool, he paused briefly to catch his breath and to make sure that Mr. Collins was still waiting for him. The cheers of "go, Dougie, go," could be heard around the camp. Youngsters and adults passing by stopped to watch, and got drawn into the emotion of the moment.

Dougie surged toward the other side of the pool, creating quite a splash as his little body moved closer and closer to his goal. The excitement could hardly have been greater if this had been a swim for an Olympic Gold Medal. Everyone wanted Dougie to

succeed . . . and he did!

He reached out for Mr. Collins, climbed on him, and turned to Miss Mann. "I did it! I did it!" he shouted breathlessly.

Yes, Dougie, you certainly did, and we are all very proud of you! You earned new pool privileges and the right to wear another color wristband. More importantly, your hard work, practice, and focused energy paid off.

And now what does Dougie want to be when he grows up? . . . a lifeguard like Mr. Collins, of course!

to the 5th grade, but also volunteered to attend all-day summer enrichment classes — not because he had to, but because he wanted to.

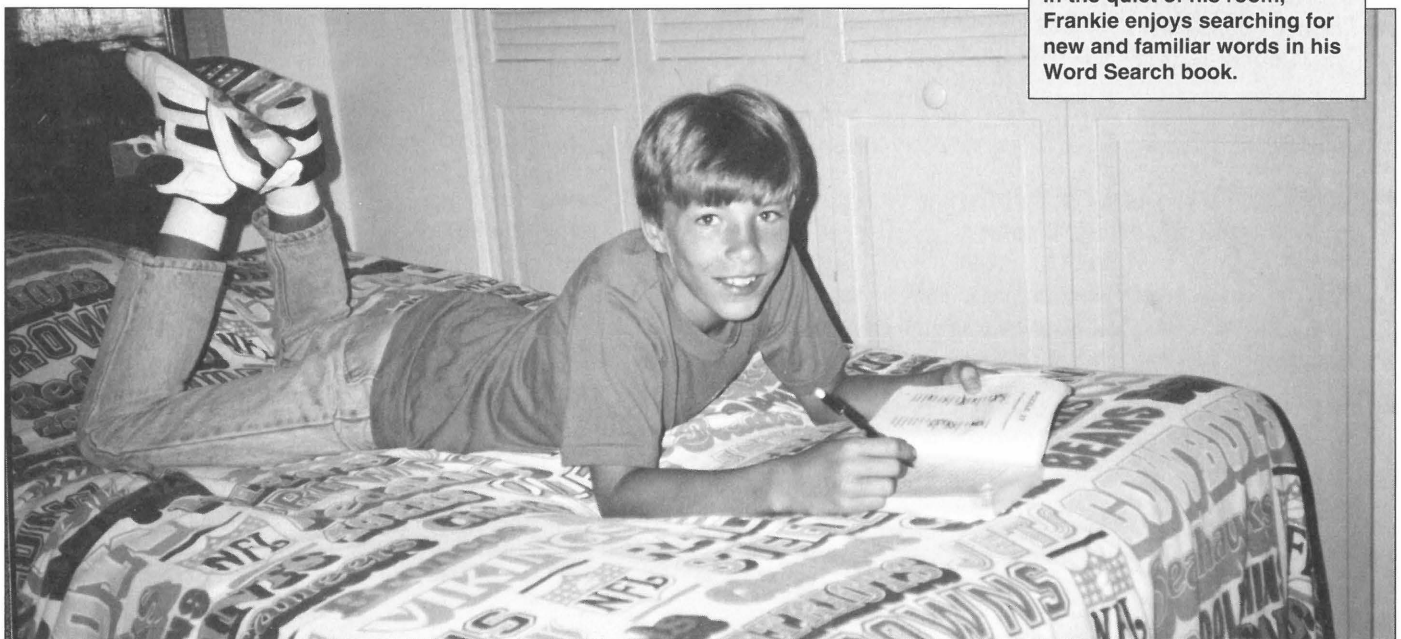


Frankie's hard work and commitment, along with the guiding hand of "Cottage Mom" Susie Wagner, have proved to be an unbeatable combination.

For Boys Ranch residents, COPS is not a crime show



For television fans, COPS is a famous live action show that puts law enforcement officers in front of cameras while carrying out potentially dangerous assignments.

At the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, COPS is something else — a Career Occupational Preference System that helps youths to prepare for their future. The only similarity is that there are times when the lads have to face the camera and get rated on their performances.

COPS is supervised by veteran Boys Ranch mentor Harvey Bues, who has a long history of helping troubled, neglected boys get a new start in life. Over a span of many years he has taught hundreds of boys to accept responsibility and build self-esteem through arts and crafts activities. In this teaching role, he encourages Ranchers to develop personal and practical skills that will prepare them for independent living.

A boy enrolled in COPS learns the details of banking and budgeting; explores the hidden costs that can make renting an apartment a stressful experience; and discovers the rights and responsibilities of a typical citi-

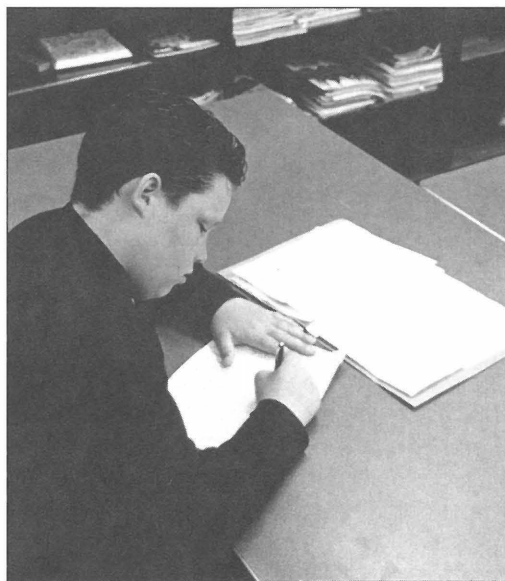
zen in the real world.

Visits to local business firms and talks by speakers from the business community make him aware of opportunities that reward careful preparation and hard work.

Keith is only 12, but he is already beginning to understand the Bues message. "Mr. Bues wants us to grow up and do something with our life," he recently wrote. "He wants us to have a good job, a healthy wife and kids. Since he is helping us, we should help him."

Once youngsters learn the basics of making it on their own, they begin focusing on future career possibilities by responding to a COPS questionnaire. This quiz requires them to consider numerous options such as science, business, clerical work, outdoor pursuits, the arts, or service industries.

After they have established a preference, they begin to develop a personal profile, and become familiar with employ-

ment procedures such as preparing resumes, responding to want ads, completing job applications, and participating in a job interview. When they get to this final phase, they act out a job interview that is videotaped. Later they have an opportunity to review the tape and see what they did right or wrong.

"COPS taught me that you can't expect the boss

or employer to take it easy on you," said Eric, a 15-year-old Rancher, after going through a mock interview. "The employer already has a job, and he has nothing to lose. You have it all to lose.

"The notes and the preparation given to me by Mr. Bues let me know what to expect . . . When I apply for a job this summer, I am going to show what the class has done for me."

In August of 1992, she was admitted to the Youth Villa near Bartow and began making great strides in her personal development.

Six months after her Villa debut, Trish earned the



privilege of moving into the Independent Living cottage. "This is a great achievement," states Ed Fredo, Resident Director. "A youth must exhibit qualities of strength in leadership, responsibility, social skills, and positive peer relationships before such a move can be made."

Trish has also attained a high level of enthusiasm. "It's a great place to live," she said. "I am learning how to take care of myself, by myself, but I always know that there is a safety net. Without my great-grandparents, the Youth Ranches, and my friends, I would not have made it this far."

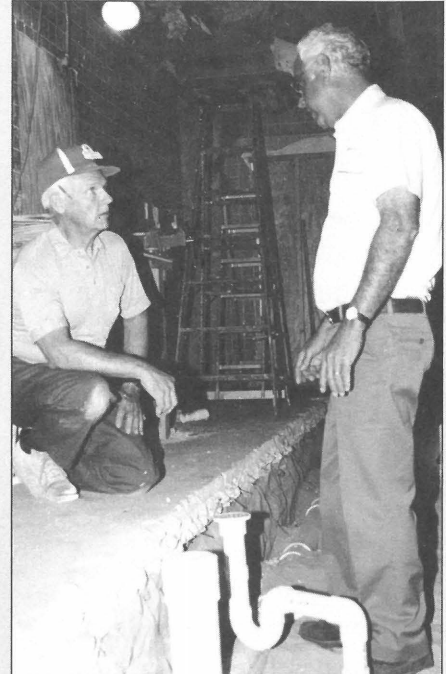

Renovation of Boys Ranch cottages was a marvelous, miraculous gift

When a procession of campers, travel trailers and motor homes belonging to Mobile Missionary Assistance Program volunteers rolled onto the Boys Ranch campus early in 1992, it marked the beginning of a marvelous miracle.

These retired plumbers, electricians, carpenters, roofers, plasterers and general handymen were visiting the Ranch to donate their skills, and they soon discovered that their skills were urgently needed.

The first task assigned to them was to renovate Lewis Cottage, one of the oldest Boys Ranch structures, and it turned out to be a formidable undertaking.

Completed in 1961, the attractive brick building had been "home" to hundreds of neglected and troubled boys over a span of 30 years, but now it was vacant. It still looked pretty good on the outside, but the inside was a different story.

Walking through the interior room by room, the Mobile Missionaries began to realize that the

outmoded electrical system, the disintegrating plumbing, and the deteriorating drains would all have to be replaced. They also suspected correctly that the roof would have to be rebuilt.

It soon became obvious that a transformation bordering on the miraculous would be required to bring this 1960s building into the 1990s, but that didn't deter the MMAPers. Their prompt response to the challenge was both audible and visible as they cranked up their power tools and began a major makeover.

Using materials provided by the Boys Ranch, they completed a major portion of the renovation during two 1992 visits.

Then along came Lake City contractor Hugh Buie with a crew of skilled workers from his Southern Equipment Painting Co. to not only finish the Lewis Cottage job, but also complete extensive renovation work at Hauer Cottage. All labor was donated, but the Youth Ranches provided the building materials.

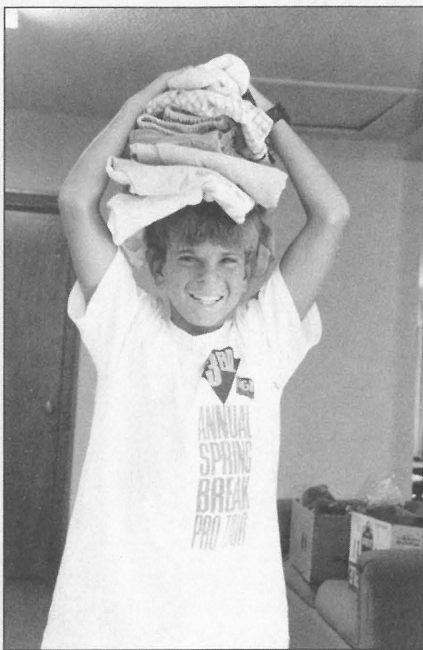
The Hauer Cottage facelift was completed

during Easter vacation while the residents were away. They returned to find that the interior walls and ceilings had been painted and some new "dry wall" had been installed.

In June 1993, Lewis Cottage was pronounced "ready for occupancy," and preparations were begun to turn the empty building into an attractive "home" for 10 rambunctious boys and their cottage parents.

Curtains were hung. Beds were assembled. Furniture arrived and was put in place. Dishes and utensils were sorted in the kitchen cabinets. Boys began hanging jeans, jackets, and shirts in the closets.

Staff members dropping by to watch the transformation said it seemed miraculous — especially when the walls began to reverberate with the shouts and laughter of the boys who were moving in.

That, however, is not the end of the "miracle." Boys Ranch Business Manager Bruce Goff disclosed later that the Mobile Missionaries have promised to return in November and start renovation of McGehee Cottage.

Top Cop Charity Challenge raised \$18,000 for our boys and girls

"Gentlemen, start your engines" was faintly heard over the roar of the record crowd and the revving of the race cars assembled for this highly competitive race. The drivers looked to the right and to the left, recognizing faces and showing smug smiles of anticipated success.

Then, after only a moment's hesitation, the race for the Tampa Bay area Top Cop was on. Stock cars zoomed around the one-quarter mile oval track at breakneck speed. Metal met metal on a few curves and when it was all over, Pinellas County Sheriff Everett Rice emerged as the 1993 Top Cop Champion.

Volunteer's Villa visit reveals "There is a lot of love here."

"When they told me I had 77 hours of leave coming that I didn't expect, I knew immediately what to do," remarked Deputy Sheriff Pat Negron from Martin County. "I called the Youth Villa in Bartow and talked with Resident Director Ed Freddo. I told him I was willing to help any way I could."

That phone call started the ball rolling, after the usual screening required of all volunteers who work with children, Pat took up temporary residence in the "Independent Living" cottage as a Youth Villa Volunteer.

"I have always been very curious about how the programs actually work at the Youth Ranches," Pat stated. She went on to explain that a 1990 fund raising "Lock-down" at the Martin County Jail gave her the opportunity to talk with several members of the Youth Ranches staff. "I was intrigued," she said. "And that's when I knew that I would be visiting the Youth Ranches sooner or later."

Pat is no stranger to living with a house full of young people. She has seven sons and four grandsons. However, having a large family and a

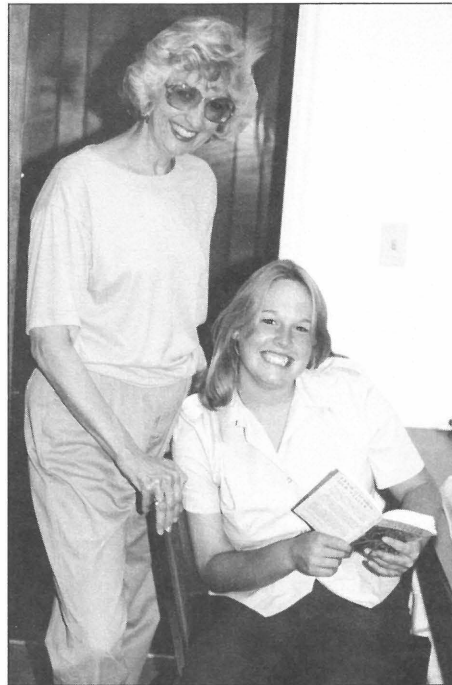
demanding career have not kept this special lady with a big heart from giving special time to the boys and girls in her church, as well as in other youth oriented organizations.

Discussing her stay in the cottage, Pat said she discovered that "there is always something that needs to be done — taking the girls to work or school, tutoring, cooking — the list goes on and on. Everyone stays very busy, but it's great!"

When asked what she thought about the program after her visit, Pat had this to say: "Love, care, structure, and security is what the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches is all about."



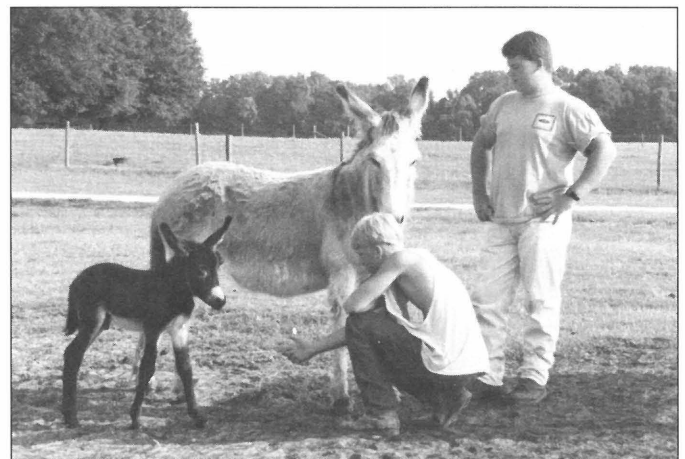

Jessy and Burt are Boys Ranch Celebrities

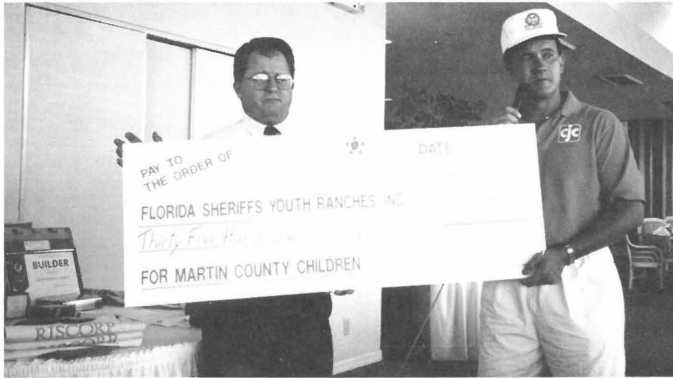

A toast to the Treasure Coast

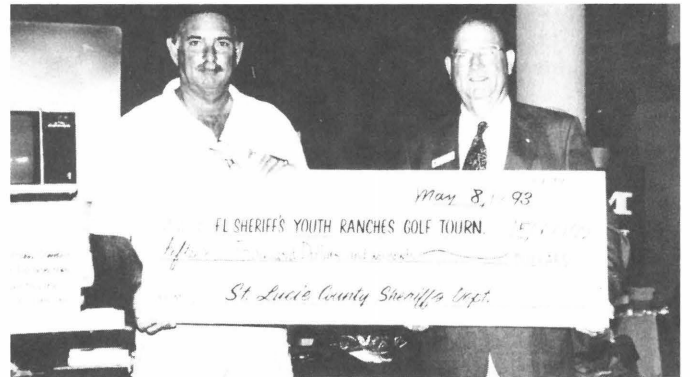

So here's a toast to the Treasure Coast where folks truly care and share.

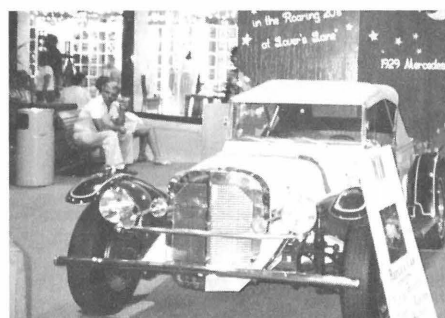

After 35 years . . . Ranch founder returns for a progress report

On October 18, 1957, eight Florida Sheriffs and Florida Sheriffs Bureau Director Don McLeod, sat around a table in Live Oak's Gold Leaf Restaurant, and held the first meeting of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Board of Trustees.

Early in May 1993, one of the two surviving members of the board, former Polk County Sheriff Hagan Parrish, visited the Boys Ranch and received a detailed report on the amazing results of that historic meeting.

He knew, of course, that the Boys Ranch had evolved into a statewide network of child-care facilities and services operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc., during the intervening 35 years. However, a return to the place where it all began was a revelation for the 76-year-old distinguished visitor.

Accompanied by his son-in-law and granddaughter, Parrish was given a grand tour of the Boys Ranch campus and the Youth Ranches Office of the

President by Youth Ranches President Harry K. Weaver.

He listened attentively as Weaver explained that the Boys Ranch is currently one of four residential facilities operated by the Youth Ranches, in addition to a wilderness camp and a summer camp program.

When he departed, one statistic remained uppermost in his mind: Weaver's statement that over 7,500 troubled, neglected, and unsupervised youngsters had been served by the Youth Ranches since 1957.

Parrish was Sheriff of Polk County from 1950 to 1961. The Sheriffs who served on the first Boys Ranch Board of Trustees with him were Hugh Lewis, Suwannee County; John P. Hall, Clay County; John Spottswood (chairman), Monroe County; Maurice Linton, Taylor County; Odell Carlton, Hardee County; Emmett Shelby, Escambia County; and Sid Saunders, Pinellas County. The late John A. Madigan, Jr., Attorney for the Florida Sheriffs Association, also participated in the historic first board meeting.

Skills and frugality create fire truck for Boys Ranch

Organized in 1967, the Boys Ranch Volunteer Fire Department provided protection on campus as well as in surrounding rural areas for over 25 years.

Recently, due to the high cost of liability insurance and the extensive training required for firemen, it was scaled down to handle emergencies on campus only.

When this revamping took place, Suwannee County citizens established the Stage Coach Volunteer Fire Department nearby to serve the area surrounding the Boys Ranch. This relieved the Boys Ranch of considerable responsibility and liability, but also created a serious problem. Since two fire trucks used at the Ranch had been borrowed from the Florida Forestry Service and Suwannee County, they had to be turned over to the Stage Coach volunteers.

Faced with an empty firehouse and a tight budget, Boys Ranch Business Manager Bruce Goff, Farm Manager Anthony Adams and Mechanic Shop Supervisor David Hicks held a strategy meeting. Since they couldn't borrow or buy a fire truck, they decided they would have to build one on the chassis of an old dual-wheel farm truck.

Youth Ranches President Harry K. Weaver approved the proposal and the Mechanic Shop crew was soon at work on the project under David Hicks' supervision.

Mechanic Hugh Spencer, assisted by several Ranchers, made major body repairs to the old truck and painted it a bright fire engine red. Then they mounted a 462-gallon water tank, pump, hose, and reel on the truck, and it was ready to roll.

Although the Boys Ranch firemen are all adult staff members, boys participate in drills as a learning experience and help to maintain the equipment.

Admittedly, the built-from-scratch truck doesn't have the same capabilities — nor all of the bells and whistles — of a \$100,000 factory-built model. However, it does enable the Boys Ranch firemen to make a fast response in emergencies while awaiting arrival of Suwannee County and Live Oak firemen who are just minutes away from the campus.

The Boys Ranch firemen are still lacking adequate "bunker gear" such as hats, coats, boots, etc., but the firehouse is no longer empty, and presumably the boys and staff members are sleeping more peacefully.

In the early days of the Boys Ranch the Florida Firemen's Association (FFA) provided a major portion of the funds used to finance the fire house, and individual members of the Association helped the Ranch to acquire the first fire trucks.

Through the generous assistance provided by FFA, the Ranch has always given a high priority to fire prevention and fire safety.

Charitable Gift Annuity . . . A Gift That Gives and Provides Payments For Life

What is a charitable gift annuity?

A charitable gift annuity is a gift to help troubled boys and girls in Florida while providing a guaranteed lifetime annuity for the donor.

It is an irrevocable agreement by which you make a gift to a qualified charitable organization and receive fixed payments for life. It is also a gift since part of the payment is given for a charitable cause. Charitable gift annuities are recognized by state and federal authorities as a way to make a gift, and they have been around for many, many years.

The annuity payment one receives is based upon the amount of the gift and the age of the donor. The older the donor, the higher the gift annuity rate.

A portion of the gift is immediately tax deductible and a portion of the periodic payment is tax-free during normal life expectancy.

Organizations issuing gift annuities are required by Florida law to meet precise financial standards and be registered. The Youth Ranches was the first organization in Florida to be issued a permit to write charitable gift annuities. The Youth Ranches permit number is DAAP-74-1. The Committee on Gift Annuities meets every three years to set the uniform rates and the Youth Ranches is a sponsoring organization of this group.

You are encouraged to consult your attorney or other professional advisor for advice and assistance.

***EXAMPLE:**

A \$10,000 charitable gift annuity agreement with the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. will give a 70-year-old person the same after tax cash payment each year for their remaining life as a \$10,000 Certificate of Deposit or similar fixed rate investment that yields 9.18% assuming a 28% marginal tax bracket.

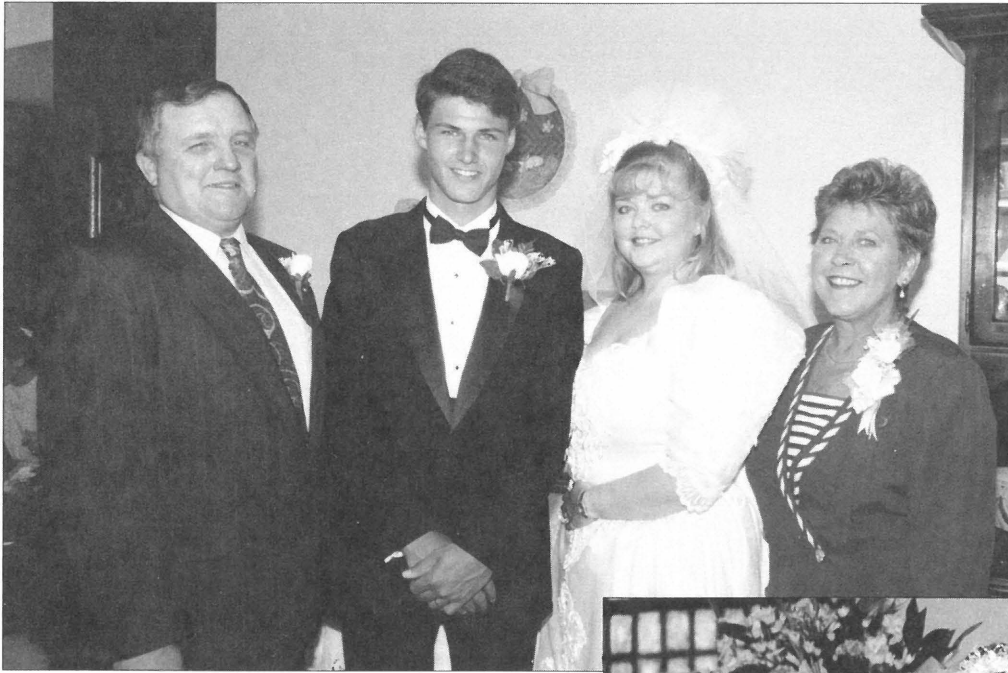

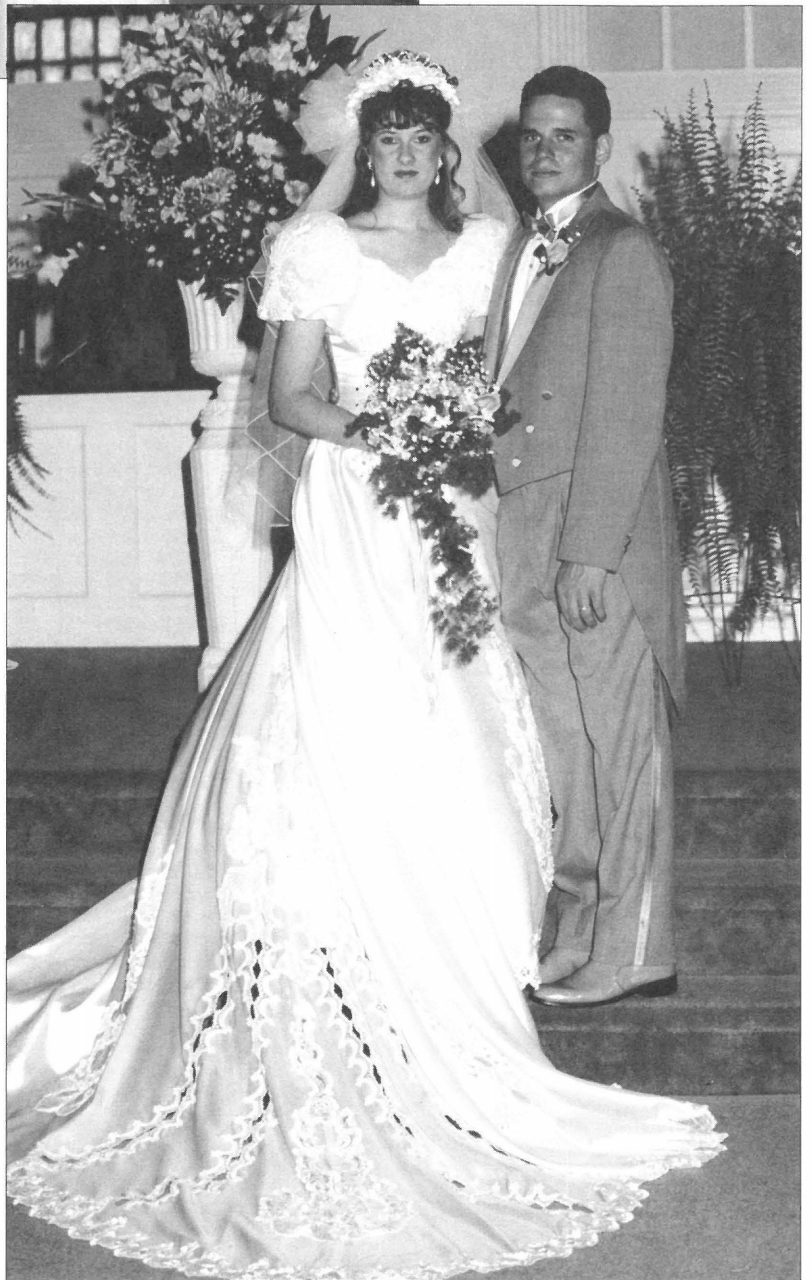
Former Ranchers begin a new chapter in their lives

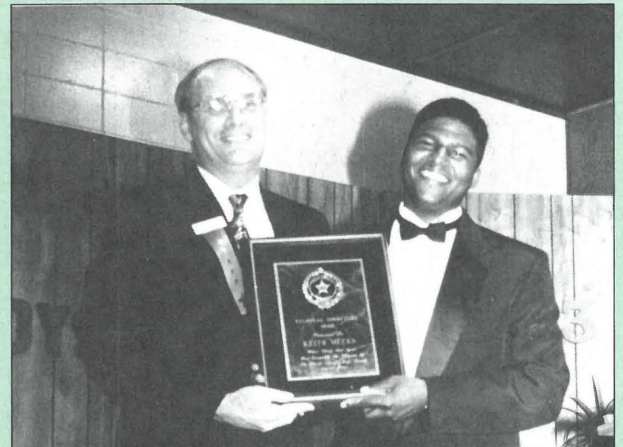
