

President's Perspective

A message from Harry K. Weaver, President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches



Leaders and Followers

As this Spring, 1987, issue of *The Rancher* goes to press, I find myself slipping into a reflective mood. There are two reasons for this. One is that we are presently engaged in preparations for a 30th Anniversary Celebration which will be held on October 2, 3 and 4, 1987, to commemorate the founding of the Boys Ranch — a 1957 event that started the genealogy of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. The second is that I recently celebrated the 25th Anniversary of my involvement as the titular head of this fast-growing venture.

I use the word "titular" intentionally (my dictionary tells me it can mean holding a title in name only) because there have been many times when, although I have held a title identifying me as the chief executive, I have seen other individuals taking a leadership role, while I temporarily became a follower, or at the very most, a co-leader.

This has happened so many times that I hesitate to mention names for fear of overlooking some worthy individuals. However, I can safely generalize about some of the ways the mantle of leadership has shifted around during the past 25 years.

Numerous times during my quarter-century in this team effort I have seen various Sheriffs "emerge from the pack" and take the lead by proposing the solution to financial problems, by finding an ideal site for a future child care facility, or by steering the board of directors away from faulty decisions. Sheriffs were the original leaders who dreamed up the unique Boys Ranch concept, and they have contributed a substantial amount of leadership during the 29-year process of translating the Boys Ranch dream into the present Youth Ranches organization.

Leaders abound in this saga, and there have been times when they seemed to outnumber the followers. Take donors for instance. It is their traditional role to provide the material and financial necessities that enable leaders to develop programs, facilities, systems and structures from blueprints and master plans.

But, happily, some of our donors have not been content to stay within this stereotype. Instead, they have frequently ventured into the realm of leadership by offering valuable property, creative ideas or critical funds that determined not only the course, but also the speed, of our progress.

This may be contrary to the way charitable organizations have functioned traditionally, but in our case it has historic validity. In 1957, when the Boys Ranch was merely a dream with which Sheriffs were toying, a donor offered a beautiful piece of property on the Suwannee River, and thus provided the leadership that was necessary to convert mere talk into positive action.

My catalogue of leaders is by no means limited to Sheriffs and donors. On the contrary, a large section is devoted to staff members whose creativity and astuteness have many times influenced the course of events.

To understand the important leadership roles they have played, it is necessary to remember that the Boys Ranch was originally described as a bold, unique venture — the first of its kind sponsored by law enforcement officials. This being the case, the founders and those of us who followed after them had no handbooks or blueprints to follow. Consequently, board members who "ride herd" on me, and staff members under my supervision have had a unique opportunity to exercise leadership.

The same set of unique circumstances has also (continued on page 18)

Kids get punches for good behavior

Greg Hutchins has received over 100 punches for good behavior at the Youth Ranch Learning Center, and he doesn't seem to mind one bit.

In fact, every time teacher Ann Shapiro punches his "I Did Good Card" for things like minding his own business, staying in his seat while class is in session, following directions, etc, it brings a smile to his face.

Each punch adds two points to his good behavior score — points he can trade for rewards. Seventy points will allow him to play a video game on a classroom computer terminal; 75 will give him 30 minutes of play with a board game; 80 will permit him to view a film strip of his choice; with 100 he can get a coloring book; and 150 will send him out to lunch with his teacher.

However, Greg chose to pass up all the minor goodies and aim for the top reward: a fishing trip with Director of Youth Services Joe Ballard — a 200-point zinger for which he qualified before the end of 1986.

Weeks ago Greg's good behavior score stood at 266, and Nina Jones, who also opted for a fishing trip, was close behind with 255. Before the *Rancher* went to press, two more youngsters were added to the fishing trip roster.

Based upon a program that worked in another school, the "I Did Good Card" puts emphasis on rewards for good behavior rather than punishment for bad behavior.

"Is it working?" Ann Shapiro was asked recently. "Definitely," she replied. "We have been giving out very few punishments."

Meanwhile, Youth Services Director Joe Ballard is wondering how he is going to find time to take all of those well behaved youngsters on fishing trips.

Reporter's report:

A first person article seemed appropriate, since Mandy had recently been appointed the "action reporter" for The Trailblazer, the camp newspaper, and had been interviewing staff members as well as "celebrity" visitors.

So ... the editor asked Mandy to interview herself and send him the results. Fortunately he was talking to the "new Mandy," and not the troubled 16-year-old who had arrived at the camp seven months earlier full of resentment and distrust. She hesitated only a moment or two, and then agreed to accept the assignment. Here is the result: the "new Mandy" as seen by Mandy, edited only for brevity's sake.

The Florida Sheriffs Youth Camp has been a great experience for me, and has helped me to focus on my present life and my future in a more positive way.

My attitude was very negative when I first came here, but everyone seemed to want to help—showing they cared not only by words, but also by actions—and not because they had to. Eventually, with the help of the staff and the other campers, I was able to identify my problems and realize that I needed to turn my life around.

In the first phase of the camping program I worked on academics and behavior in the outdoors, doing things such as building campfires, making ant farms and doing nature studies. I discovered a lot about myself and began to realize my capabilities. It helped me to be with a group of campers and give help as well as receive it.

One of the most important events in my camping experience was when we went backpacking on the Appalachian Trail for what was called "a therapeutic trip." We spent four days on the trail, and, as a reward, one day of white water rafting down the Nantahala River, in North Carolina.

When we returned to camp I was promoted to the "transitional class," where I was able to spend more time on basic academics such as math, English, history, etc. After four months in this class, my attitudes toward school and my academics improved in a more positive way.

Now I am scheduled to return home at Christmas, and I feel I am ready. I have accomplished my goals, and have become a better person — all because of the help I have received here. I am determined that my life and future will now become successful.

Career advice came from astronaut during meeting of Villa boosters

Get good grades, but don't rush into choosing a career. That was the advice Astronaut Kathryn Thornton gave Girls Villa girls when she addressed the 1986 meeting of the Girls Villa Board of Associates, an enthusiastic group of boosters dedicated to "friend raising" for the Bartow child care facility.

Mission Specialist Thornton revealed that she had changed her mind several times before deciding to become a member of the NASA team.

"First I liked math," she explained. "Then I moved on to chemistry, but found that chemists have to do dishes and pay for breakage."

It was physics that finally caught her sustained interest, she said, leading to a Ph.D. degree in physics from the University of Virginia. Space radiation research at home and abroad was followed by a position as a physicist at the U.S. Army Foreign Science and Technology Center. She was chosen as an astronaut candidate in 1984, completed her training and evaluation in 1985, and is awaiting assignment to a future space shuttle crew.

Dr. Thornton's visit to the Girls Villa was arranged by U.S. Representative Andy Ireland, who was a special guest at the meeting.

In a business session prior to Dr. Thornton's address James R. O'Connor, Bartow City Manager,

was elected Chairman; Steve Wright, Vice Chairman; and Frank Johnston, Secretary.

Organized in 1974 to create good community relations for the Girls Villa throughout Polk County, the Board of Associates has grown from 20 members to 60 members. It includes on its present roster a county administrator, a city manager, a chamber of commerce executive, a Florida legislator, doctors, a dentist, attorneys, a judge, a newspaper editor, a bank president, a car dealer, an educator, a postmaster, and leaders from the cattle and citrus industries.

"Footer" is a brand new game; a real treat for flabby feet

Kids who sit around watching television four hours a day (that's the national average according to researchers) run the risk of getting flabby feet.

And now there's a remedy for this horrible handicap — a brand new game called "Footer" which has been invented by Youth Ranch Recreation Supervisor Lynn Carr.

Footer borrows several basic elements from basketball and soccer. Its virtues are that it can by played indoors or outdoors, on cow pastures or vacant lots; it does not require expensive equipment; and it has simple, easy-to-learn rules.

Lynn claims it provides great exercise because "it combines all gross motor skills in one game."

Here is her description:

Footer is played with a six or eight-inch playground ball, on a field 50 yards long. A goal eight feet wide is marked off at each end of the field, using fiberglass cones, gallon milk cartons, or similar improvised markers.

Players can dribble the ball with their hands, as in basketball, or with their feet, as in soccer.

Each team has a goal tender, who is the only player allowed to run with the ball. Carrying it to mid-field is the goalie's limit. All players can pass the ball.

A player receiving the ball must dribble or pass within five seconds. Defenders must stay at arm's length until the ball handler begins to dribble.

Points are scored by moving the ball past the goal markers. A kicked ball (one point) must be on the ground when it passes the goal markers. A passed ball (two points) must be caught by a player from the scoring team after it passes the goal markers.

Dangerous (too rough) play results in a penalty kick, as in soccer.

Game begins with a jump ball at mid-field. After each score, play resumes with a jump ball at midfield.

There's nothing formal about "Footer." If more rules are needed, simply make them up as you go.





Jelly bean therapy — how sweet it is!!

Michael Horan was hostile and unhappy. He didn't like going to public school.

Youth Ranch Director of Education Hester Thuerk was unhappy too. She had transferred Michael from the remedial program at the Youth Ranch Learning Center to the Pinellas County School System, hoping he could cope with this challenge, but she was not getting any happy notes from his teachers. Instead, the teachers were calling to tell her Michael's behavior and language were unacceptable.

"I had a feeling he wasn't going to make it," said Thuerk recently, "so I asked him: 'What do I need to do to get more happy notes from your school?"

Michael just shrugged.

"Then I said, 'Would a jelly bean do it?' and his face lit up."

That was the beginning of a unique contract between the hostile boy and the Director of Education. She told him he could earn a steady supply of jelly beans by bringing home good reports from his public school teachers, and they agreed that the rewards would range from a three-bean day with a mixture of hits and strike outs, to a 13-bean day, which would be the equivalent of hitting the winning home run in the World Series.

Almost overnight a new Michael Horan emerged — a smiling lad who was bringing home favorable comments about his behavior, his homework and other aspects of his performance. Each school day after he got off the bus he would show the Director of Education the "Good Boy Stickers" his teachers had


given him, and she would reward him from the jelly bean jar on her desk.

Six-bean days occurred frequently, and then came a super-terrific 13-bean day, and it seemed apparent that Michael was really "on his way."

That was the day Hester Thuerk decided to add "Jelly Bean Therapy" to her portfolio of classroom techniques.

Keeping in touch:

Still a "workaholic" — that's Ronnie

By the time Ronnie Williams was eight years old he had learned how to survive on the streets of a South Florida city. He was good at bumming handouts or snitching empty soft drink bottles off back porches and turning them in for cash deposits.

No one told him when to get up or when to go to bed. No one had bothered to enroll him in school, and for some reason the truant officer had never come looking for him. His dad's whereabouts were unknown, and his mother's work kept her away from home most of the time. His oldest brother, Albert, was trying to act as a guardian but Albert was only ten.


Such was the status of this cute, street smart little kid in 1960 when Broward County Deputy Sheriff Otto Hettesheimer appeared on the scene and talked about sending Albert to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, a haven for neglected youngsters that had opened for business near Live Oak a little over a year earlier.

"No way," said Albert. He made it plain that he

wasn't going anywhere without Ronnie and their "Middle Brother" Tommy. Officials at the struggling, cash-short Boys Ranch balked at taking in three brothers from one county when they were getting applications from all over the state and had a long waiting list of needy youngsters, but Hettesheimer, whose fund raising for the Boys Ranch was already reaching legendary proportions, pulled the right strings and managed to get the three brothers accepted.

Ronnie, who is now approaching the threshold of middle age, still remembers with much pleasure his introduction to the Boys Ranch, and the way it changed his life. He checked in on December 16, 1960, and a few days later a group of Sheriffs arrived with loads and loads of Christmas gifts.

Suddenly, almost overnight, the neglected street urchin who had been snitching soft drink bottles to get spending money was the proud owner of a new bicycle, new clothes and a substantial amount of cash

which was put into a Boys Ranch "bank account" to make certain that it would be spent wisely.

"Life at the Boys Ranch was a bed of roses," Ronnie said recently, and just thinking about it made his face light up with a Christmas sort of smile.

He admits that learning to be obedient was difficult at first, after years of unsupervised freedom. His "free spirit" was chafed by rules and regulations that required him to make his own bed daily, sweep the hallway outside his bedroom and take a shower every night, but he adjusted quickly. In fact, John and Irene Schmutz, who were his group parents at the Boys Ranch in those early days, recall no rebellion. They remember Ronnie as a well-behaved youngster and a hard worker.

Ronnie wasn't about to vandalize that image when he was interviewed a few weeks ago, but he did admit to "taking some licks" as punishment after he was caught eating ice cream at Live Oak's Dixie Grill when he was supposed to be in Sunday School.

"I always went to church," he added in an effort to keep his good boy reputation intact.

Ronnie cherished many happy memories of his growing up years at the Boys Ranch, but the trip Ranchers took to Washington, D.C., in 1964 tops them all. Accompanied by Sheriffs Don Genung and Ed Blackburn, the Ranchers toured the Capitol, had lunch with a group of Senators and Representatives headed by Speaker of the House John McCormick, and visited the White House.

"He still talks about that trip," Ronnie's wife, Mary, told *The Rancher*, but that was only one of the many good things that happened to Ronnie at the Boys Ranch. He acquired good work habits, developed skills in mechanics and horsemanship, starred in track and football while attending Suwannee High School, and won numerous awards.

Ronnie left the Boys Ranch in 1972 to make it on his own, but the Ranch has always held a special niche in his affections. He has returned many times for random visits and to attend alumni reunions. When he was in his early 20s and employed by the Florida Highway Patrol as a weight inspector, he went to the Ranch in his spare time and bulldozed approximately 100 acres of raw land that has since become prime pasture.

In recent years this restless hard worker has been attacking with equal zeal the weeds and underbrush, wasps and poison ivy that once infested his two-acre homestead on the north side of Jacksonville. In his spare time he has set up an attractive double-wide mobile home, added two decks, landscaped the place, and built a concrete picnic table "from scratch."

He could sit back now and spend his weekends soaking up the ambience of the quiet bayou that fronts his property, but that's not his style. Weekend visitors will find him working on a dock that will give him access to the St. John's River and the Atlantic Ocean.

After that project is finished he plans to build a utility shed, extend one of his decks, install an outdoor jacuzzi, and build an archway at the entrance of his property.

In case some of the oldtimers who used to work at the Boys Ranch are asking themselves: "Where did we go wrong? How did we turn this cute, irresponsible kid into a 'workaholic'?" the answer is, don't fret it.

Hard work goes to this guy's head like vintage wine. He loves to attack it, challenge it, overcome it. That's why he has been successful as a bulldozer jockey, electrician, dragline operator, tractor trailer driver and crane operator. His present job with a heavy construction firm that specializes in macho jobs like building bridge piers and driving pilings for high-rise condominiums is "right up his alley."

Clearly, the hard working, well behaved kid retired Boys Ranch staffers still talk about with obvious pride, hasn't changed much in the 14 years that have passed since he left the Boys Ranch.

Spending an afternoon with him and his family leaves the impression that his former group parents still have reason to be proud of him not only as a hard worker, but also as a successful father and husband.

The Boys Ranch gave Ronnie a new start many years ago, and the momentum of that episode seems to be still sustaining him. Meanwhile, he hasn't stopped being grateful. Going to the Ranch as a neglected eight-year-old was "like going into heaven," he said recently. "Next to a good home, the Boys Ranch is the best thing. You can't beat it!"

First woman trustee left a legacy of vivid memories at the Boys Ranch

It's impossible to walk around the Boys Ranch without bumping into memories of Frances Diaz, a tiny woman with traits and talents that made her seem ten feet tall.

I can't pass the chapel without recalling that she picked the location for it many years ago. Actually, the minutes of a board meeting will show that she and I and Former Volusia County Sheriff Rodney Thursby were appointed as a site selection committee, but as we strolled around the campus she was the one who said "this is the place," and by golly she was right. Hindsight confirms it.

This delightful Diaz woman could be assertive without becoming abrasive — could "cut the mustard" in a man's world without losing her femininity. Consequently she seemed to make all the right moves when she served as the first woman appointed to the Boys Ranch Board of Trustees, and as the first female board member in a Tampa bank. Upon the death of her husband, Joe, she assumed the presidency and management of their firm, Tampa Provision

Company, and demonstrated further her ability as a decision-maker.

The Administration Building at the Boys Ranch stands as a memorial to Frances and Joe, but the memories it evokes for me have nothing to do with Frances' talents as an administrator. Instead, this attractive building reminds me of her generous, sentimental side — the special traits that prompted her to give many substantial gifts to the Boys Ranch, and to encourage her wealthy friends to do likewise.

Her influence was a prime factor in the early growth and development of the Boys Ranch. Youth

Ranches President Harry Weaver verified this recently when he said: "In a very significant way Frances helped us to build the Administration Building, the Chapel, the Cafetorium, a residence cottage and other facilities. We would have been a long time getting them without her help."

Memories of Frances ... they pop up in the most unexpected places ... in the midst of the Boys Ranch cattle herd for instance ... simply because building up the quality of that herd was something Frances and Joe started more than 25 years ago when they contributed purebred Hereford cattle worth many thousands of dollars.

Frances did not focus her generosity on the Boys Ranch alone. When the Girls Villa was founded as Florida's second Sheriff-sponsored child care facility, she was actively involved as a giver of gifts and encouragement. Later on, although age and infirmities caused her to curtail her activities, she continued her interest in the growing network of child care projects that were spinoffs from the Boys Ranch.

Among loyal supporters of the child care saga that began with the Boys Ranch in 1957, she ranks as "one of the great ones," and her death on October 5, 1986, left a tremendous void — one that friends will find difficult to accept.

However, there is consolation in the fact that her memory remains vividly alive and will be sustained far down future years simply because it is so inextricably woven into the history of the Boys Ranch.

THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH RANCHES IS . .

A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, Youth Camps, and any other Youth programs that might later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. An important function of the Youth Ranches is the raising, receiving, budgeting, and disbursing of funds for its programs. The Youth Ranches and its programs are supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Ranches for the exclusive benefit of any single program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, or Youth Camp, or they may be made without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs as most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board. Youth Ranches Central Offices are co-located with the Boys Ranch.

BOYS RANCH IS...

A residential group child care program for Florida's neglected, unsupervised and troubled boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 108 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about halfway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of the town of Live Oak on County Rd. 795.

GIRLS VILLA IS . . .

A similar program for girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Girls Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first girls admitted in 1972. There are approximately 50 girls in residence at any given time. Mailing address and telephone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Ranches.



YOUTH RANCH IS . . .

The most recently developed residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Also sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, it was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 near Clearwater, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 30 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are neglected, unsupervised and troubled boys and girls. Mailing address and telephone number are the same as for the Youth Ranches.

YOUTH CAMP IS . . .

A Youth Ranches camping facility which operates a Wilderness Program and a Summer Camping Program for boys and girls. The 154-acre campsite is located one mile northeast of Barberville, near DeLand. Campers are normally selected from among boys and girls who have had Requests for Service submitted to the Youth Ranches on their behalf. Many of these youngsters are already on the waiting list for admission to Youth Ranches residential facilities. The camping program was initiated in 1981 and moved to its present location in late 1982.

CARUTH CAMP IS...
