President's Perspective

A message from C. T. O'Donnell II, President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches




On March 15, 1994, I was entrusted with the office of President of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. What a wonderful challenge — and an enormous responsibility!

There have been many welcoming people, the boys and girls, the Board, the staff, and especially our donor family. There have been highlights and great dilemmas too.

One of the highlights has been learning about the many different ways we help children and their families. As an example, I came to realize how very extensive the family social work program is and that it actually helps so many children and families, right in their own homes.

Another exciting area has been the establishment of the Harry K. Weaver Honorary Endowment Fund as a tribute to the President-Emeritus of the Youth Ranches. This will help children for years and years to come. In the very near future, you will



receive a special letter from me asking for your help in this effort.

We anticipate sufficient funds, earmarked exclusively to build a second cottage at the Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota campus, and a new campsite at the Caruth Camp. However, this presents a dilemma because, we have 60 empty beds at other sites and there is not enough operational monies to fund all programs on an ongoing basis — that is funding for food for clothing and shelter. This has been brought about by a general downturn in the economy and therefore our donors have less discretionary income.

However, I know there is an answer out there. I know this will turn around and that with your help, and the help of the Board, the Sheriffs, the staff, and with so many caring people involved, an answer will come. Of this I am certain.

You have all been so supportive to the Youth Ranches over the years and I want to thank you for what you have done, and what you continue to do for the many needy boys and girls we serve.

I am pleased to report that Harry K. Weaver continues to be very active in the financial development arena and will continue helping us for some months to come. His goal has been, and continues to be, that we be able to help as many troubled boys and girls as we can with the funds available. I share that goal.

atching this attractive, confident young lady stride across the campus

of the Youth Ranch at Safety Harbor, it's hard to imagine that she could have been another statistic in the juvenile crime rate. However, because generous people still care, she isn't.

Arriving at the Youth Ranch when she was just 14, Teri had a history of hanging out with the "wrong" crowd, truancy, and a strong disregard for structure and discipline — a prime candidate for a future laden with delinquency and criminal behavior.

Resident Director Joe Ballard reflects on that younger Teri, "She was a feisty little thing, not afraid of anything or anyone. Teri would challenge authority figures and peers alike," recalled Mr. Ballard. Accustomed to coming and going as she pleased, it was the firm guidance, consistent accountability, and the patient, loving spirit of "Mom & Pop" Elliott that encouraged Teri to turn her life around.

"After awhile, I began to understand they really did care. I

knew it was up to me what I did with what they offered me," said Teri. Once she accepted the support, counseling, and structure that is an integral part of life at the Youth Ranch, two of her greatest assets — athletic ability and determination — began to emerge.

Wonderfully blessed as a natural athlete, Teri has played soccer since she was seven years old, gaining a reputation that is known throughout the

countryside . . . Countryside High School that is . . . where she has played **varsity** for four years and served as **tri-captain** for the past two.

Teri's extensive trophy display more than adequately reflects the caliber of her talents. It gives the impression that she has won almost every available award in soccer. One of her greatest successes came

when she earned a place on the Florida Athletic Coaches Association West All-Star team and was named Most Valuable Player.

On campus, Teri received the **Resident Direc**tor's Award, which is the highest award given to our youth for their overall achievement and positive change. She has also claimed the annual **Athlete of the Year Award** on four separate occasions.

With Teri's determination, focus, discipline, organization, and outstanding personality, awards and recognitions such as these will not end here. Teri maintained a "B" average throughout high school, and held a part-time job to help with her team travel expenses. After reviewing scholarship offers from a number of colleges, Teri accepted an offer to attend school in Anderson, South Carolina.

Steer and Heifer Auction is payoff for months of hard work

hirteen percent of the young men in residence at the Boys Ranch successfully completed the steer and heifer program with a fine showing at the Suwannee Valley Youth Livestock Show and Sale. Their hard work paid off when many won ribbons and plaques in recognition of their achievements.

Chance, a 17-year old from South Florida, rarely encountered farm animals prior to coming to the Boys Ranch, and initially was extremely hesitant to get involved

in the program. But, as he began to enjoy the horses at the Ranch, his education about the other animals grew.

Last year, Chance "tended" a heifer and developed a great deal of trust and compassion for the young animal. This year, he took on an even greater challenge to break and show a steer. Chance's long hours and responsible behavior were well worth it. He won a ribbon for Home

Grown Champion Steer as well as added to his savings account with the money earned from the sale of the steer.

John, a strapping young man from the North Florida area also invested his time, effort, and patience raising a steer. His animal weighed in at 1104 pounds which is extremely important when the buyer pays by the pound. John's careful attention to detail certainly increased the value of his steer.

commitment is less and the animals are not sold at the fair.




> The chores and enjoyment of these animals go hand in hand. Each young man feels a strong sense of success and pride, which is overwhelmingly apparent as they "show" their animals.


ment was really worth it!

For Dee: The hard way seemed to be the best way

n 1989, Dee, a 16-year old, and her two younger sisters became residents at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa. They were desperately in need of a stable living environment with a strong emphasis on educational opportunities.

Over two years behind in school, Dee was faced with a difficult decision whether to attend high school for three or four years or take an examination for a General Education Diploma (GED). She thought hard about the sacrifices and challenges of entering a new school and a class two years behind her age group, weighed the tediousness of daily schoolwork against the expediency of GED studies and finally, with a strong determination and unswerving desire, she decided the hard way was the best way.

"I wanted to graduate with a class... to stay in school. I look forward to going every day," said Dee in a recent interview. Dee has been extremely successful in her pursuit of the "typical" teenage goals, winning medals in track events, and being elected to her high school homecoming court.

Dee has also capitalized on many other opportunities at the Villa. Her positive and productive behavior earned her the privilege of taking an offcampus job. After working at Little Caesars Pizza

Restaurant for the past three years, she is currently the Assistant Manager.

Recognizing the need for reliable transportation to and from work, Dee saved her money and purchased her first car. All the upkeep, insurance, gas, and maintenance are her full responsibility.

Dee has also taken on a leadership role by serving as the Youth Villa Council President for a third consecutive term. The elected council members represent their peers and work with the administration on decisions relating to campus improvements and activities. When asked what positive steps have been taken on campus under her leadership,

she quickly cited the addition of a tetherball court, a shuffleboard court and a water fountain near the recreation area.

Anticipating graduation this spring, Dee is preparing for her future by residing in the Independent Living Cottage which allows her to be responsible for her personal schedule, meals, and budget. However, she is required to observe the structured

guidelines of the program, obey the nightly curfew and maintain responsible behavior.

After graduation, Dee plans to secure her own apartment in the Bartow area because it's familiar to her and will enable her to keep in touch with her sisters. Dee knows the value of taking small, careful steps in shaping her future and would eventually like to pursue a career in law enforcement. It may have been a long road to her cap and gown, but it certainly has been a successful journey.

Earlier this spring two of our five residential childcare campuses held their annual Open House celebrations. Sheriffs, community leaders, donors, friends and families joined us in giving recognition to our growth and leadership in quality child care.

Dedication ceremonies for the Kiwanis Club of Bradenton Administration Building and the Hugh and Mary Wilson Foundation Activities Center highlighted the program held at the Youth Ranch-Bradenton/Sarasota. State Senator John McKay, a strong advocate of child and family values, was the guest speaker. He deplored the decay of the traditional family structure and offered active solutions by pledging to support residential child-care programs such as the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc.

Judge Beauchamp challenged the audience to acknowledge the current problems, to actively participate in the solutions, and to become advocates on behalf of children in need.

Culture and Education Found in the Rich History of St. Augustine




ince the basics such as food, electricity, clothing and supplies consume a major portion of our income, the constant struggle to meet these escalating expenses limits our


Residents of the Youth Villa gather for a picture at the Fountain of Youth.

Endowment fund honors youth who was killed in Vietnam

new \$25,000 Endowment Fund has been established by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, Inc. to serve the needs of Florida's neglected, unsupervised and troubled youngsters.

Created as a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Charles M. Taylor, of Little Rock, Arkansas, and their daughter, Julia J. Taylor, the fund is a memorial to Charles M. Taylor III, son and brother of the donors, who was killed in combat while serving in Vietnam with the First Marine Division. At the time of his death he was 19.

Charles grew up on the outskirts of Little Rock, attended the public schools in Little Rock, and graduated from The Hill School at

Pottstown, Pennsylvania. He enrolled at Vanderbilt University, in Nashville, Tennessee, but cut short his college career to enlist in the Marines. He finished his recruit training in the top ten percent of his platoon.

Killed in combat November 21, 1967, PFC Taylor was awarded the Purple Heart, National Defense Service Medal, Vietnam Service Medal with one bronze star, the Vietnam Military Merit Medal, and the Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with palm.

"To honor this gallant young man with a memorial endowment fund seems very appropriate," said

As a youth he became aware of the needs of troubled boys when he accompanied his father to St. Francis Academy, at Salina, Kansas, to donate a training cart and two ponies. They not only delivered this gift, but also spent considerable time training the young people in handling the ponies before returning home.

"With this kind of background, and with the example he set by serving in the Acolyte Guild and participating in the youth program at Christ Episcopal

Church, in Little Rock, Charles M. Taylor III established a standard of conduct that our Youth Ranches boys and girls will find worthy of emulating."

Weaver expressed deep appreciation for the Taylors' gift, and said he hoped it would encourage other donors to establish similar endowment funds. He explained that the principal of the Charles M. Taylor III Memorial Endowment Fund will be kept intact, but the income it produces from investments will be used as needed for current Youth Ranches operating expenses.





"I feel the Ranch has saved another child's future."

The following letter to the editor of the *St. Petersburg Times* was written by the grandmother of a young man who formerly lived at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor. He is now living independently after graduating from Countryside High School, and is attending St. Petersburg Junior College. A scholarship provided by a member of the Youth Ranch/Safety Harbor Board of Associates is helping to defray the cost of his education, but he is also working part-time to help with his living expenses. We are proud to add this admirable young man to our honor roll of Youth Ranches achievers.

Dear Editor:

I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, particularly to the wonderful, dedicated people at the Safety Harbor Ranch.

Three-and-one-half years ago my grandson was accepted into the Safety Harbor facility. He was an outof-control teen. The first five years of his life were extremely difficult. His parents divorced.

To save this beautiful child from foster care, I took him into my home and loved him as my own son. Unfortunately, the scars of his earlier years and the continued lack of love and concern from his parents remained deep within this boy.

He attended an excellent private school where he was looked after until I returned from work. He was involved in seasonal sports, piano lessons, tennis instruction and all the cultural events I could manage.

He was a difficult child, very strong-willed; but life

went fairly well until he was about 11 years old. He then became very disobedient, angry, and verbally abusive. His school grades fell, and he continually lied for no apparent reason.

We both went to counseling. There was no improvement. I was no longer able to control this child. I knew he needed 24-hour supervision and good male role models in his life. It was apparent the future would be extremely grim for him, if something wasn't done soon.

After much effort and an endless amount of time, he was accepted in the Safety Harbor Ranch. I feel the Ranch has saved another child's future. I am quite sure he would not have graduated from high school and would probably have gotten into some serious trouble had he remained on the destructive course.


With the excellent care, concern and guidance of all these dedicated people and the generosity of the Ranch's benefactors, this boy is on the right track. He will attend college in the fall and plans to major in architecture and psychology. The Ranch will continue to assist him with a scholarship for school and housing expenses, provided he does his part with his studies and works part-time. I am confident he will be a credit to all and someday he will find a way to pay back to the Ranch for all he received.

It is so sad that such a limited number of boys and girls can be helped at the Ranches. The kind, but firm approach is what it takes to save these poor, innocent children of circumstances beyond their control. Not only do the children become happy, productive citizens, but the community is saved from out-of-control youths who eventually become adult criminals who are destroying our society.

I thank Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches again and will continue to do so as long as I live. They are a truly kind and dedicated group of outstanding human beings.
