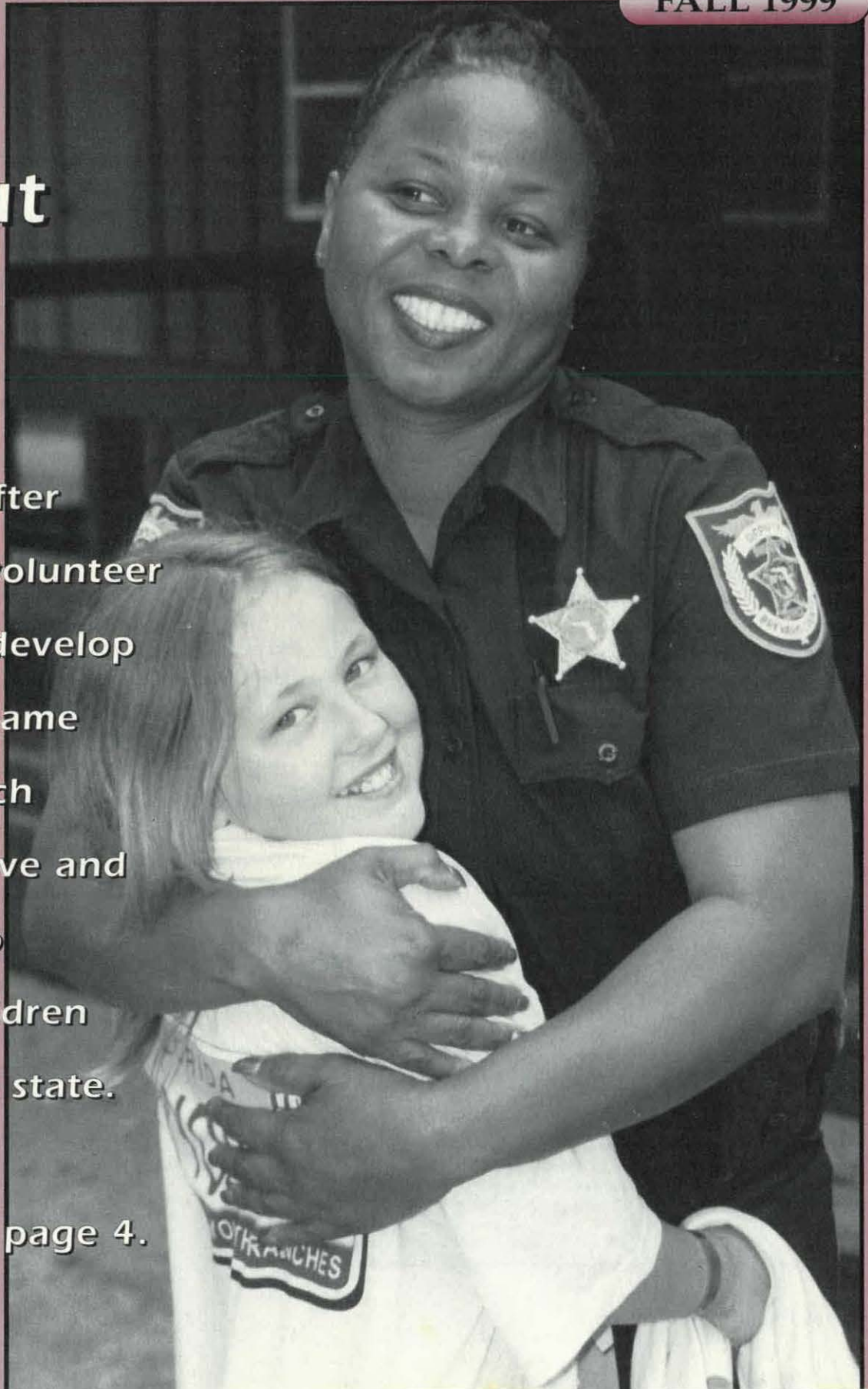

President's Perspective

A message from Roger O. Bouchard, Jr.
President of the Florida Sheriffs
Youth Ranches, Inc.



Over the past few months, I have had the opportunity to speak with a number of people concerning the series of shootings and other violent episodes taking place in our public schools. Reactions to recent tragedies, from children to grandparents, have caused concern and confusion — how can young people commit such cold blooded and terrible crimes? Senseless acts, like the violence at Columbine High School, not only cause serious injury and death, but also bring fear and suspicion into the schoolrooms and playgrounds across America.

What causes young people to explode in violence, lashing out at all those in their path? Ongoing studies of school

violence indicate the young men who commit these crimes are angry, frustrated and isolated individuals who feel a need to take revenge on those who they feel have hurt them. CNN Interactive (May 28, 1999) reports, "In the school shootings that have occurred in the United States in the past three years, almost all of the boys accused of the crimes said that they had been teased or rejected by others." In "The Why Files," psychologist Shawn Johnson explains

that people turn aggressive "when you don't have the problem-solving means of talking, negotiating, when you can't get what you want." The bottom line is that these young men were hurt, angry and never learned the necessary skills needed to develop positive relationships with other people. They never learned the give and take necessary to get along with peers or developed the self-esteem needed to walk away from teasing without developing hatred for the one(s) who caused the pain.

For over 41 years, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has helped thousands of boys and girls who have been hurt, rejected and abused by those around them. When these kids came to us, they had deficits in education, social skills, and vocational abilities. Mostly, they had serious problems relating to others around them. But, through caring relationships and the uniquely-structured lifestyle the Youth Ranches provides, these children are able to find meaning in their lives, and learn how to handle their hurts and rejections in positive and non-violent ways.

There is no "quick fix" or "one size fits all" social program that will stop the violence being committed by our children. It can only be corrected through ongoing, face-to-face interaction between those who care and those who hurt. Through the gifts and support of our donor family, the Youth Ranches will reach out to over 4,500 children and their families this year. Through our residential, camping and community-based programs we are teaching young people how to resolve their conflicts without violence.

Thank you for helping us reach out to these hurting boys and girls. Through our combined efforts, we are making a difference in the lives of children.

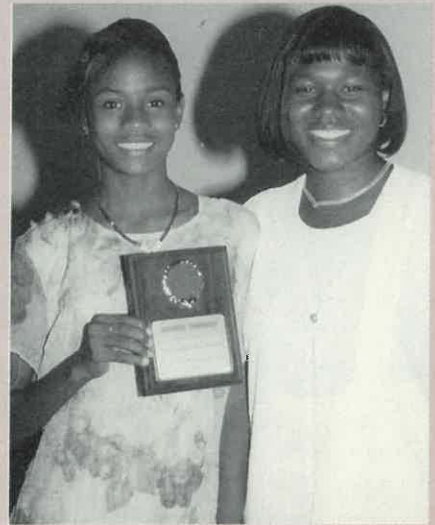

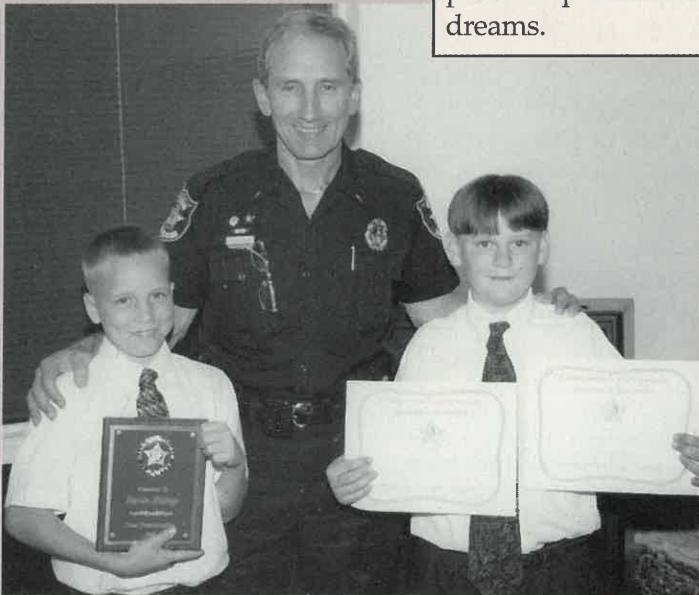
Outstanding Youth Ranches boys and girls receive annual awards

Signing Day

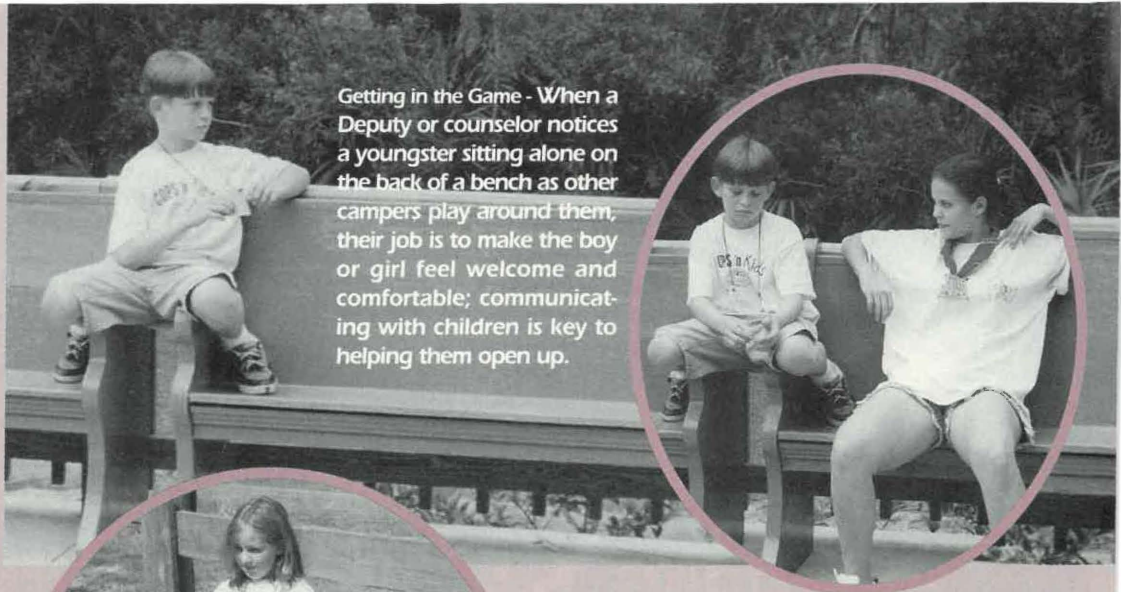
Boys and girls arrive at camp excited or scared, laughing or alone. They step off vans and buses; arms filled with bags of clothes and bathing suits, pillows and backpacks, and check into campsites where they find new faces in different places. Many of these children have never been far from home. Sleeping away from home, making new friends, or even being in an outdoor environment for the first time all have their pleasures and rewards, but can also be overwhelming, even intimidating moments for youngsters.

On the first day, campers sign in with the Camp Director. They are assigned to a particular campsite depending on their age and gender. Activity schedules outline every hour for the next five days. Order and routine are important to the camps' as well as a youth's success.

"The first day can be overwhelming," says Caruth Camp Director Cori Welbes. "But, we make the kids as comfortable as possible, we try to make it fun."

Turning Frowns Upside Down - Sleeping away from home, making new friends, or even being in an outdoor environment for the first time all have their pleasures and rewards, but can also be overwhelming, even intimidating moments for youngsters. But, at the Youth Ranches Summer Camping Programs troubled kids learn to leave their week-long camp session with smiles.





Getting in the Game - When a Deputy or counselor notices a youngster sitting alone on the back of a bench as other campers play around them, their job is to make the boy or girl feel welcome and comfortable; communicating with children is key to helping them open up.

Sitting on the Bench

Some children will form immediate friendships at camp, joining in a game of volleyball or basketball without question, while others who attend camp may be nervous, self-conscious, or feel uncomfortable participating in activities with their peers. Many campers have not developed social skills; shy children may hesitate or hide. Oftentimes, abusive circumstances in a youngster's life have robbed them of much needed self-worth and self-confidence.

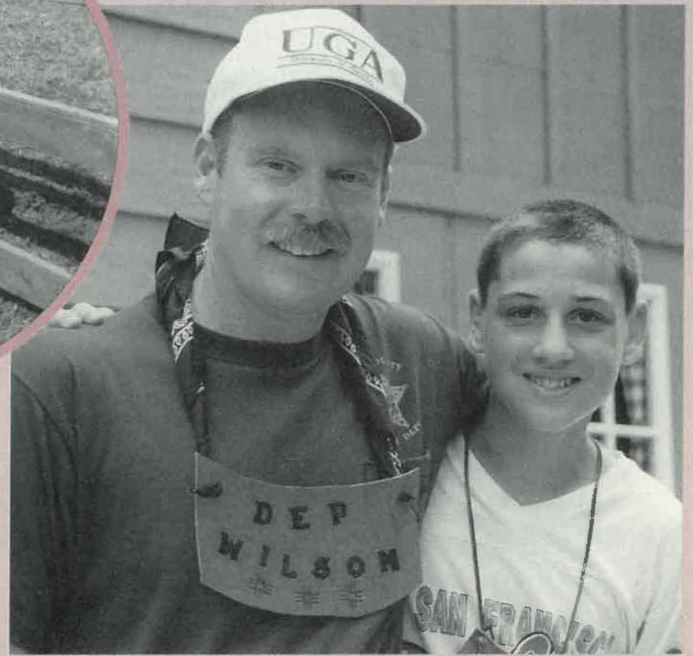
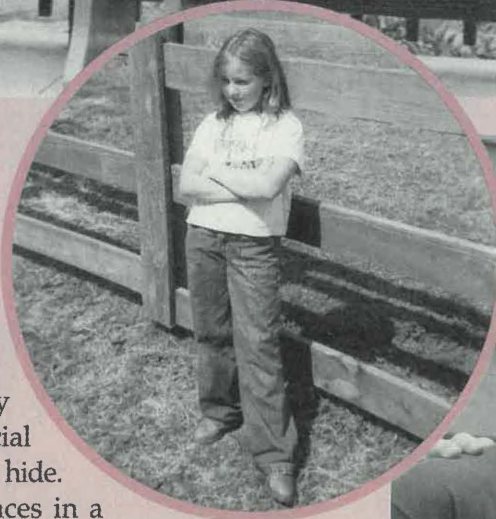
Occasionally, troubled youth may attempt to exclude themselves from camp activities. 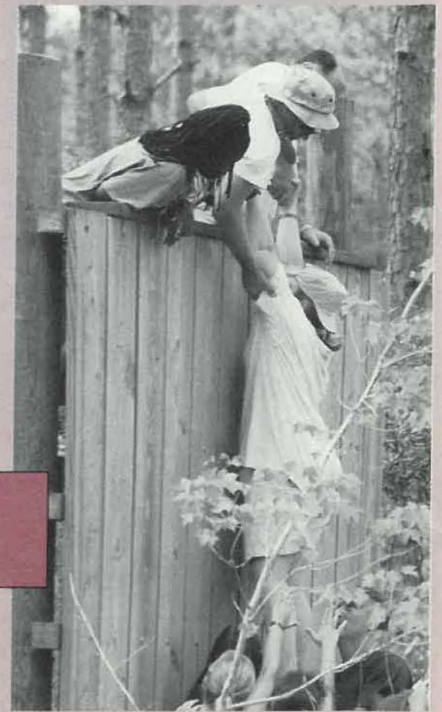
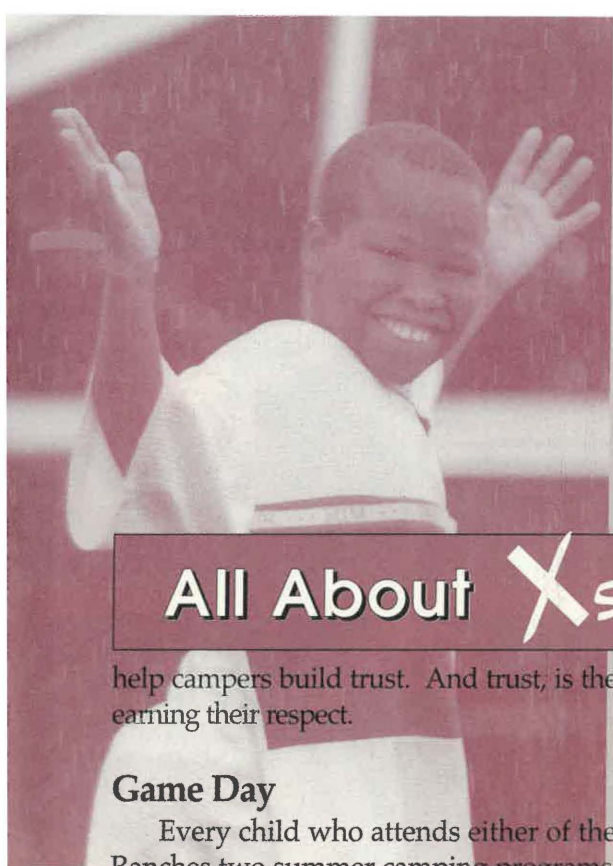
"Why do I keep coming back?" Deputy Dan repeats aloud. "I see the difference this program makes in the lives of children. Even if we only reach one boy or one girl each summer, it's all still worth it."

Training Camp

Camp activities are designed to help kids overcome fears, build self-esteem and practice teamwork. By playing games and working together to solve problems, at-risk youth can begin to communicate and enjoy the benefits of belonging to a team.

Arts and crafts, archery, swimming, horseback riding, canoeing, environmental education, group-building classes and the Challenge Course, all provide opportunities for youth to form valuable friendships with campers, counselors and volunteer Deputies. These therapeutic camp activities help campers build their self-confidence by reaching attainable goals. Constant support and encouragement

help campers build trust. And trust, is the key to earning their respect.

Game Day

Every child who attends either of the Youth Ranches two summer camping programs brings different personalities, different pasts. Youngsters hold different interests, different ideas. They have different attitudes and different emotions. Each child adjusts differently to his or her environment. Camping gives these youngsters the opportunity to play at their own speed and make choices that feel comfortable and safe. At the right time, the boy alone on a bench will eventually join a game of Four Square, while the girl who is afraid of horses will ultimately ride.

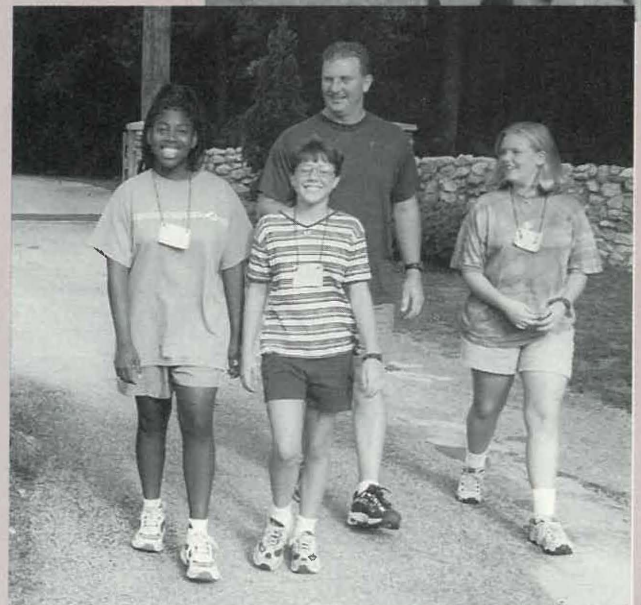
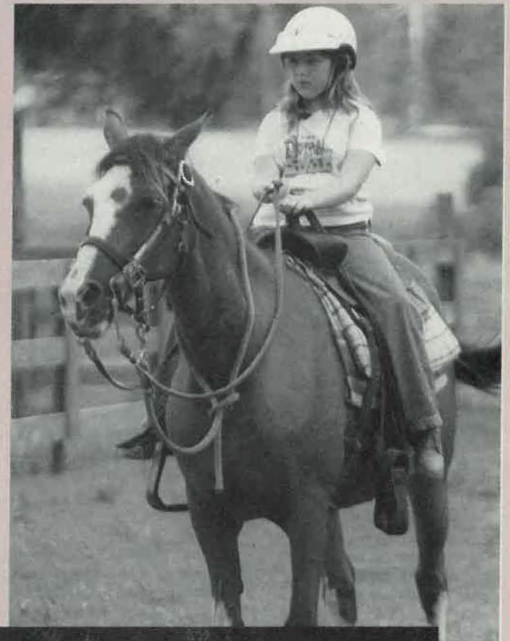


“Forcing kids into uncomfortable situations is dangerous and unproductive,” says Youth Ranches Director of Camping Services Bill Frye. “We encourage our kids, we don’t push them . . . we give them every opportunity to succeed.”

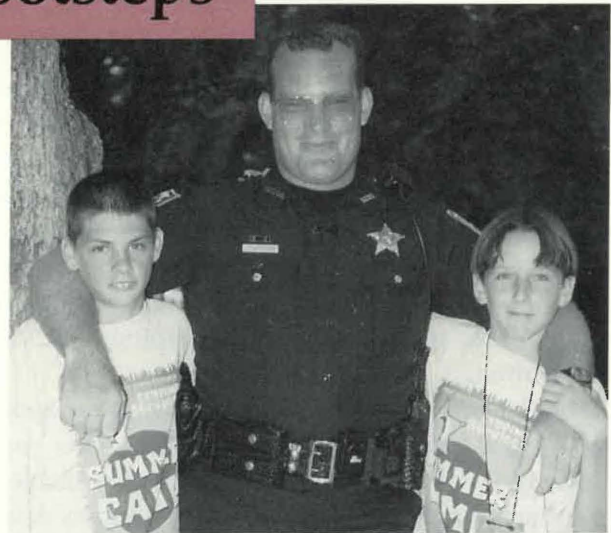

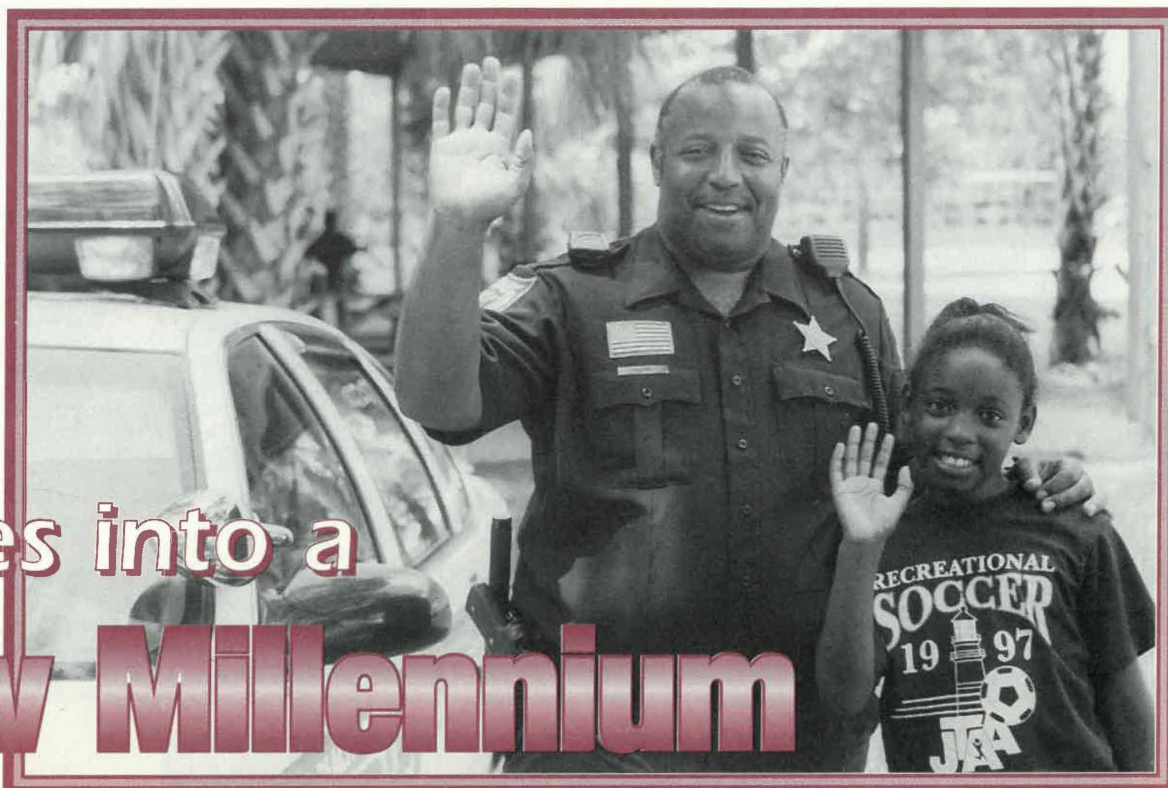
It's a plaque and a picture; a tribute and a eulogy. Like so many law enforcement officers around the state, Seminole County Deputy Gene Gregory and Lee County Deputy Ron Fewell volunteered their time and energy to the boys and girls of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp. Tragically, both lost their lives in the line of duty.

As a result of the recent loss of their father, Deputy Gregory's three sons have become more involved and interested in the Youth Ranches programs and services, especially the camping services their father was so pas-

sionate about. Carrying on the Gregory tradition, Travis, Destry, and Eugene, Jr., asked to attend the Youth Camp this summer as volunteer counselors. "We're here because of dad," says Eugene, Jr., on behalf of his brothers. "We're here because of this, all this . . . because of the kids."

Eugene Gregory, Jr., a Baptist minister from Mississippi, joined his brothers Destry Gregory, a Jacksonville Deputy; and Seminole County Deputy Travis Gregory for the fourth session of summer camp. The brothers sacrificed their personal vacation days to attend camp together. Clearly moved by the unveiling of their father's memorial, Travis Gregory said, "We wouldn't have missed this for the world."

Moves into a New Millennium

Over the last 18 years, since the establishment of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp in Barberville, the Youth Ranches has provided therapeutic camping services to thousands of underprivileged youth across the state. From the original summer camp facility to year-round camping services at two wooded locations, the Youth Ranches has always been at the forefront of camping initiatives and takes great pride in leading the ongoing development of unique methods of helping disadvantaged children.

It has become a Youth Ranches tradition to expand programs and services whenever possible. After years of growing waiting lists and limited space available at the permanent camping sites, the Youth Ranches developed a special way to bring the camp experience to even more boys and girls. With help from local Sheriff's Offices and staff from existing camp locations, the Youth Ranches established a mobile camping unit, which, all summer long, travels into community centers and local schools to give boys and girls an opportunity to experience a week of summer day camp.

Although there are obvious limitations associated with some of the makeshift camping sites, Youth Ranches counselors, along with Deputy Sheriffs, are still able to provide important camping activities each week. The mobile camping program includes therapeutic games and team-building activities like arts and crafts, basketball, swimming and environmental education.

Even some of the Challenge Course events are set up in temporary locations. Boards and blocks are carried from one place to another to help more and more boys and girls build self-esteem and self-respect. Of course, organizing these week-long camps takes hard work, patience and a strong dedication to help disadvantaged kids overcome problems and fears.

Originally scheduled in only a few counties, "Takin' it to the Streets" is growing fast. This year, in just its second summer, the mobile camping units will be busy travelling the state to visit locations in Alachua, Baker, Bradford, Clay, Dade, Duval, Hamilton, Indian River, Nassau, Palm Beach, St. Johns and Union County. With support of the local Sheriff, "Project Harmony: Takin' it to the Streets" will continue to grow and expand. To show their commitment to Florida's needy youth, Palm Beach County Sheriff Bob Neumann donated over \$80,000 from the Law Enforcement Crime Prevention Trust Funds to sponsor nine full weeks of the mobile camping initiative.

"Palm Beach County is dedicated to providing programs like 'Takin' it to the Streets' to needy kids," says Sheriff Neumann. "This program is providing at-risk youth with healthy alternatives to delinquency and trouble."

Both the Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp and Florida Sheriffs Caruth Camp are nationally accredited by the American Camping Association.

Summer Camp Heating Up

Caruth Camp escapes serious damage as wildfires burn 13 acres on the outskirts of campus

In only its second season offering summer camping services, the Florida Sheriffs Caruth Camp had to compete with Mother Nature during the first session of camp this year when smoke was spotted billowing through the trees lining the campus. It's believed lightning strikes days before smoldered slowly to help start a fire.

"Keeping the kids safe is our main concern," says Youth Ranches Assistant Director of Camping Services Phil Shults. "Our goal is to be prepared for anything."

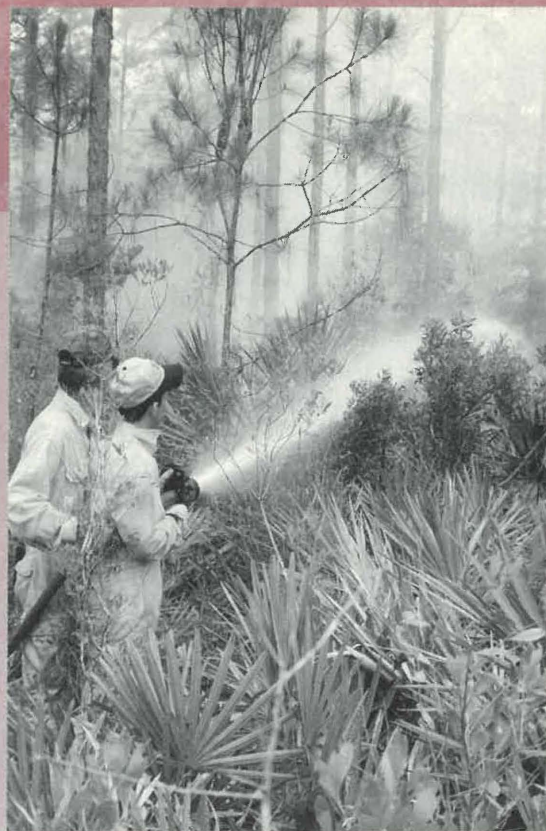
After hundreds of wildfires broke out around the state last summer, and actually evacuated the Youth Camp in Barberville, additional precautions have been taken to help prevent tragedy. Thanks to the proper training and preparation, camp counselors and Deputies reacted quickly, and correctly, to the latest emergency.

Using a network of handheld radios, counselors gathered campers together in a safe spot, while Deputies helped battle the blaze. Armed with shovels, hoses and 1,300 gallons of water, the Yankeetown Volunteer Fire Department quickly smothered the flames and helped prevent the fire from reaching the Commander James A. Woodruff, Jr. Adventure Course, which sat only two hundred yards away. In the truest tradition of the Youth Ranches, all of the firefighters were volunteering their services to the community.

"I was on my way to go fishing when I got the call," says one of the firefighters. "I'm glad we got here before anyone got hurt."

A Lifetime of Giving

"For her, I like to make it Christmas everyday," said Steve, as he smiled with a twinkle in his baby blue eyes. After 35 years of marriage, he still finds a way to brighten the day for his lovely wife, Ruthe. "I like to leave her presents . . . on her chair, at the table, here and there. Just something to let her know how much I love her."

"He's something else," she replies. "He never stops giving. It's a part of who he is inside. He's so generous, especially to the children. He had such a terrible childhood. He knows what it's like to go without, so he makes sure the kids have what they need."

But Ruthe and Stephen Ivan have no children of their own. Still this has not stopped them from living a lifetime of giving.

Steve, a retired Master Sergeant from the United States Army Corps of Engineers, served with General Patton. His stories of courage under fire can only be topped by the compassion he showed to orphans during the war.

Ruthe is a retired fashion designer, who designed

and made over 56 wedding gowns. She continues to keep her creative juices flowing by working on various crafts, quilts and other unique projects.

Beginning in the early sixties, just a few years after the Boys Ranch was founded, the Ivans heard about the program. "We were at the bowling alley and the Sheriff (former Pinellas County Sheriff Don Genung) came by talking about this new ranch for abused and abandoned boys," said Steve. "Right away, I knew I wanted to help! Ruthe and I have since visited all the Youth Ranch sites. We feel good about helping these boys and girls."

Recalling many different occasions, Harry Weaver noted the Ivans often drove to the Boys Ranch, Youth Camp or one of the other programs with a station wagon loaded with arts and crafts supplies and other gifts for the boys and girls. "It's a way of life for them," Weaver said. "They are so generous, even to the point of including the Youth Ranches in their will. We are so grateful... so very grateful!"

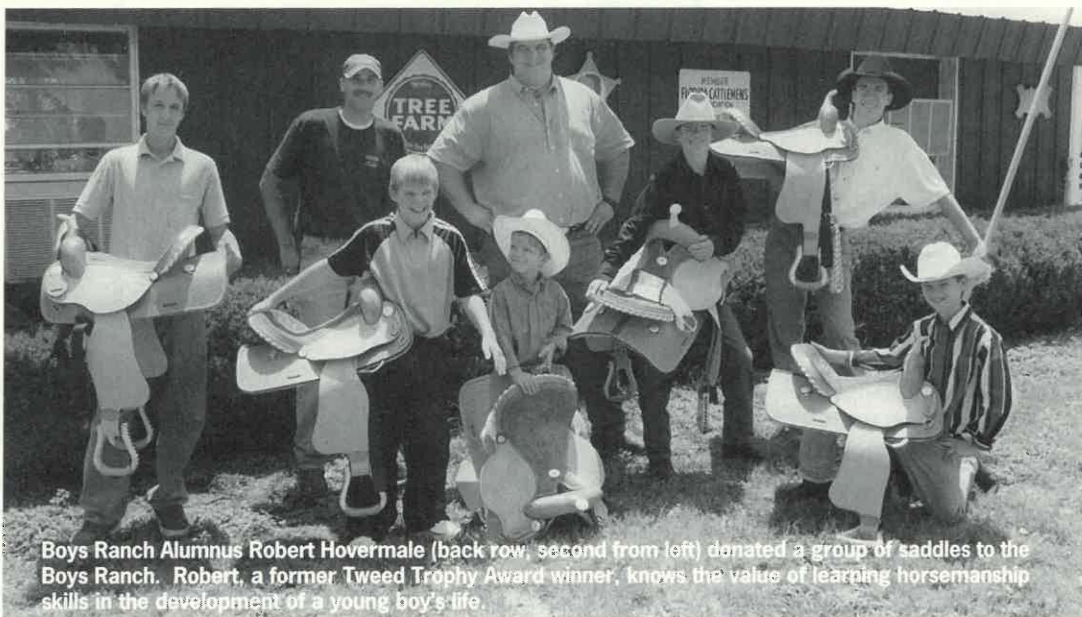

"We're trying to spread the word about the Youth Ranches new plate," says Tax Collector Barbara Ford-Coates. "The idea is to increase awareness throughout the county about their (Youth Ranches) lifesaving programs."

Additional charges accompany the purchase of *any* of Florida's specialty tags. These fees help worthwhile organizations maintain and operate their special programs and services. 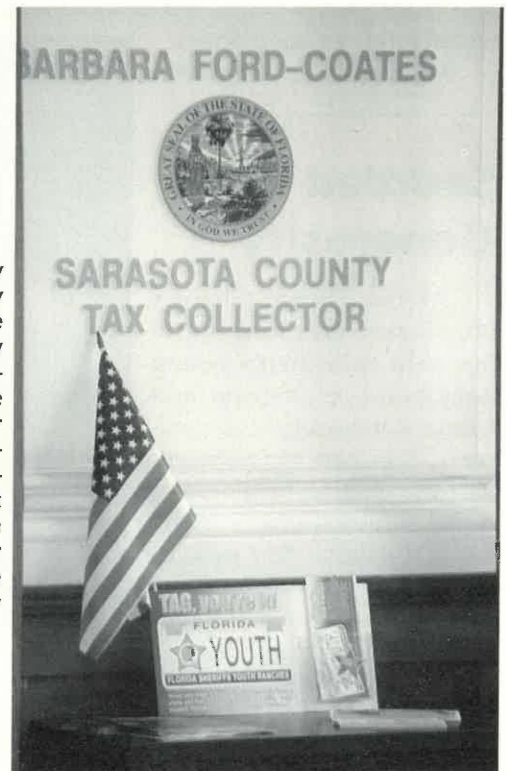
had been purchased throughout the state. Although initial results have exceeded expectations, Youth Ranches boys and girls still need your help.

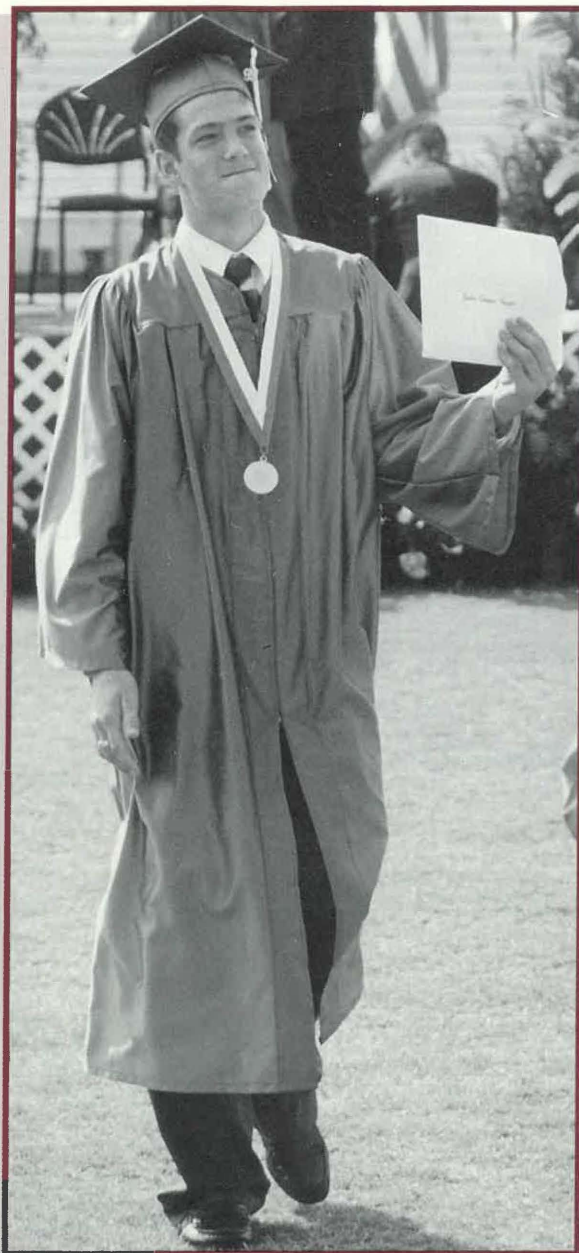


Walking Papers

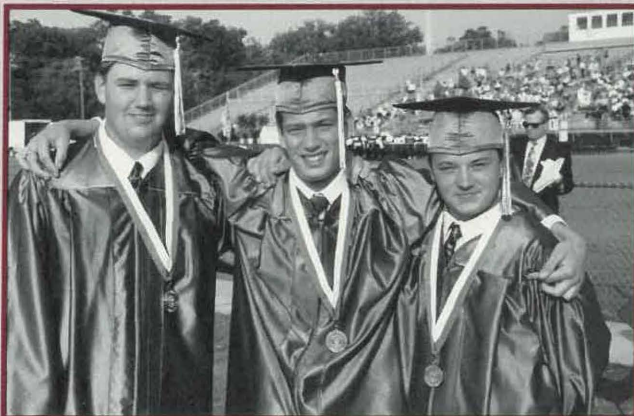
Because of a special dropout prevention program, three spe-

Boys Ranch Hosts Groundbreaking for Butler Barn

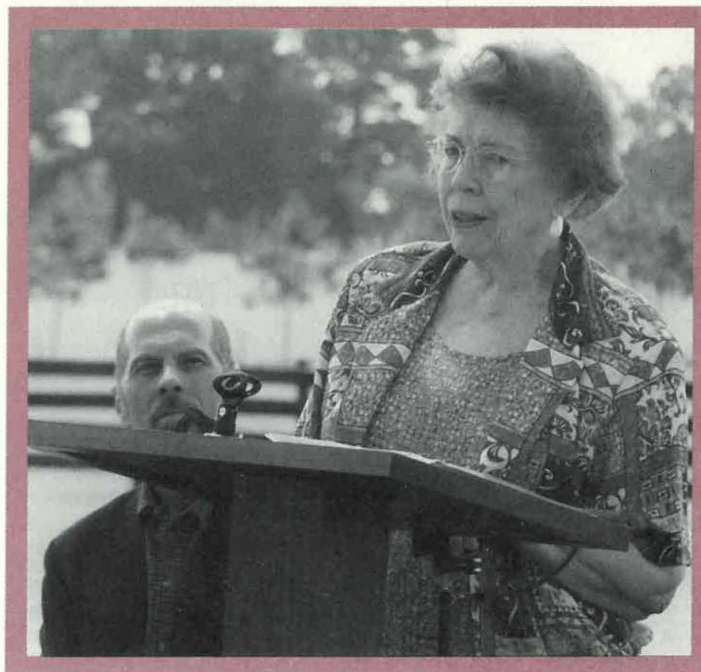

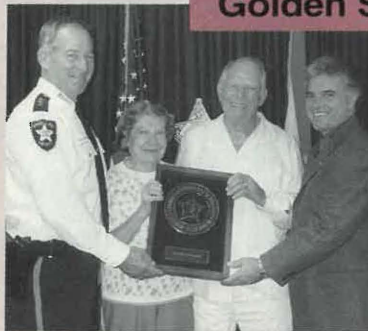

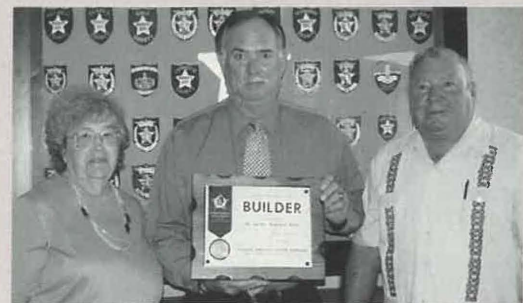

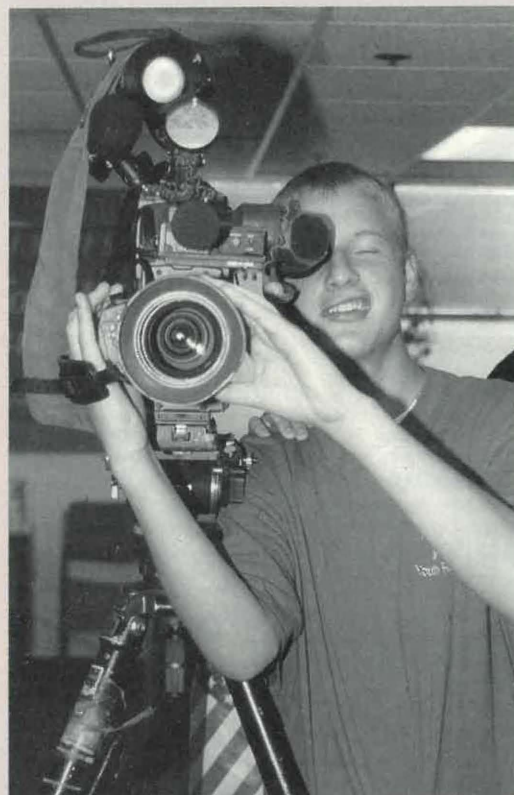
