President's Perspective

While sitting in the waiting room of North Florida Regional Hospital as my wife April was undergoing open heart surgery to replace a defective valve this summer, I could not help but think about the miracles of modern medicine. The ability to replace a defective valve that had developed in early childhood with a mechanical one was truly a miracle to me. Such a miracle was not available 50 years ago and now, while it remains traumatic, it is not uncommon. In fact, after her surgery, I met an older gentleman who had the same surgery 27 years ago and was doing great!

What does this have to do with the Youth Ranches and our mission? As I sat there that morning, waiting for the surgeon to come out and tell us the news, I got to thinking about "broken hearts." It occurred to me that broken hearts take on many different forms. Some hearts are broken because of physical defects like a bad valve. Some are broken because of traumatic emotional pain such as a broken home, abuse, neglect or simply being unwanted.

On the physical side, modern medicine has come a long way in being able to discover the problem and correct it with new medicines and, at times, surgery. While the recovery can be painful and strenuous, it is usually short term in nature.

The heart broken because of emotional pain, which is often found in many of the children who come to the Youth Ranches for help, is much harder to treat. After all, it is not something that you can discover with a chest x-ray or a physical exam.

It usually stays hidden behind a wall of mistrust, anger, acting-out behavior, social withdrawal and much more. It is not something that's treated with medicine or surgery. The heart broken due to emotional trauma can be mended, but there is no short-term solution and the recovery process can take years – for some, a lifetime.

At the Youth Ranches, we have discovered a way to help heal the broken hearts of children. It begins with love and understanding and requires time, patience and compassion. We recognize that every child who comes to us is different and each child requires a different approach. We understand that acting-out behavior, mistrust of others, outbursts of anger or the constant shedding of tears are simply the symptoms of a heart that is emotionally broken. Our house parents, therapists, teachers and supportive staff all work together to provide a loving environment where healing is allowed to take place.


Over the years, we have been allowed to work with thousands of children who have come to us with broken hearts. I would love to say that they all left fully on the mend, but that would be misleading. I can say that, while we have not healed them all, we have given the majority of them a great chance for a wonderful future. We have helped them succeed in becoming productive citizens, business and community leaders, members of the military and more. Most importantly, we have helped so many overcome the trauma of their own childhoods. Today, as parents and grandparents, they in turn are spreading the healing touch of love and understanding within their own families!

When the surgeon came out after almost four hours and told our family that April's surgery was a success, we were so relieved. While we knew weeks of recovery lay ahead for her, it was still as if a dark cloud had been pushed away by a strong wind! Here at the Youth Ranches, our winds are strong because of the support we receive from so many loving individuals.

Our donors care enough to give of their hard-earned resources to help children with broken hearts. Because of you, a wind of hope and change can blow away the dark clouds that have engulfed so many of our children.

Are You Up for the Challenge?

A quick overview of what we need to make this work.

At Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches summer camp, the challenge course is an important part of teaching the 4 C's – communication, cooperation, concentration and commitment. Experiential knowledge through fun and exciting activities can reinforce life-long skills.

We all know the 4 C's are a necessary part of life. We use them regularly in our work, social and personal lives.

At camp, we make learning the 4 C's fun!

One element is called the ZigZag. It is a true challenge. There are three boards and four slots. The goal is to get your entire group up on all the boards, across them all and off the other side. The trick is that you have to move one of the boards behind you to a space in front of you.

ZigZag requires concentration on the part of every member as they manage their role in the team's success. Communication is necessary between the children, since they each have ideas about how to get their team

You can't lose your team member! Support and encouragement are a necessary part of the activity.

We can move our team along!



through the element. Each member cooperates by listening to each other's ideas and implementing them. They learn that, if you do "your own thing," it won't lead to success for the group. Everyone has to be committed to the success of the entire group.

At first, shrieks and giggles fill the air. Slowly the tone changes as team members lose their patience because they are trying to share and no one can hear them. Some get frustrated and jump off, which penalizes the team. Things slowly fall apart.

Just when you think the team will never make it, a leader emerges from the group. They start with the people closest to them and give instructions. They have been concentrating. As they start sharing, the communication passes through the team members. As each team member passes down the instructions, the excitement builds. They finally feel like they might actually make it across the ZigZag!

The commitment is solidifying and their cooperation increases as they achieve each small success. It is exciting to see this transformation of the team!

When we can apply the 4 C's in our daily lives, we see a positive outcome. Thank you for helping kids learn valuable life skills while having fun in a beautiful environment! ★

Merrill Cottage Gives Back

This summer, the boys at Merrill Cottage at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch participated in the Teen Outreach Program (TOP), which is sponsored by the Florida Department of Health and the U.S. Office of Adolescent Health.

TOP is a positive youth development curriculum. The goal is to encourage “Healthy Behavior, Life Skills and a Sense of Purpose” in youth. A TOP facilitator visited the cottage daily for a week to share the program with our boys.

Throughout the week, the boys participated in several different activities, including making dog toys and water bowls for animals at a local animal shelter. They visited the shelter, played with the dogs, and shared the toys and bowls with them. One young man, Alex, was even able to adopt a dog!

Perhaps the most rewarding part of the week was a visit to a local nursing home. The boys made handmade blankets and cards to share with the residents of the facility and were able to pass them out in person. They took time to visit with each resident and made some new friends. One of our Ranchers, Brandon, said, “I can’t believe how happy they were to see us and to get the blankets we made. I feel like we really brightened their day.”

The kids were so happy to be able to participate in this program and share with their local community. At the conclusion of the week, one of our Ranchers commented, “It’s so nice to be able to share with those less fortunate, especially since so many people have shared with the Youth Ranches.” ★

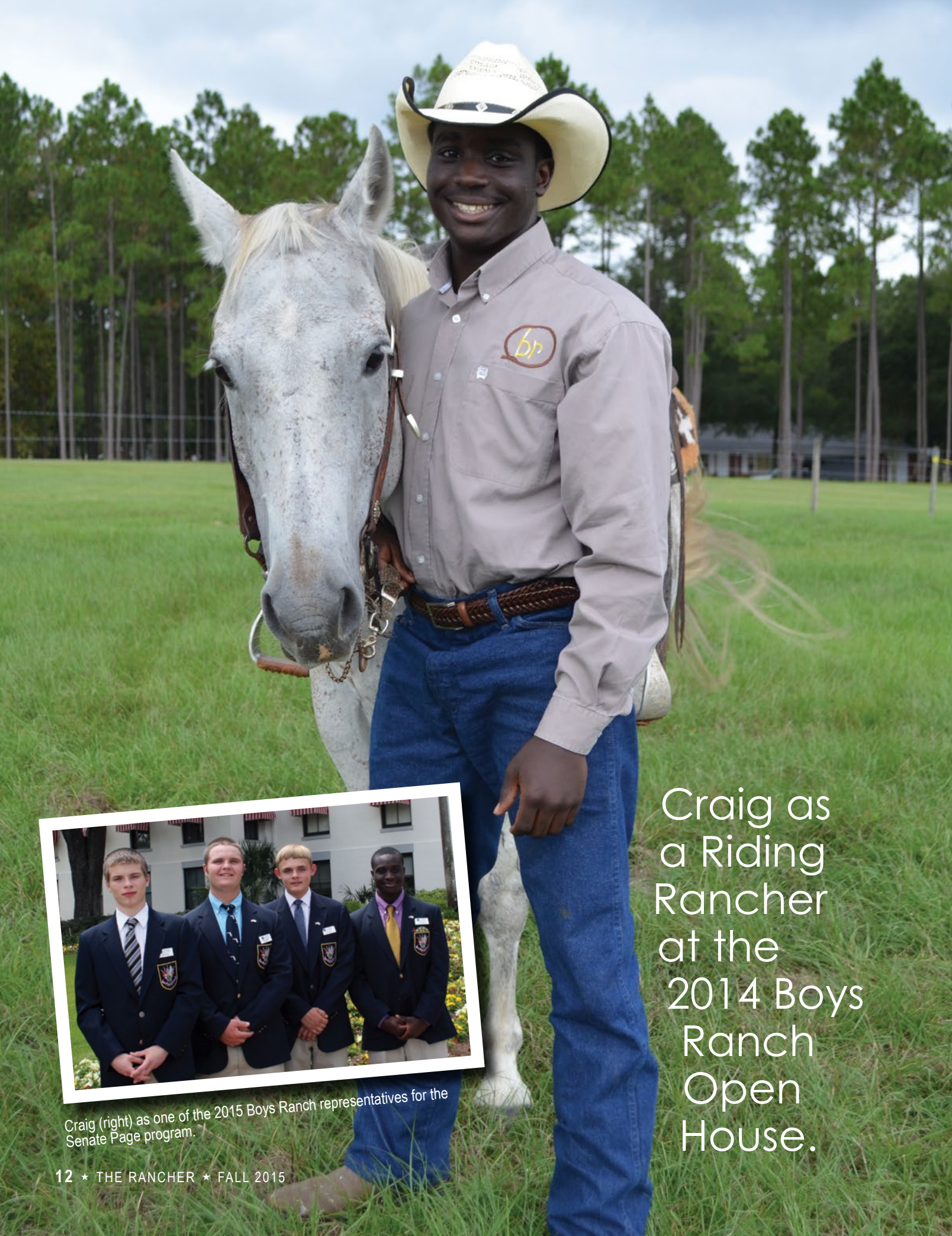

Every day, people make choices to overcome the negativity and distractions in their lives. For teenagers, this can be difficult. So many times, young people put friends and family members on a pedestal. When the people they admire let them down or have to deal with personal challenges, it can be hard to handle.

Craig was not sure what life held for him, but his tumultuous home life was too much for him. He couldn't handle not knowing what to expect from day to day. He didn't have the life skills or maturity to know how to handle daily stress.

His circumstances influenced his behavior. Craig couldn't communicate his frustration or distress without explosions or outbursts. That did not help his family relationships. He moved in with his grandmother and this gave him some stability. By that time, though, Craig had developed trust and communication issues.

His brother came to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. Not long after, Craig followed. The routine and schedule were such a comfort to Craig. Knowing what to expect each day made an enormous difference to him.

Craig has had an opportunity to discover his athletic talents. He is a great

basketball player and enjoys working as part of a team. Craig played in recreation leagues and now has a chance to play on the local high school team.

He also has participated in the Riding Ranchers for the past two years. Craig's horsemanship and basketball skills helped him earn the award for "Most Athletic" at the Boys Ranch this year.

In addition to his athletic abilities, Craig is excelling in school. His behavior and grades are such that he attends the local high school. Craig also had the special opportunity to be part of the Senate Page program during the spring legislative session.

This year, Craig also found a special way to volunteer. The Boys Ranch staff held the first cowboy camp for local youth. Craig,
