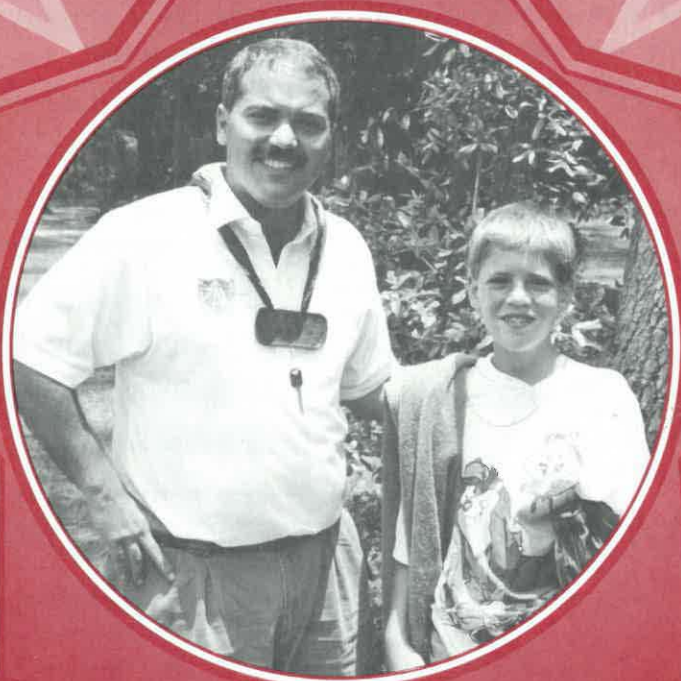

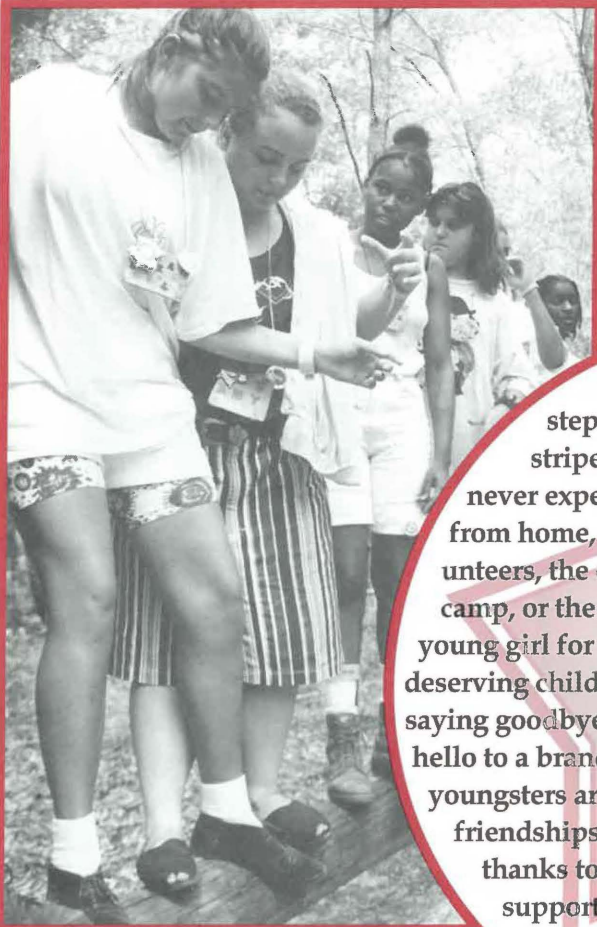

MEETING CHALLENGES

As hundreds of Florida's underprivileged children pass through the forest-lined gates of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp each year, they are anxiously preparing for a week packed with esteem-building activities; planning their free time reaching for the stars; and, making room for new friends, adventures, and achievements.

THE "CHALLENGE COURSE"

When boys and girls venture from home to spend a small portion of their summer at the Youth Camp; canoeing, archery, horseback riding, hiking, and swimming are some of the wholesome activities they encounter. Among these many inspiring events, those that offer the greatest opportunity for self-improvement, unbelievable accomplishment, and

phenomenal teamwork are nestled among the tall timbers of the camp's "Challenge Course."

This unusual "obstacle" course requires a rare blend of ingenuity, patience, strength, communication, and teamwork. Completing the 5-section course builds confidence and trust, but, most importantly, strengthens peer relationships and utilizes special group teamwork and imagination to meet the various challenges.

THE TRANSPORTER

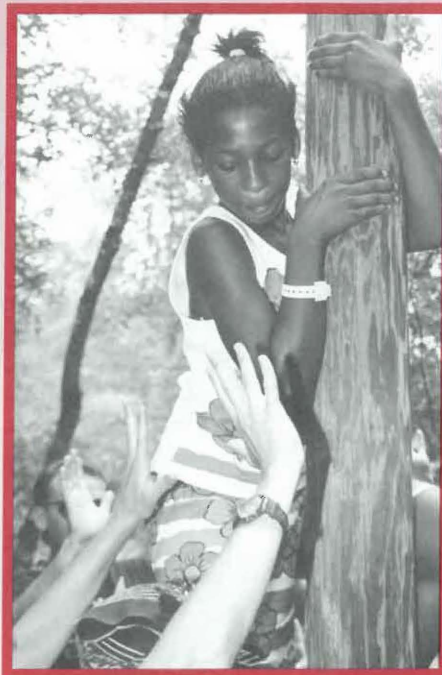
The year is 2125. Ten girls of the Walla-Walla Campsite must board a device only large enough for three and transport to safety before their spaceship self-destructs.

This small, wooden plank rests on the ground of a sand-filled path. One-by-one, the young girls step onto the tiny, square platform, but, as the sixth camper takes her place, one-by-one they tumble harmlessly off.

Time is running out! The girls must regroup

THE GENERATOR

PIRANHA LAKE

Across leafy paths, through vine-covered pines, and on the opposite end of the “Challenge Course,” campers encounter the perils of Piranha Lake.

The mighty boys of Cayuga, their counselors and volunteer law officers must carefully race across a prehistoric lake of man-eating piranhas, balancing on thin, wooden planks that rest on zig-zagged tree stumps. But, with only a limited amount of boards to work with, our campers must use teamwork and smart-thinking to discover a strategy for getting across the dangerous moat.

Early attempts at completing the challenge fall short; a board touches ground, a camper tips into the imaginary water—Cayuga must start from the beginning each time. Not discouraged, the boys think harder and work longer. A plank is passed, a boy crosses. Hand-in-hand, one-by-one, the Cayugas reach safe, dry land. “Come on, Mr. Slachta, you’re the last one, you can do it!” Mr. Slachta takes a first step onto the last beam. Without warning, his foot

Slowly, but surely, through perseverance and pride, quick-thinking and drive, the last camper steps across, being braced by a friendly hand, to the end of the wooden beam to complete the event! The Shoshones call out their names one-by-one, in a row, overwhelmed and proud that they could accomplish such a monstrous feat! Good going, girls!

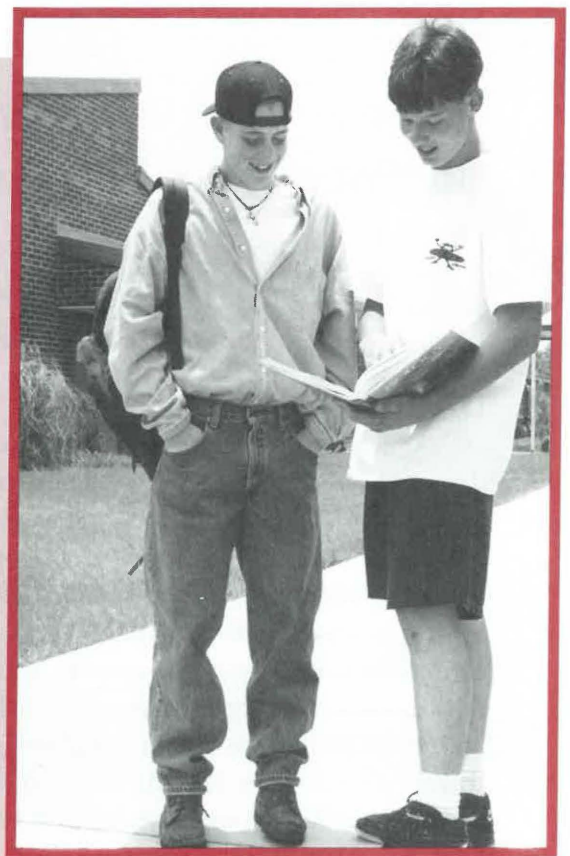
Did You Know?

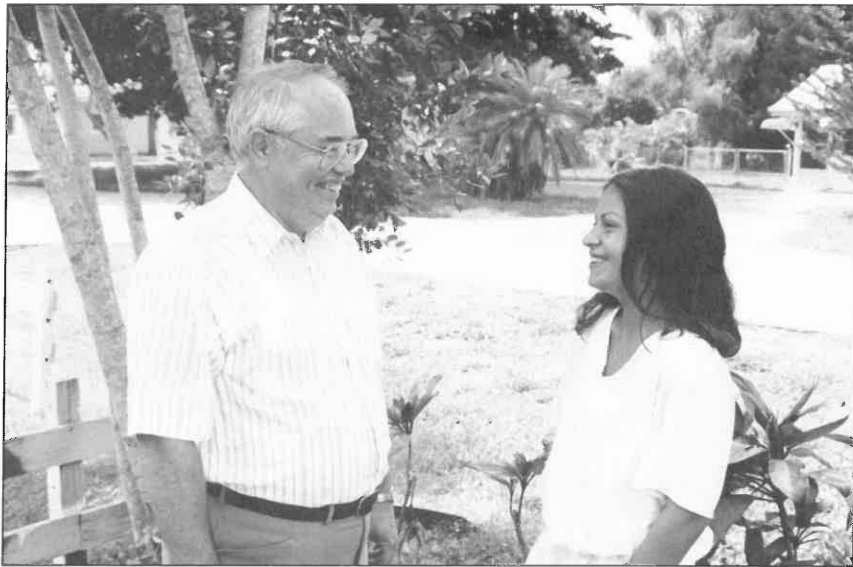

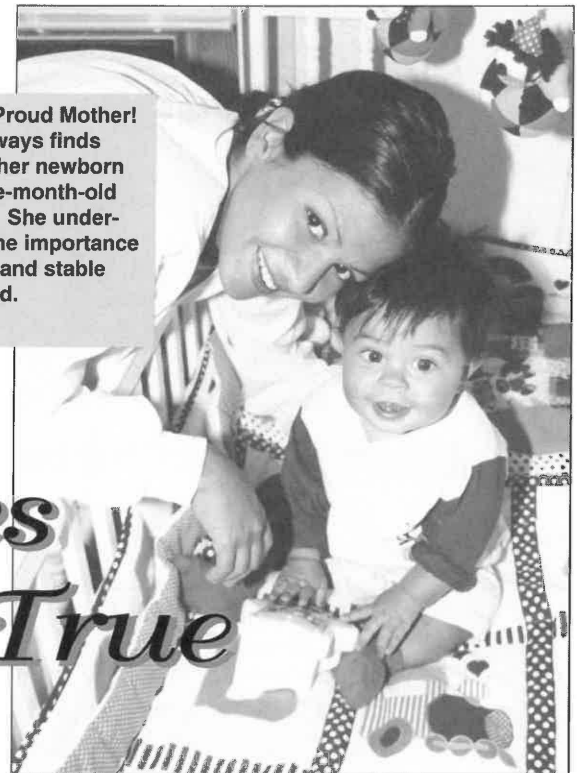

"I was literally living on my Mom's back-porch," recalls Maria. "There was no lock on the door, but it didn't matter, I just couldn't bear to listen to authority; I certainly didn't have my priorities straight."

Today, after five years of diligent work and sound guidance, under the faithful care of the Youth Ranches, Maria Santos Olsen has charted a new course, ending unhealthy friendships, repairing broken family relationships, and discovering

new career paths, as well as, personal focus and contentment. "Maria has come a long way," says Youth Ranches Family Social Worker Fred Preuss. "I witnessed her growth from young girl to young lady and watched the relationship with her Mother change and strengthen. The improvement in her self-esteem and inner confidence has paved

the foundation for a brighter future."

At the often turbulent age of 17, Maria entered the residential program at the Youth Ranch/Safety Harbor to work through problems, polish communication skills, and find focus. After spending six months at the program site and many productive years in aftercare, Maria has taken control of her life and her own destiny. "I wouldn't have graduated high school if it weren't for the Youth Ranches constant help and support. Everyone stuck by me, giving me the self-esteem to finally succeed."

Ironically, for a future that once appeared in jeopardy, Maria, now 21, is experiencing a renewal. Family crises and communication break-

downs have vanished, and she is now responsible for a family of her own—a husband and new baby boy. Additionally, Maria has a blossoming career on the immediate horizon. "I'm so proud of Maria," says Mrs. Santos. "She's got her life in order, with her marriage and the birth of Mike, Jr. I can't thank the Ranch enough for what they did for Maria and our family."

While juggling the rigors of her parental duties with the pressures of attending school, this full-time mother, part-time student is studying dental hygiene at the James L. Walker Vocational Center, and maintaining an "A" average in her classwork. "She's an excellent student," says Maria's instructor, Certified Dental Assistant Mrs. Micki Reback, C.D.A, A.A. "I have a lot of confidence in her ability to succeed."

Each individual, as they slowly mature and venture down one of life's forking paths, must choose between right and wrong; judge from what is good and what is evil; learn from unfortunate mistakes made along the way; learn to cherish family and friends; and realize, that even the most distant, untouchable of dreams can be reached. Maria Santos Olsen has learned to touch her dreams.

Through hard work, the constant love and support of friends and family, Maria has found her Prince along a darkened forest path; she has created a new life to cherish; and discovered that, for some . . . Fairy Tales Really Do Come True!

Did You Know?

Every boy and every girl at every one of our five residential programs statewide is required to hold an on-campus job within a desired area of interest. Each child must interview for a position, will receive performance evaluations, and can be terminated—just as if they were an employee in real life.

This intricate part of the Youth Ranches

instruction is meant to teach discipline, responsibility, and broaden the horizon for many of our unfocused youth. Youngsters may perform their duties in offices on campus, in the yards and gardens of neighboring cottages, on the farms of our Ranches, or in the shops of on-site maintenance facilities.



A young Rancher may elect to broaden his or her vocational exploration, increase mechanical skills, and build self-esteem in the machine shop. Ranchers are also expected to perform chores within their cottages like preparing tabletops for household meals or sweeping porches free from dirt.



Thanks to the guidance and constant support of caring staff, our youngsters know the importance of the "work ethic," and will acquire the tools that will eventually help them prosper in adulthood.

"BEING GONE, HE CONTINUES TO SPEAK"

Hearfelt words, full of love and loyalty, embraced the crowd gathered to say good-bye to classmate, teammate, friend, brother, and son, Nicholas Karl Oelrich. The sadness of losing this quiet, athletic, gentle giant could only be soothed by the compassionate sharing of those closest to him.

Nick's father, Alachua

County Sheriff Steve Oelrich, remembered his son in a letter read at the Service of Faith and Resurrection and written just after his accidental death. In it he recalled how the two never parted without the words "I love you, Nick...Love you too, Dad."

Family and close friends nodded with a bittersweet smile and the wipe of a tear as others spoke of brighter days and the impact this considerate, tenderhearted young man had on their life. Beautiful, moving music played and sung by members of his own youth choir, carried the message of love and loss.

Struggling to share thoughts meaningful enough to match his emotion, 18-year old Andrew Knopf softly spoke, "When the sun goes down below the horizon, it is not set, for the heavens glow a full hour after the sun's departure.

"When a great guy sets, such as Nick, the sky of this world is luminous long after he is out of sight. Such a person never really dies out of this

world. When he goes, he leaves behind much of himself. Being gone, he continues to speak."

In so many memorable ways for those who knew and loved Nick, Andrew's words ring true. But perhaps, to those who never knew him, the needy, neglected youngsters who will receive blessings through the loving gifts given in Nick's name, and the 17 individuals who benefited from the donation of his organs and tissue, the message and purpose of his life will be heard louder and clearer than ever before, because . . . "Being gone, he continues to speak."



Following the wishes of the family "so that Nick's death might mean a blessing for a needy young person in Florida," fellow Sheriff Ken Ertle of Marion County shared a gift in his memory. Jesse, who accepted the check for the Nicholas Karl Oelrich Memorial Endowment Fund, is a Boys Ranch resident from North Central Florida. Gifts made to this permanent fund are perpetual, only the income will be used to help our boys and girls.

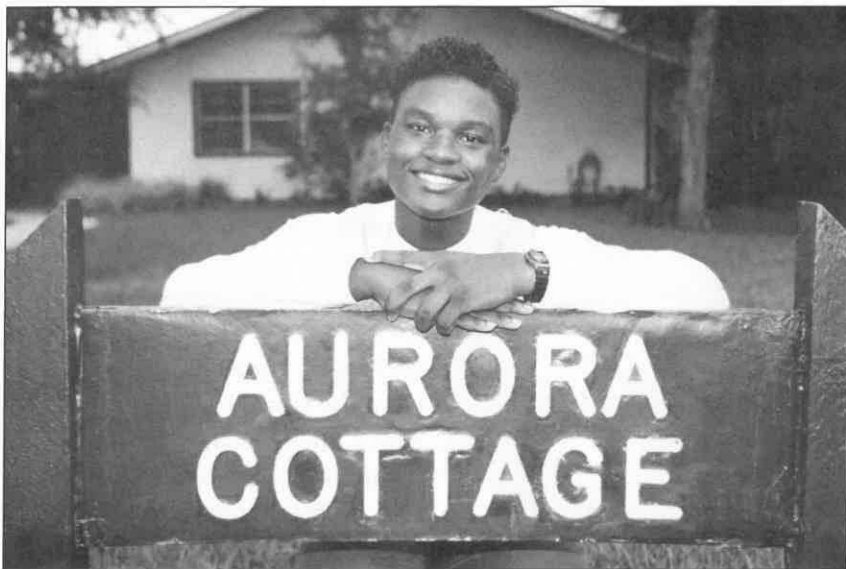
Sheriff Monge's 50-miler . . . Going the extra mile!

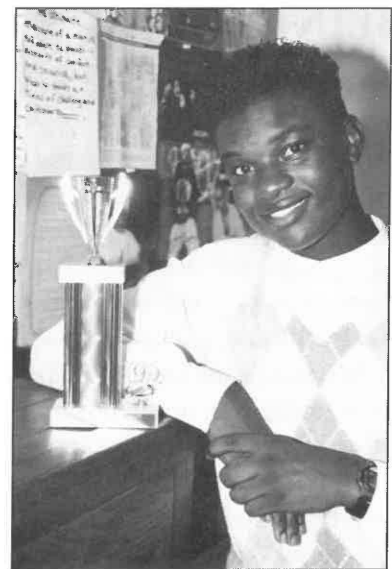

A Prelude Into the Future

Sitting at the delicately polished, ivory keys of a grand piano, the "classical" composer creates pieces of music using various chord patterns, note progressions, and musical rhythms. These commonly used elements must act and react together in order to produce a pleasing composition. If any of these notes or harmonies are misplaced or misinterpreted, the composer's entire effort may be compromised; a fact that may also be said about life itself. Without the proper nurturing, care, and guidance; with overwhelming obstacles or an important element missing from a child's life, it could signal disaster. But, occasionally, among the ruins of a troubled childhood, is born the helping hand of a friend; a person, like the missing note of an unfinished song, is there to offer balance and support. For one young Rancher, this valuable and necessary relationship has afforded him—A Prelude Into the Future.

In January 1994, a young man stepped onto the campus at the Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota, a safe haven for him to work through life's problems. This disadvantaged teen needed a place to establish a solid foundation; he was quietly searching for a place to call "home."

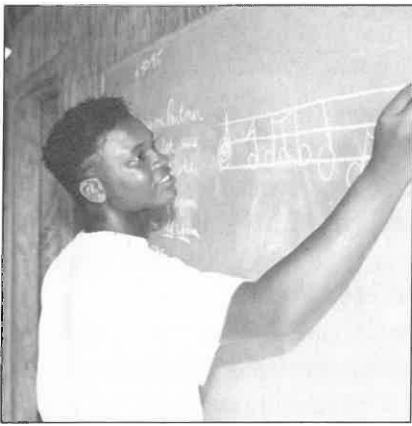
Spending much of a young life bounding through foster homes, 14-year old Stanley finally received his "chance," a unique opportunity to strive for success, that—for a lifetime—appeared

unattainable. "The Ranch has helped me with so much," said Stanley. "I've improved my school-work, communication, and interaction with peers...Without the Ranch I would never have gained the courage to go after my dreams."

In only a year and a half, Stanley's progress has been outstanding. School grades have climbed from once "failing" to "above average." New-found leadership skills help him complete household chores quickly and efficiently, while peer activities have increased his own self-esteem and personal responsibilities. "Stanley is now one of the oldest boys in the cottage," said cottage "Pop" Stump. "His leadership is an inspiration to the younger kids; I know they look up to him for guidance and advice."

Known for his soft, melodic voice and proficiency on the keyboard, Stanley has collected trophies and ribbons at talent contests and statewide competitive events. This past summer, while representing Southeast High School at the All-State competition in Gainesville, Stanley performed a beautiful Italian song called "Nina." "We were all so proud of him," said "Mom" Stump. "He studied so hard to learn the Italian; he had never spoken a word of it in his life, but he sounded wonderful."

Like each young child dreaming of a brighter tomorrow, Stanley was motivated at an early age by inspirational childhood music idols. Watching these performers sing and dance across neon-lighted stages fueled his desire to become a

popular and accomplished musician. And, by continuously reaching for the stars and following new and positive paths; thanks to the steadfast support of caring staff, faithful friends, and a loving grandmother, his lifelong dream is taking focus, inching well within reach. "My grandma has stuck by me," said Stanley. "She understands me and the problems I've had to face."

Each day, thousands upon thousands of neglected children fall short of discovering the joys and healthy advantages a "typical" childhood can offer. Oftentimes, needy youth seek refuge and

support that lay just beyond the grasp of their tiny, helpless fingers. But, with a helping hand or friendly nudge, everyone can further their lifelong ambitions.

With caring people always by his side; because he never gave up hope or the dreams of his youth, Stanley is working on his best piece of all; Stanley is writing and living—A Prelude to His Future.

"This is something that stays with these boys forever," says Officer Sharp. "If I can save one life, it will all be worth it."

Charitable Gift Annuity



The charitable gift annuity allows you to give to our troubled boys and girls and also provides you and/or someone you designate with a guaranteed periodic payment for life.

A sizeable portion of your gift (cash, stocks, bonds, or mutual funds) is immediately tax deductible and a portion of the periodic annuity payment is tax-free during normal life expectancy. The agreement is irrevocable and is guaranteed by the full assets of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc.

The amount of the annuity payment is based on the amount of the gift and the age of the annuitant. Typically,

the older you are, the greater the payment.

Organizations that are permitted to issue gift annuity agreements are required by state and federal law to meet stringent financial standards. The Youth Ranches was the first organization in the state of Florida to receive a permit number, which is DAAP-74-1.

The American Council on Gift Annuities meets every three years to establish the uniform gift annuity rates. The Youth Ranches is a sponsoring organization of this group.

As long as the home towns are not revealed, this will be extremely difficult to do. We want our donors to know that we have never permitted other organizations to use our lists of supporters, and we will continue to do everything possible to preserve their privacy.

This Honor Roll gives special recognition to generous supporters of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches and its six child-care programs: the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, Youth Villa, Youth Ranch/Safety Harbor, Youth

Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota, Youth Camp, and Caruth Camp. Those who give \$100 or more receive a Builder Certificate, and their names and pictures are printed in *The Rancher*. Those who give \$1,000 or more receive Lifetime Honorary Membership in the Florida Sheriffs Association, and their names and pictures are printed in the *Sheriff's Star*, official publication of the Florida Sheriffs Association. A large wall plaque is awarded to each Lifetime Honorary Member, and gold stars are added when that person's total gifts reach \$5,000 (one star); \$10,000 (two stars); \$15,000 (three stars); \$20,000 (four stars); and \$25,000 (five stars). For gifts of \$50,000 or more, there is the Golden Star Award. Donors of \$100,000 or more receive the Grand Star Award.

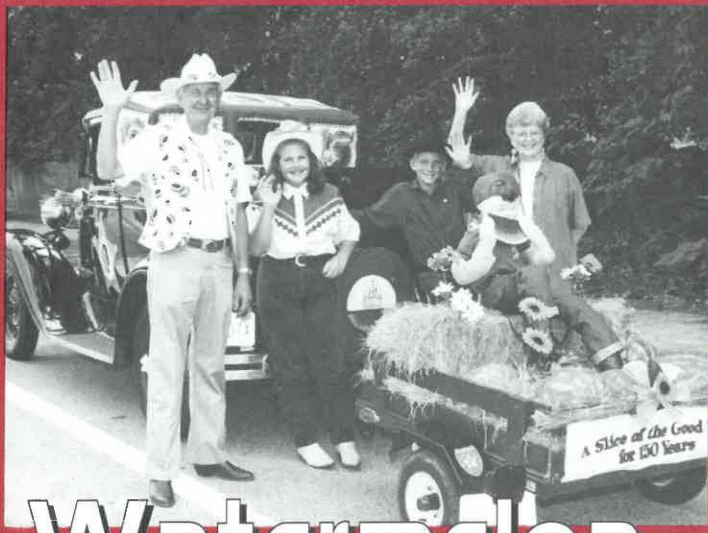

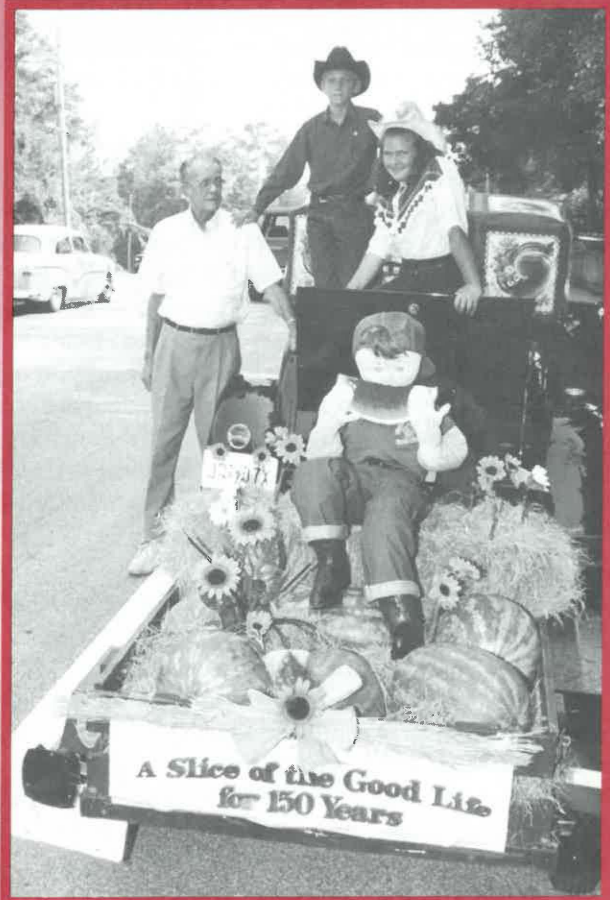
