



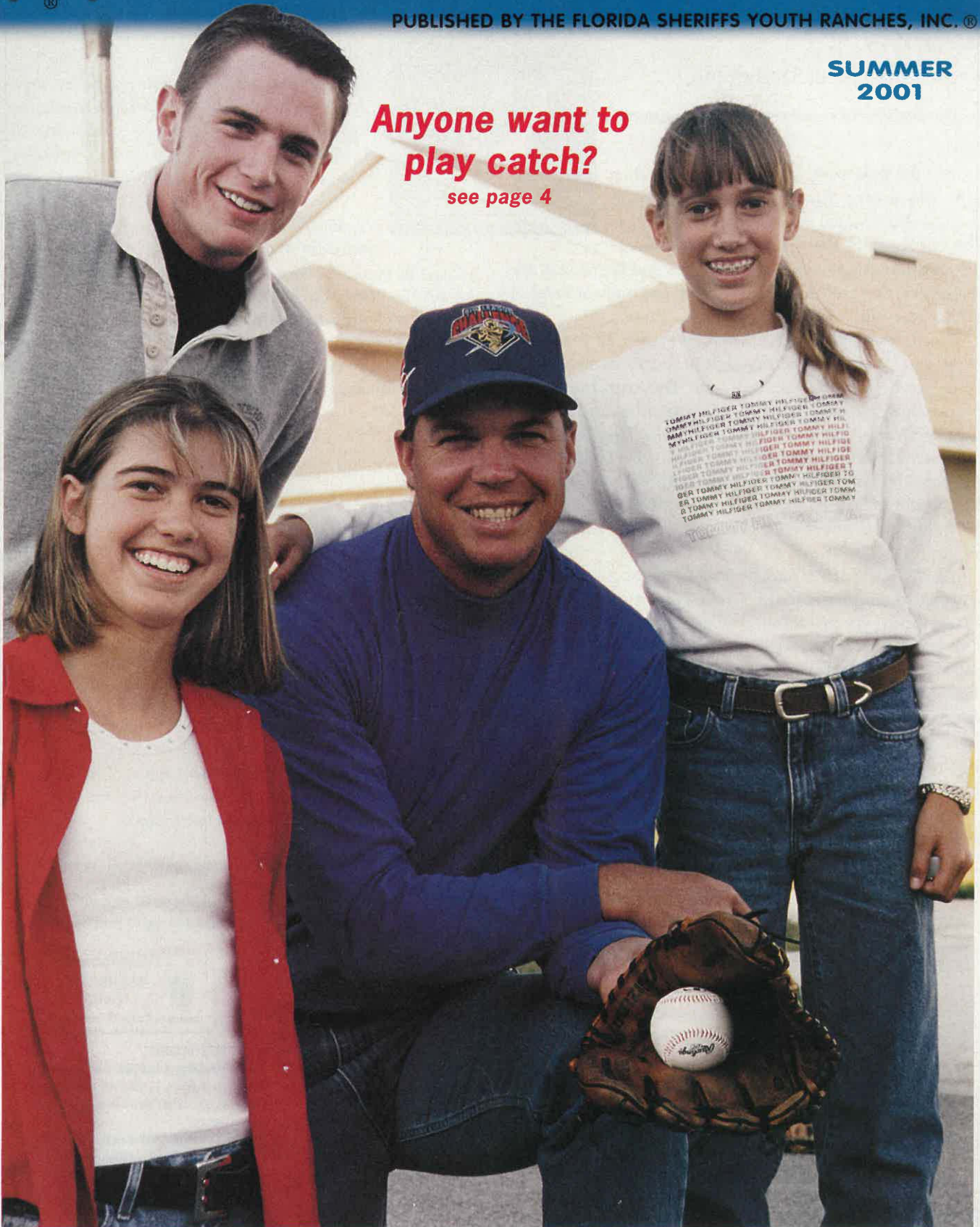

A message from Roger O. Bouchard, Jr.
President of the

For the past year, the Youth Ranches has been preparing for our reaccreditation through the Council on Accreditation of Services for Families and Children. This process of accreditation occurs every four years and is one way we ensure that our children are receiving the highest level of service possible.

Since our first national accreditation over 12 years ago, the Youth Ranches has received high marks in all areas of administration and service delivery. The team from COA spends almost a week visiting our programs and looking at our policies, procedures and practices. They interview staff, Board members and most especially, the children and families who we serve. Although qualifying for national accreditation takes an incredible amount of work, we feel that this effort pays off in ensuring high quality care for our boys and girls.

As this issue of the Rancher comes to you, our summer camping programs are in full swing. The Youth Camp and Caruth Camp are providing weeks of summer camp, free of charge, to hundreds of deserving boys and girls who would not otherwise have an opportunity to enjoy this experience. We also have four teams of staff providing day camps in disadvantaged neighborhoods around the state. These "Harmony in the Streets" programs are offered in partnership with local Sheriffs Offices as a way to further help youngsters understand the theme of "Law Officers Are Your Friends." As Deputy Sheriffs work with Youth Ranches staff, boys and girls begin to understand that these

law officers are in their communities to serve, protect and help local citizens. The relationships developed between Deputies and the children and parents in the community remain long after the camp is over.

It always seems miraculous to me to think about the many thousands of young people whose lives are touched each year by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. We have the wonderful opportunity to see young lives turned around and headed in the right direction. None of this would be possible without the support of you, our donor family. Thank you so much for sharing with and caring for our youth.

Boys Ranch Alumni Host Activity Day

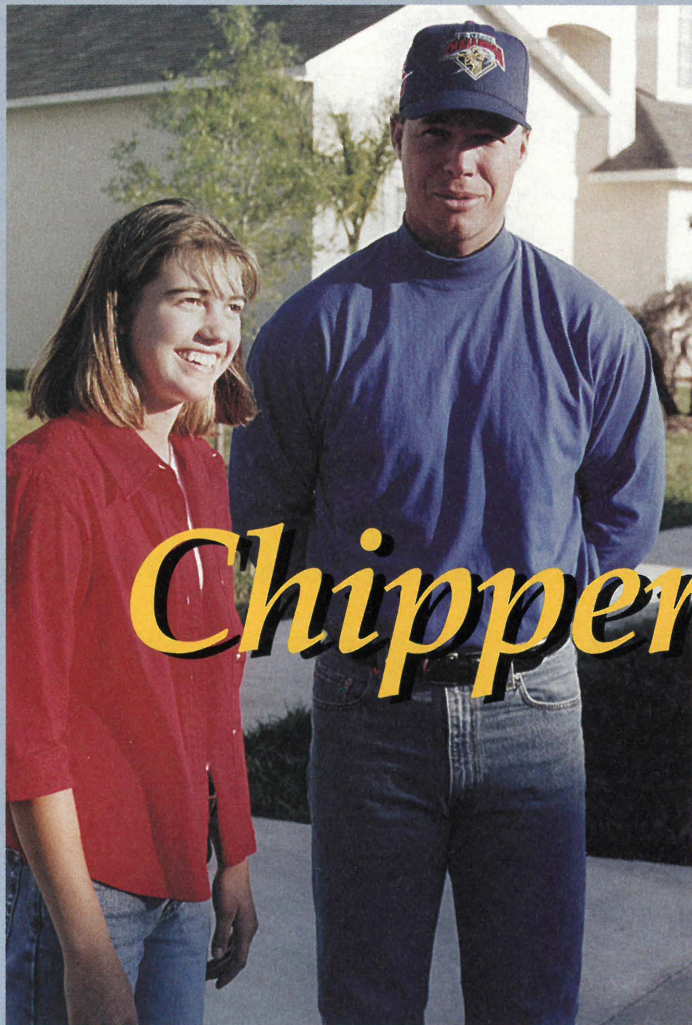

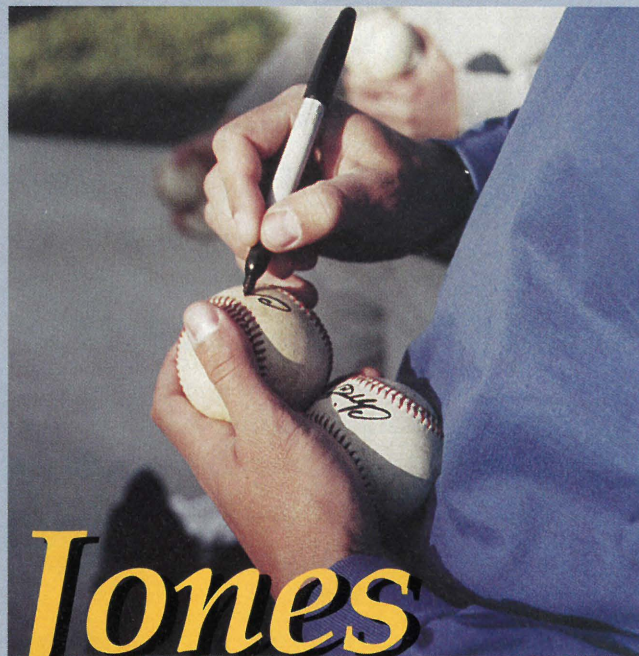

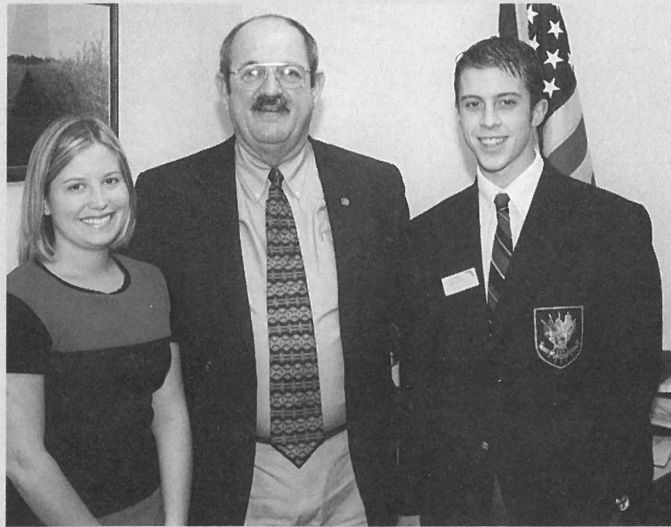

Tony's week in Tallahassee was a whirlwind of activity

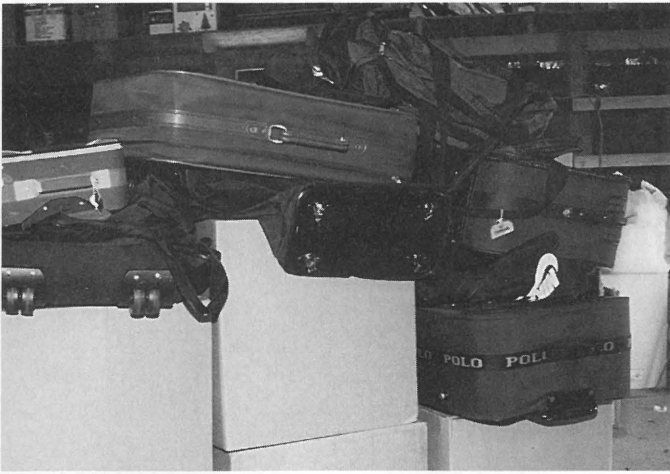

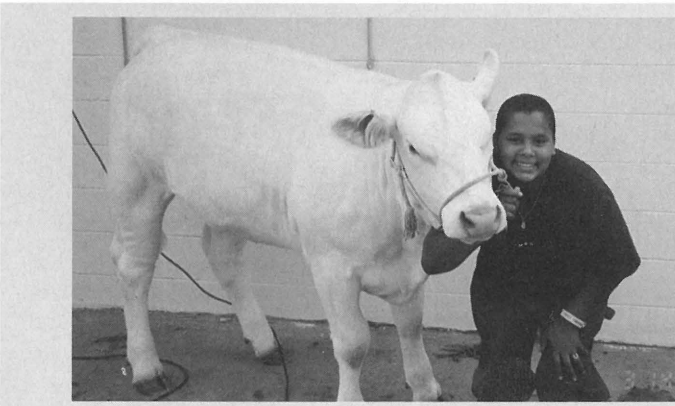

"I believe this is what the Ranch is all about, a quote from Proverbs 'Train up a child in the way he should go and when he is old, he will not depart from it.'"

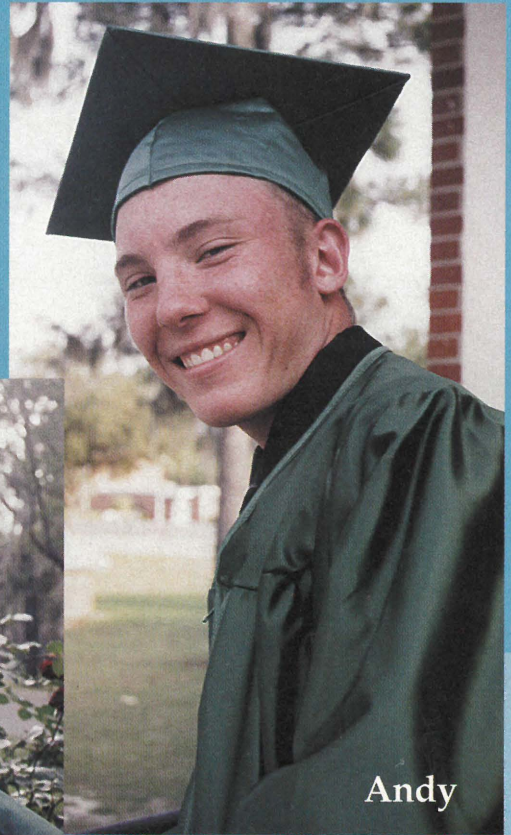
Goals: Attend Tallahassee Community College and study Music (with a minor in Communications) and then enter the Army.

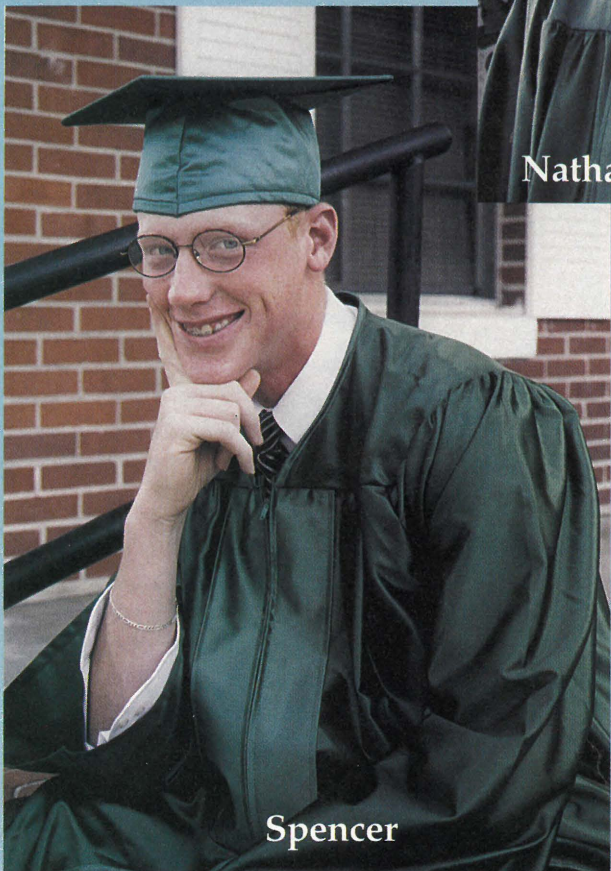

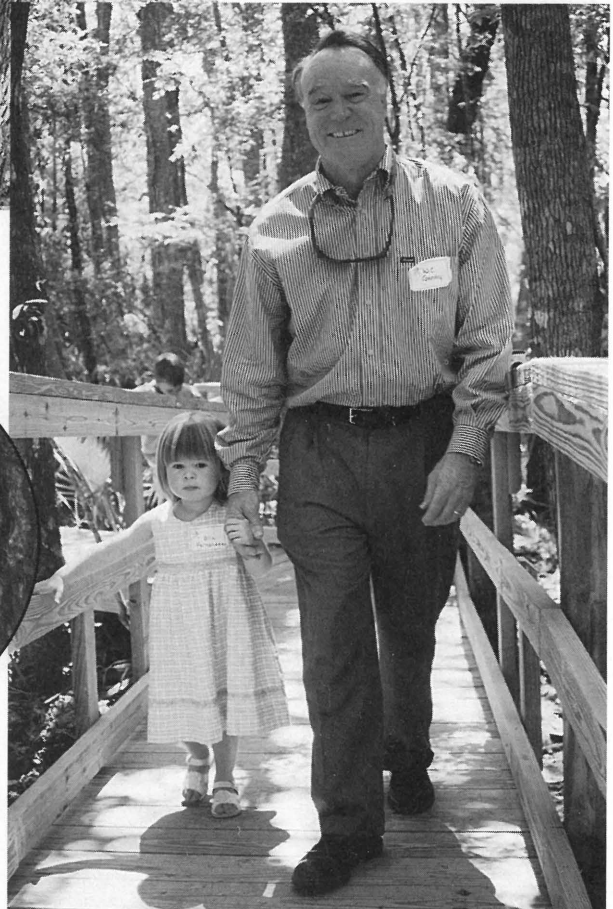

Rosa Mae Gentry left a legacy of love. Her life was simple and complete. Love of family; the splendors of nature; and God. Her most remarkable trait was her gentle spirit. The one common thread in everyone's recollection of "Rosa Mae" is that she always seemed to focus on the good. Being with her always lifted your spirit. Rarely a cross word, always a helpful hand and a sense of fun, she was a gentle woman who was yet strong in her convictions.

Born Rosa Mae Chambers in rural Tennessee, she embraced nature long before it was called "the environment." She loved to be outside, to breathe air touched by

24 lollipop sticks

1 box of white/yellow moist cake mix

1/3 cup of vegetable oil

2 eggs

1 can of frosting (lemon)

red food coloring

green sugar leaves

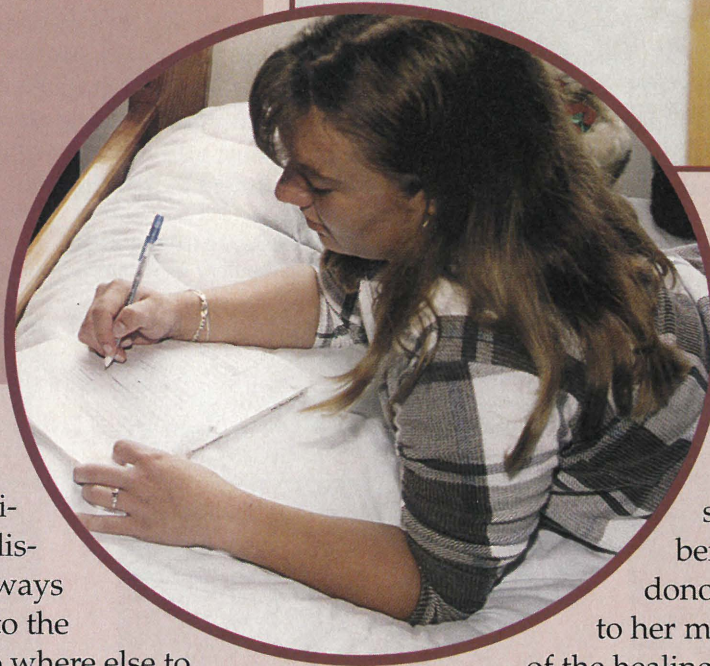
holiday bite/sugar roses

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Combine the moist cake mix, eggs, and oil in a bowl. Form balls of the mix with a teaspoon and insert the sticks into the center of the balls. Bake on a greased cookie sheet until firm, then cool. Add food coloring to the frosting and cover each piece. Decorate each pop with the sugar roses and sugar leaves. Display on platter accordingly.

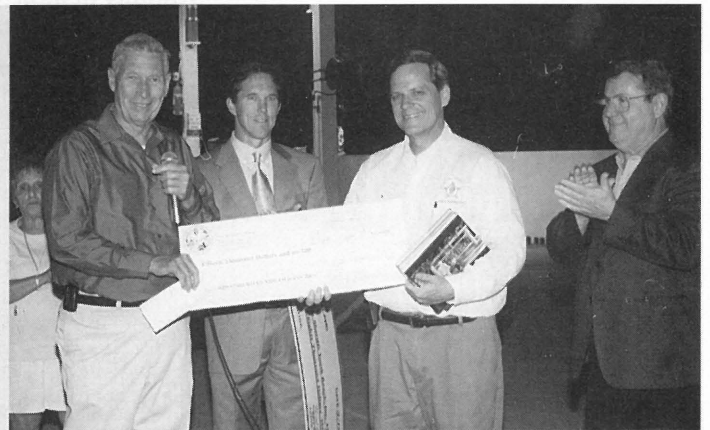
A Gentle Generous Giver

A Message from Youth Ranches Vice President Financial Development

I am indebted to Thomas N. Silverman Esq., a prominent Palm Beach County Attorney for an article he wrote for The Palm Beach Post concerning the preparation of a will. The following is an excerpt (used by permission) from the article.

"There are those who have an exaggerated opinion of the cost of a lawyer's advice in the preparation of a will, but the cost of not procuring correct, current guidance in making your will can be far more costly than any legal fees involved.

While the majority of people in this country do not have a valid will at the time of their death, the fact remains that a will is still considered a sacred and important document involving deliberate forethought and consideration and the act of making a will is a momentous occasion worthy of sincere introspection.

There is no more personal an act or expression of genuine concern than a person providing in their will for the guaranteed financial security and well-being of a loved one. All of the effort spent in life in gaining a good education, obtaining your first job, seeing savings grow and paying taxes seems miniscule and irrelevant when compared to

actually passing on all that it has taken a lifetime to accumulate.

That opportunity is typically perceived by an individual as the essence of making a will. The formalities of execution which the law requires as an attendant to the act of making a will heighten the solemnity and importance of the occasion. There is a silence as the individual grasps the pen to sign their name to the will after having heard the lawyer's instructions which precede the execution of the document. There is reflection, concern and contemplation at work at that moment. Lawyers call it the moment of truth - that instant where the mortal meets the immortal - the recognition and admission by an individual that he will not live forever and with it, the realization that, knowing this, he has chosen to provide for the people most dear to him in his own way, not to be confused with the thousands of similar ways in which the transmission of wealth is provided for in wills signed the same day in lawyers' offices, bank trust departments and other places around the country by persons who have given the matter the same degree of premeditation."

For those individuals who have remembered the Youth Ranches in their estate plans, we are eternally grateful. For those who are still in the preparation process, we encourage you of the importance and significance of your actions.
