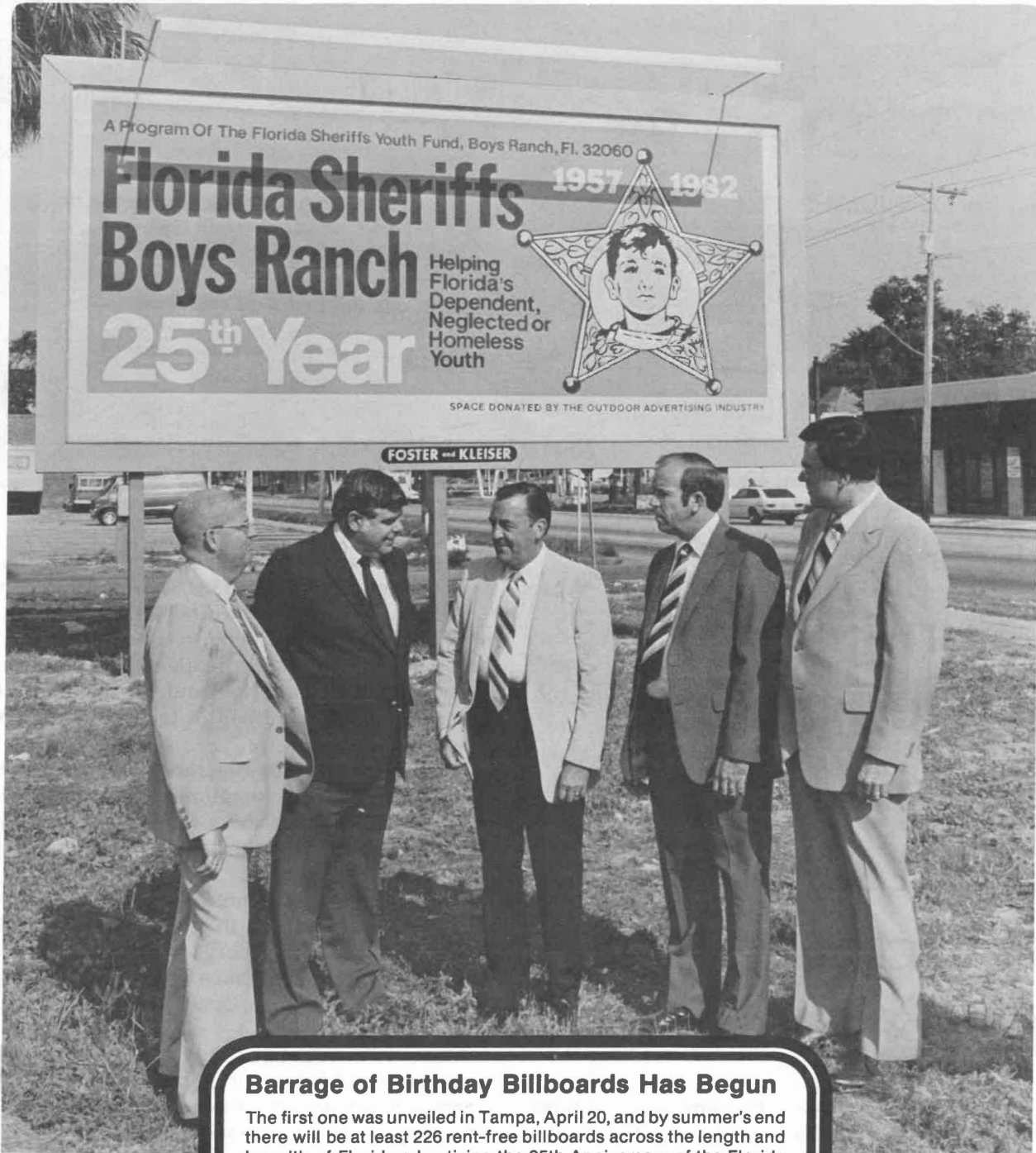


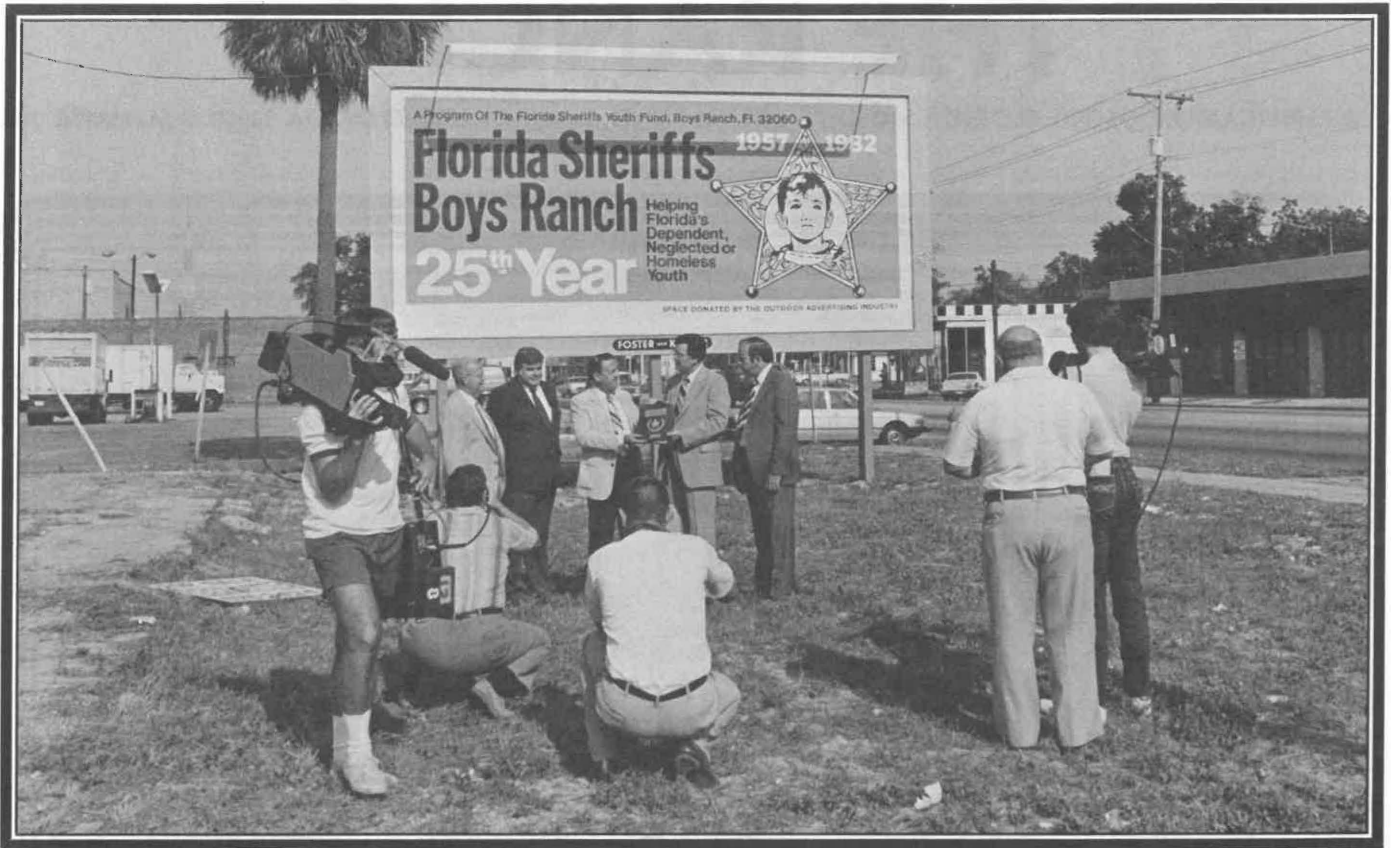

• We can feel our enthusiasm building up as we begin final preparations for the 25th Anniversary Celebration we are going to hold at the Boys Ranch, October 1, 2, and 3, 1982.

Open to the public free-of-charge, our birthday party will feature the usual anniversary horse show starting on Friday, October 1, and running for three days; a Suwannee River barbecue on October 2; an outdoor worship

service on October 3; and dedication ceremonies marking completion of a new \$300,000 residence cottage.

Camping facilities will be provided for many hundreds of visitors who are planning to spend the entire weekend with us. We are also expecting a big turnout of former Boys Ranch residents and staff members who will be returning for a reunion of the Boys Ranch Alumni Association.

If you like family reunions, three-day Polish weddings, and old home week celebrations, you'll like our anniversary wing-ding. It will be a fun-filled, festive fete for friendly folks down on the farm, so please make plans to attend.

The Boys Ranch is located a few miles west of Interstate 75, a few miles north of Interstate 10, and a few miles south of the Georgia-Florida border. If that happens to be a long distance from where you live, don't worry about the miles. Just pack up and bring along your smiles.

Meanwhile, you can count on us to do everything possible to publicize our 25th birthday far and wide. Perhaps you have seen the anniversary billboards that are going up all over the state. The first one, which was unveiled in Tampa, is pictured on our cover. As the result of valuable assistance we received from Raymond J. Pyle, General Manager of Foster and Kleiser Outdoor Advertising Company, we have been promised at least 226 rent-free billboards donated by various advertising firms.

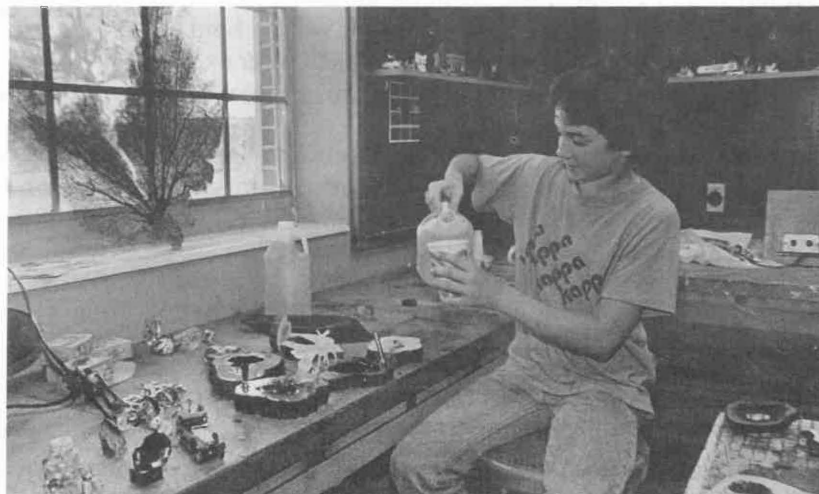

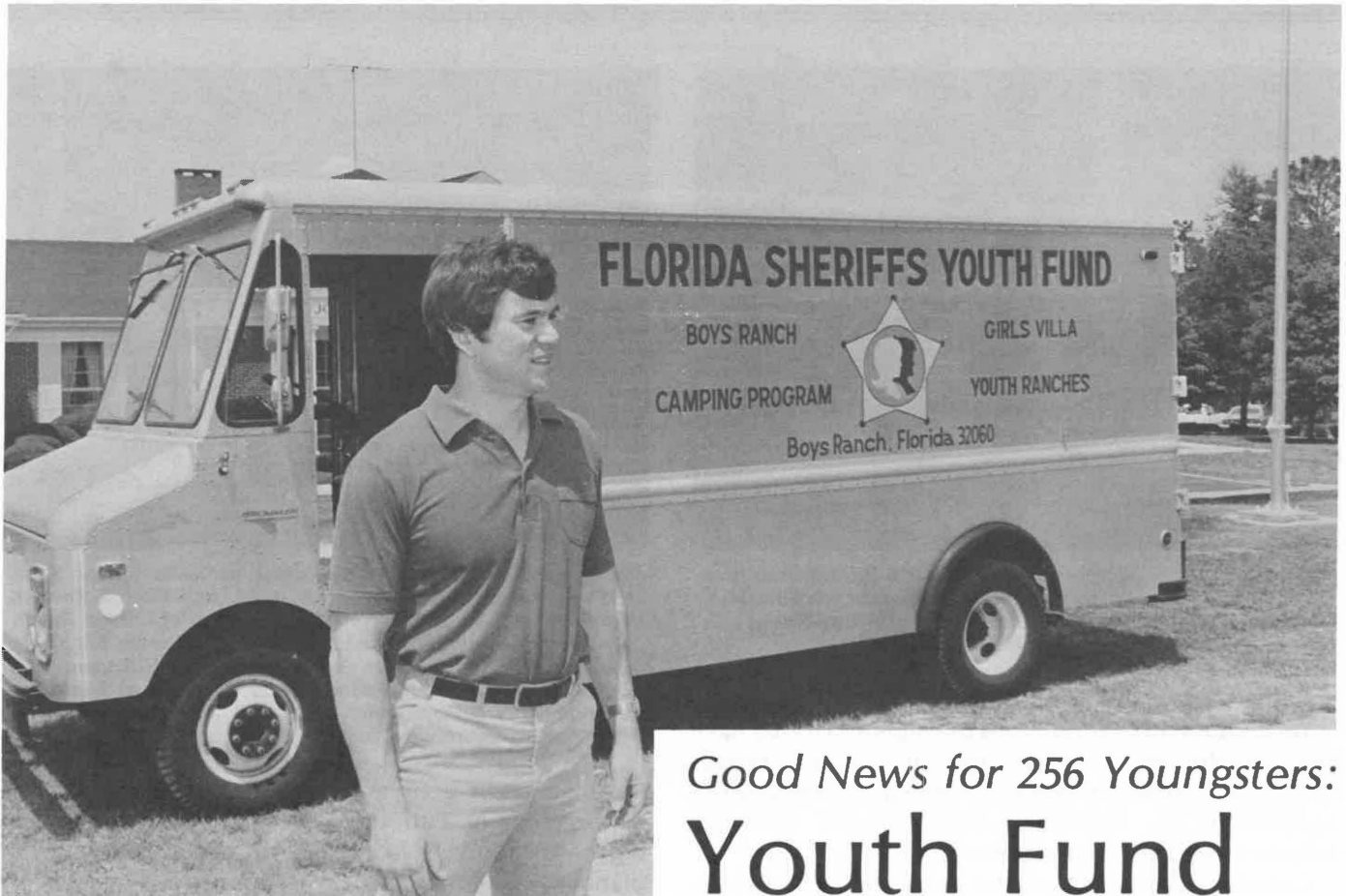

Final arrangements have been completed for the 1982 Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund camping program which will provide summer fun and valuable learning experiences for 256 dependent and neglected youngsters.

Scheduled to begin June 20, the program has been divided into six one-week sessions for boys, and two one-week sessions for girls. The sessions will be held at Boy Scout and Girl Scout reservations which offer excellent facilities and a wide variety of recreational opportunities.

Youngsters will attend the camp sessions free of charge. Age limits will be 11 through 16. Preference will be given to boys and girls who have already requested Youth Fund services and are on our "waiting list."

The camping program will be supervised by a small permanent staff which will move from campsite to campsite. Deputy sheriffs are being recruited as camp counselors. Junior Deputies and Explorers will serve as junior counselors.

Bill Biebuyck (Be-buck), an experienced and well qualified professional, has been hired as Camp Director. The permanent staff will also include a secretary, a Program Director and a Senior Counselor. In the fall this

mobile staff will begin developing a wilderness/outdoor program at a permanent campsite which the Youth Fund plans to establish as soon as a suitable central Florida location can be found.

In the summer of 1981 the Youth Fund held its first camping program at the Boys Ranch on an experimental basis. It lasted only two weeks and enrolled only 37 boys, but it was so successful that a decision was made to include camping as a permanent feature in the Youth Fund's broad spectrum of child care services.

Youth Fund officials were pleased to find that camping sessions involving deputies, Explorers and Junior Deputies provided an opportunity for youngsters to develop a better understanding of law enforcement and a friendlier attitude toward the men who wear the badge.

Youth Ranch Rites Honor Genung For Fund Raising Feats Unsung



CLEARWATER — The ceremony was short and simple when ground was broken April 7, for a new \$700,000 activity center at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch, but sunshine mixed with sentiment in just the right proportions to make it a warm and memorable occasion.

It was especially memorable for Don Genung, former Pinellas County Sheriff, former Youth Fund Vice President, and all-time champion fund raiser for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa and Youth Ranch. The new facility will be named in his honor, and in a very real sense this ceremony was a fitting climax to his 25 years of fund raising feats — an unsought reward for his untiring efforts to improve the lives of needy boys and girls.

There were introductions and brief remarks by Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund President Harry Weaver; Youth Fund Board Chairman Louie Mims, who is Sheriff of Polk County; Youth Ranch Resident Director Mac Stones; and Miss Nancy Pilcher, a major contributor to the activity center project.

Also participating were representatives of the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls headed by Mrs. Frances Griffie, Supreme Deputy in Florida; and Mrs. Leta MacMinn, Supreme Religion and Member of the House of Gold. The Rainbow Girls have made a major

contribution to construct the MacMinn Memorial Chapel as part of the activity center.

Also included in the new facility will be a learning center, a library, a large recreation room and an arts and crafts center. Construction was well under way when this issue of the Rancher went to press. Work was also in progress on residence cottage number three and two staff residences.

These projects are part of a \$3,000,000 building program which will improve and expand facilities at all three Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund child care centers.

The Marathon Formula: After Runners Cross Finish Line, Our Youngsters Are the Real Winners

Sheriffs never seem to run out of new ideas when it comes to raising money for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund.

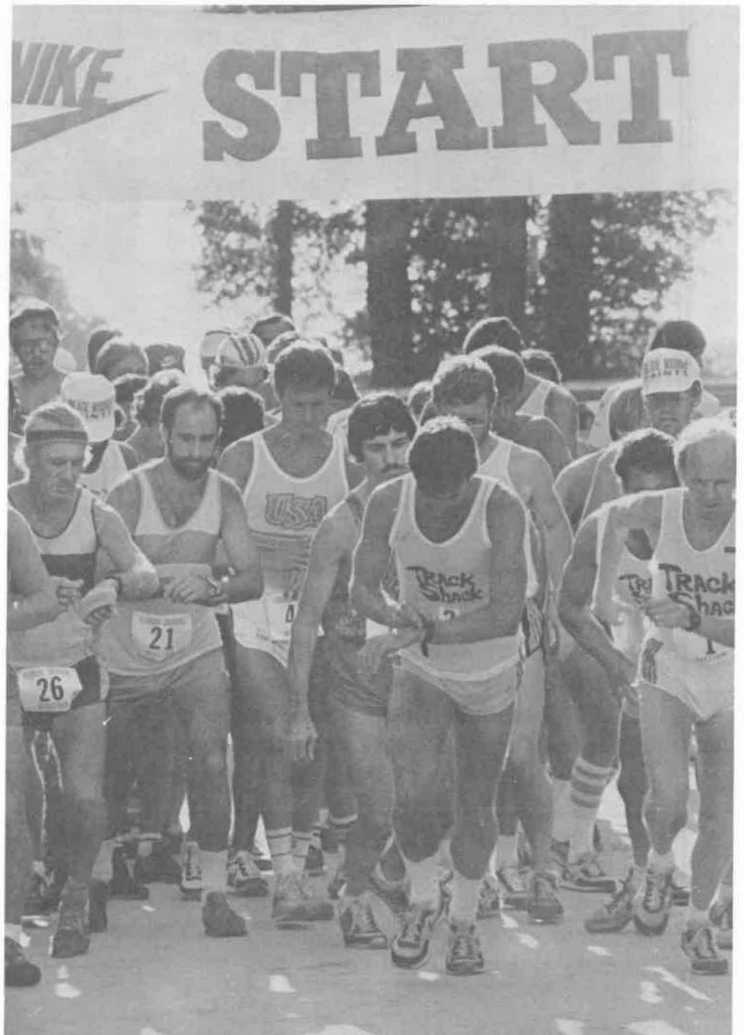
Over the past 25 years they have sponsored a wide variety of events such as horse shows, golf tournaments, barbecues, musical concerts, circuses, charity auctions, fish fries and auto races.

Lately they have begun venturing into the realm of running by organizing benefit marathons, and, as usual, it looks as though our boys and girls are going to reap substantial benefits.

Escambia County Sheriff Vince Seely, a competitive runner in his spare time, started the new trend last year with a five-kilometer run along Pensacola's bayfront, and netted \$1,717 for the Youth Fund. Now he's making final plans for an encore, which will be held on Saturday, July 3.

In central Florida another running event is shaping up as an important fund raising venture. Early this year Sheriffs John Polk, Lawson Lamar and Noel Griffin got together with Youth Fund executive Frank Bailey to

organize the First Annual Florida Sheriffs' Marathon which was held at Mount Dora, April 3.

Their initial effort drew almost 400 runners for three events, and by the time the last competitor had struggled across the finish line, Bailey was mentally making plans for next year's marathon, which will be held on January 8. He said the Sheriffs' Marathon has been sanctioned by the National Athletics Congress and next year it will be a qualifying event for the Boston Marathon.

Sheriff Polk was unable to attend the Mount Dora run because of illness, but Sheriff Griffin was on hand as the official starter and Sheriff Lamar led the runners on a motorcycle.

Bailey said excellent support was received from the news media, business firms, law enforcement agencies and local organizations.

Legislature Lauds: “A worthy and noble project which benefits youth . . .”

TALLAHASSEE — With 28 Boys Ranch, Girls Villa and Youth Ranch youngsters looking on from the House and Senate galleries, the Florida Legislature on March 10 passed a concurrent resolution praising the Boys Ranch for 25 years of success which will culminate with a 25th Anniversary Celebration on October 1, 2, and 3.

State Senator Malcolm Beard, who was formerly Sheriff of Hillsborough County, introduced the resolution in the Senate.

Representative Beverly Burnsed, who is a new member of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, Inc., and Representative Wayne Hollingsworth, whose district encompasses the Boys Ranch, spoke for the resolution in the House.

The resolution stated that:

WHEREAS, the sheriffs of the Great State of Florida, individually and collectively saw fit to create the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch on October 2, 1957, alongside the beautiful Suwannee River, in Suwannee County, Florida, and

WHEREAS, many hundreds of dependent, neglected and homeless boys have been given the opportunity to live in a positive environment that stresses strong and enduring principles, and

WHEREAS, these boys, as a result of their care at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, have been and are receiving the love, training and guidance which are so essential for the normal development and growth of any youngster, and

WHEREAS, the continuing dedication and the individual attention of Florida's sheriffs, their loyal deputies and office staffs and the Florida Sheriffs Association in behalf of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, constitute a most worthwhile and direct

contribution toward combating juvenile delinquency and the breakdown of the American family, and

WHEREAS, the staff of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, which is a component part of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund, has been given invaluable assistance by the loving and caring citizens of Florida through their generous friendship and support, and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of Florida desires to recognize these supreme achievements and specifically the 25th Anniversary of the Boys Ranch,

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida, the House of Representatives Concurring:

That the citizenry, the Florida Sheriffs Association, the sheriffs of this sovereign state and the staff of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund are hereby commended and acclaimed for their outstanding contribution to the welfare of this state generally, through the creation, operation and support of the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch marking 25 productive and fruitful years on October 2, 1982, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all citizens and residents of Florida be urged to remember the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch as a worthy and noble project, which benefits youth and contributes both spiritually and materially to their development and thus represents one of this state's finest charitable institutions.

President's Perspective

A message from
Harry K. Weaver, President
of the Florida Sheriffs
Youth Fund



The Youth Fund has always been growth-oriented, and now we're growing again. If you read the last issue of THE RANCHER, you know that we have launched a \$3,000,000 building project which will expand the facilities at all three of our Program sites and increase our capacity for residential group child care by nearly 36 percent.

In this issue of THE RANCHER you will read about a new summer camping program which will touch the lives of yet another 256 boys and girls this year.

This is progress . . . and progress is a marvelous thing. It means that objectives are being reached, goals are

being met, and even that dreams are being fulfilled.

Thank God and thank all of the wonderfully-generous people who have helped us to come so far in our efforts to mend the lives of so many troubled children. It has truly been a team effort — you and us and God, all working together.

But even as we express our appreciation, we must ask again and for even more than we have asked in the past.

Progress has a price tag. As our facilities and programs grow, so grow the costs of maintaining and operating them. Construction, expensive as it is, is only the beginning. As soon as we turn the key in the door of a new building, we assume new financial obligations. Caring for more and more boys and girls is our constant goal, but more boys and girls means more money in the operating budget.

We have always tried to be very candid in admitting that residential group child care is expensive. Along with that, we have always maintained, and still do, that our product is worth much more than its price.

We will be adding approximately 50 boys and girls to our current population in care at any given time and several new buildings. Simple arithmetic tells us that we will have to seek additional funding. We believe that we can raise the additional funds without departing from



THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS YOUTH FUND IS . . .

A charitable, non-profit corporation, sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, to manage and operate the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, Youth Ranch, and any other Youth programs that might later be developed by the Florida Sheriffs Association. An important function of the Youth Fund is the raising, receiving, budgeting, and disbursing of funds for its programs. The Youth Fund and its programs are supported almost entirely by voluntary gifts. Gifts and bequests can be made to the Youth Fund for the exclusive benefit of any single program, such as the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, or Youth Ranch, or they may be made without restriction, to be distributed among existing programs as most needed or to be used for the development of new programs at the discretion of the Governing Board. Youth Fund Central Offices are co-located with the Boys Ranch.

BOYS RANCH IS . . .

A residential group child care program for dependent, neglected, or homeless boys between the ages of eight and eighteen. It is not an institution for juvenile delinquents. The Boys Ranch is sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association and operated by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. It was founded in 1957 and currently has approximately 100 boys in residence at any given time. The Boys Ranch is located in North Florida, about halfway between Jacksonville and Tallahassee and nine miles north of the town of Live Oak on County Road 795.

GIRLS VILLA IS . . .

A similar program for girls located two miles east of Bartow, Florida, on Route 60. Originally conceived by the Sunshine State Women's Chamber of Commerce of Madeira Beach, Florida, the Girls Villa was adopted as a project of the Florida Sheriffs Association in 1970. The first buildings were completed and the first girls admitted in 1972. There are approximately 24 girls in residence at any given time. Mailing address and telephone number for the Boys Ranch, Girls Villa, and Youth Ranch are the same as for the Youth Fund.

YOUTH RANCH IS . . .

The most recently developed residential group child care program of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Fund. Also sponsored by the Florida Sheriffs Association, it was founded in 1976 and opened in 1978. It is located just east of the intersection of the McMullen-Booth Road and County Road 102 near Clearwater, Florida. The Youth Ranch has approximately 20 boys and girls in residence at any given time. It provides care in a homelike environment for brothers and sisters who are dependent, neglected, or homeless. Mailing address and telephone number are the same as for the Youth Fund.

our traditional ways, because we have acquired a great deal of confidence, over the years, in the goodness and generosity of people.

We will continue to rely heavily upon current giving (both cash and non-cash) which provides a significant part of our day-to-day operating capital.

As always, we will try to generate a portion of our funding from within our own resources, insofar as we can do this without impairing the effectiveness of our programs.

Historically, one of our most important sources of income has been from deferred giving — wills, trusts, annuities, gifts of life insurance, etc. For many people, the deferred gift makes it possible to give more than they otherwise could, and, quite frequently, there are significant tax advantages to such gifts.

The Youth Fund was one of the first non-profit agencies to be licensed to write gift annuities in Florida. With this type of annuity, a person can make a gift and still receive an income from it for life. The income may also be assigned to some other person. Gift annuities pay a fixed annual interest, currently up to 14 percent, depending upon the age of the annuitant.

More recently, the Youth Fund has established a Pooled Income Fund. A Pooled Income contract is similar to a gift annuity except that the rate of interest varies not only with age but also with rises and falls in the money market.

These are just some of the ways that you can become involved, or even more involved than you already are, in the Youth Fund's challenge of salvaging young lives for the future.

To meet our challenge, we must grow. To grow, we need the same kind of concern and kindness that our friends and supporters have always shown . . . and just a bit more.

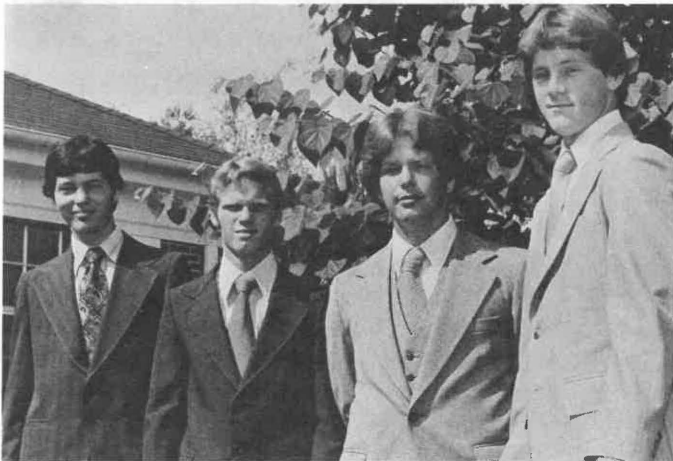

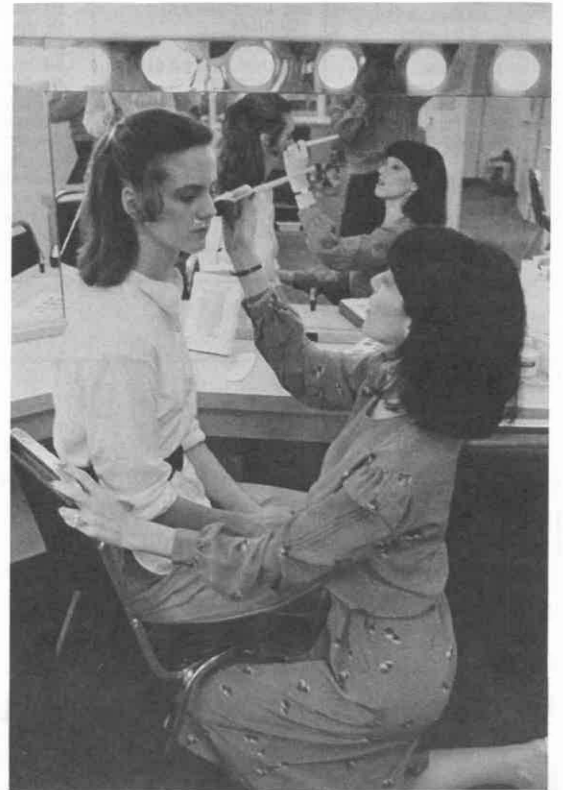
