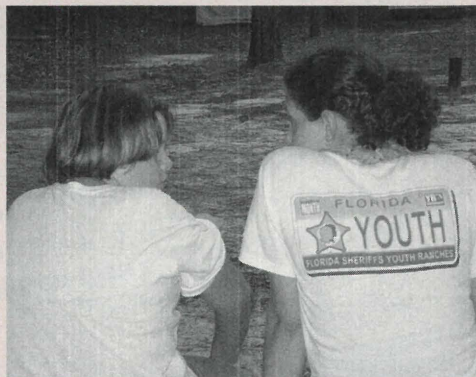
# Fulfilling the Tender Wish of a Child

Last summer, Palm Beach County Deputy Sheriff Bill LaFlamme came to camp to teach our boys and girls the camp theme "Law Enforcement Officers Are Your Friends." Little did he know that he was about to change the life of a child forever!

Deputy LaFlamme and several other Counselors worked with ten girls ages 12-13. They spent the week together enjoying great camp activities such as arts and crafts, canoeing, horseback riding, the Challenge Course, hiking and so much more. This particular group of girls became quite well known as boisterous, playful and full of energy. You could hear the giggles, laughter and silly songs each day as they walked around camp. And, it was no easy task to get them quieted down for bed each night. Life at summer camp was very, very good!

The bond of friendship and trust between this Deputy and these girls grew greater with each passing day. Then one night, near the end of camp, a sudden quiet came over the girls. During their evening Pow Wow around the campfire, he had asked them an unusual question. "If you had a MILLION DOLLARS, and couldn't spend it on yourself, what would you do with it?"

There were some expected answers like "buy my mom a house" or "find my dad" and there were even some softer ideas like "build a camp like this for other kids like me" or "donate

it to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch." But, none of the responses hit home more than Elaina's quiet reply, "I'd give it to my grandfather so he can buy a gravestone for my grandma."

Stunned, Deputy LaFlamme swallowed hard as he watched the tears well up in Elaina's eyes. She spoke tenderly and told her new friends about her great love for the woman who raised her. Elaina's hurt and loss was very real...she just wanted to find a way to remember her grandmother with dignity and pride.

Long after the summer had ended, through the hurricanes and holidays, Deputy LaFlamme remembered Elaina's million dollar wish. There were generous folks in Palm Beach County, including newly elected Sheriff Ric Bradshaw, who immediately offered to help. Deputy LaFlamme made contact with the Sheriffs Office in the county where Elaina lives and decidedly took action to make this right!

With the support of Saint Lucie County Sheriff Ken Mascara, Chief Deputy Garry Wilson spoke to community leader George Seliga who worked for a funeral home near the site where Elaina's grandmother rests. The initial plan was to approach a local civic group to purchase a headstone for her grave. However, Mr. Seliga had a different idea.

"This is something I want to do myself," said Mr. Seliga. He stepped forward and took care of every detail.

Not only did he provide for Elaina's grandmother, he purchased a double marker to ensure her grandfather would have the same dignity in the future.

One bright, sunny afternoon, a long black limousine pulled up to the DeCesare home. Elaina and her family journeyed to the cemetery to remember Barbara Ann DeCesare (1945-1999). Remarkably, Elaina

had carried this burden for six long years and finally knew her grandmother would rest and be remembered in peace.

# Inspiring Our Ranchers to New Heights "Go Ahead and Volunteer!"

"Dreams do come true," exclaimed Kittinger, "All it usually takes is some good, hard work!" These words rang true as Colonel Joe Kittinger, the man who holds the record for taking the highest step in the world (parachuting nearly 103,000 feet back to earth) out of an Air Force balloon, personally told our boys about the adventures in his life.

As a young man, Kittinger thought it would be a great thrill to fly airplanes...so he joined the United States Air Force to learn this skill. He became an experimental test pilot, researching and flying many different jet and fighter airplanes.

The rides were often rocky and rough as the golden era of aircraft development was honed to perfection. Each new invention

was a challenge that included months of patient strategy, initial testing and revision, but when the ride was ready, Kittinger got the call. On one occasion, he rode a rocket sled to test a new restraint that was the forerunner of today's vehicle seatbelts.

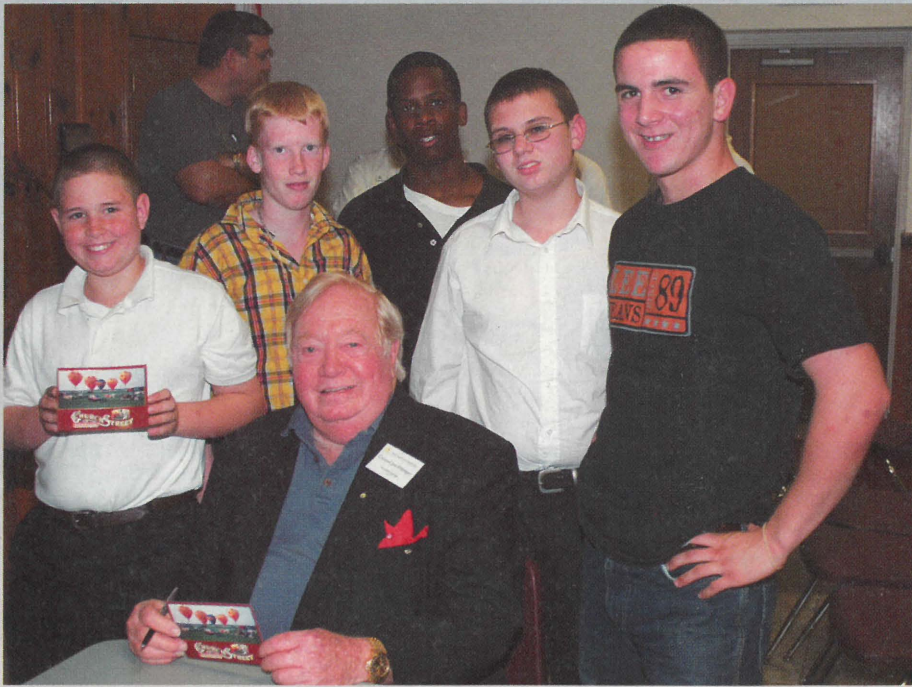
Kittinger claims to have made a career of volunteering! When they needed a pilot to make a test flight in zero gravity, Kittinger stepped up. "I always believed volunteering gave you an advantage over those who don't. If you have the chance to go first, do it!"

In August of 1960, Captain Joe Kittinger's bravery and stamina were put to a brand new test. He was suited up and lifted to the edge of space in a gondola beneath a large balloon. Then, with a brief prayer "Lord, take care of me now," he took a huge step out, plummeting back to earth, breaking the sound barrier, falling at 714 miles per hour. The purpose of this great feat – to demonstrate that future astronauts could survive in

space with a pressure suit and that a man could eject from an aircraft at incredible heights and survive. And survive, he did!

Colonel Kittinger's career was far from over. He served three tours in Vietnam, commanded the Triple Nickel Fighter Squadron, and shot down a Mig fighter before being captured and tortured at the Hanoi

Hilton, a North Vietnam prison, for 11 months. Yet again, another story of survival.

After retirement from the Air Force, Colonel Kittinger couldn't get the love for adventure out of his system. In 1984, he set the world's record for the first solo balloon flight across the Atlantic Ocean beginning in Maine and landing three and one half days later in Italy. Re-counting this journey to the boys, he mused, "the Concord [supersonic jet] sure makes a lot of noise when it buzzes by a balloon!"

Amidst the tales of super speed and aircraft adventures that engages the minds of eager young

men, Kittinger's true message rings clear. He stands tall and proud, an American hero, who cares to teach these boys about one thing, many ways – RESPECT!

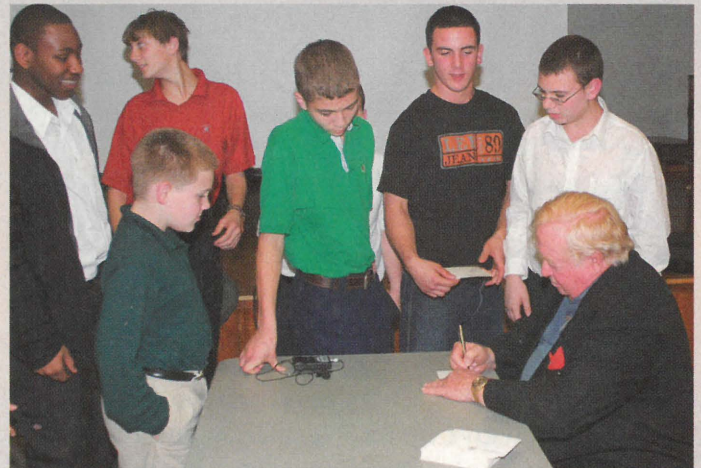
Respect for Country...as taught by a man who has been all over the world.

With the help of the Learning Center, I was able to move to the local high school. Now, I participate in several athletic activities.

# Working with Animals Builds Character in Our Youth

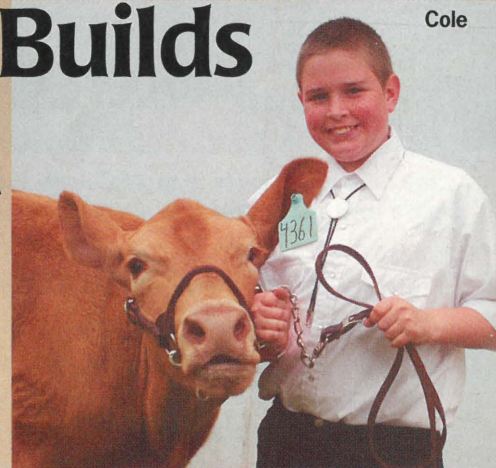
Every year, several boys at the Ranch make a serious commitment of *diligence, dependability* and *enthusiasm* when they decide to show a heifer at the county fair.

Beginning just after the first of the year, these boys begin the three month long process by selecting an animal for the show. The Boys Ranch Farm Manager and several other key staff begin working with the boys, teaching them how to groom and handle the animal.

Demonstrating *patience, initiative* and *responsibility* are also a huge part of this endeavor. The boys often give up their recreation and free time to master the art of convincing a cow to walk on a lead line. With each passing day, there is progress and an occasional set back as they nurture the heifer along.

Finally, after months of preparation, the boys have the opportunity to bring the animals to the fair. Each begins to size up the competition and determine if their animal might win the Grand Champion title. Everything within their control has been perfected, but the judge will evaluate both the youngster's talent in showmanship and the animal's development against the breed's standard. The boys must now display *attentiveness, flexibility*, and ultimately *discernment* and *honor* as they accept the final decisions of the judge.

All of our boys did a wonderful job. And, while we didn't bring home the Grand Champion title this year, we know our Ranchers are champions of great character and plenty of hard work!



**Attentiveness** – Showing the worth of a person or task by giving my undivided concentration.

**Dependability** – Fulfilling what I consented to do, even if it means unexpected sacrifice.

**Diligence** – Investing my time and energy to complete each task assigned to me.

**Discernment** – Understanding the deeper reason why things happen.

**Enthusiasm** – Expressing joy in each task as I give it my best effort.

**Flexibility** – Willingness to change plans or ideas according to the direction of my authorities.

**Honor** – Respecting those in leadership because of the higher authorities they represent.

**Initiative** – Recognizing and doing what needs to be done before I am asked to do it.

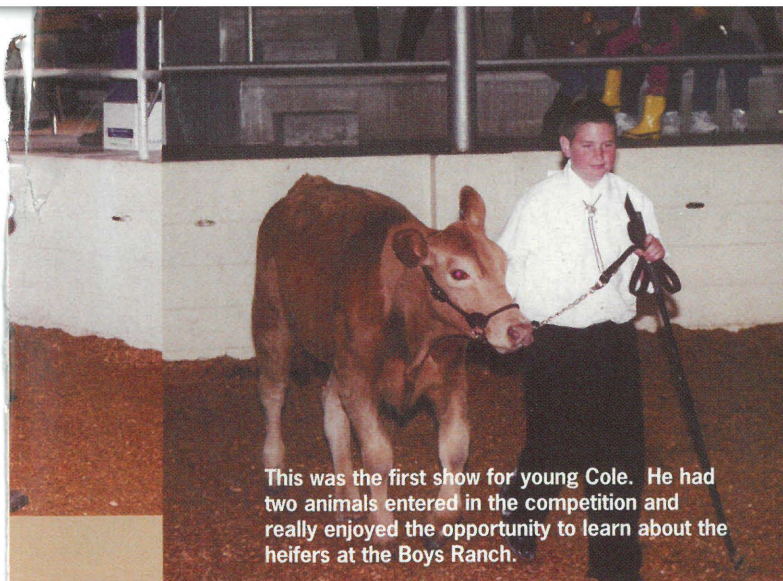
**Patience** – Accepting a difficult situation without giving a deadline to remove it.

**Responsibility** – Knowing and doing what is expected of me.

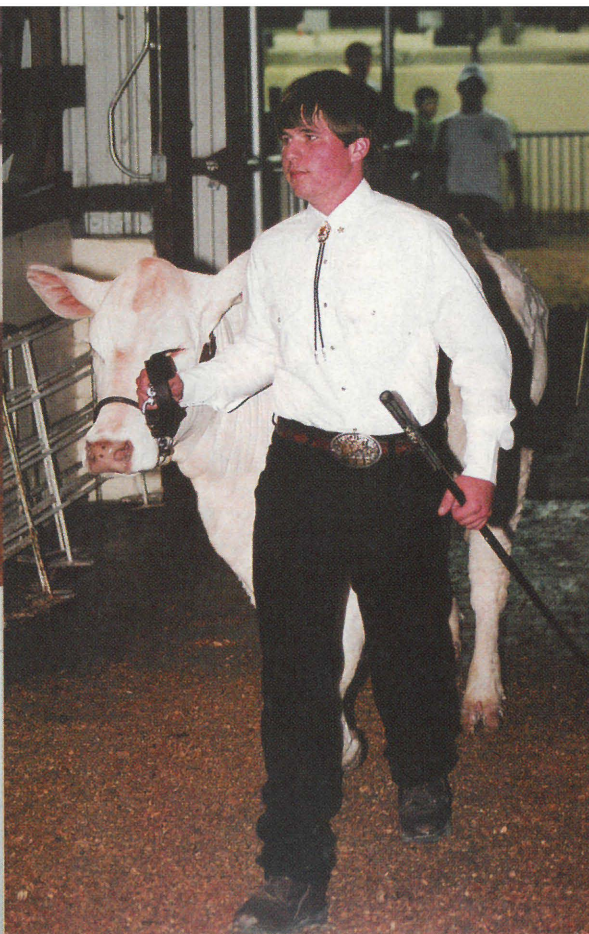

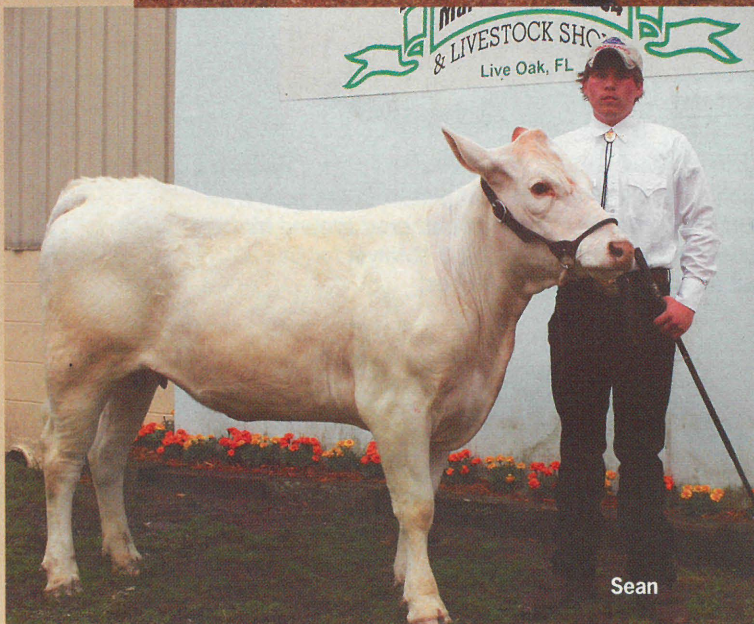
This was the first show for young Cole. He had two animals entered in the competition and really enjoyed the opportunity to learn about the heifers at the Boys Ranch.

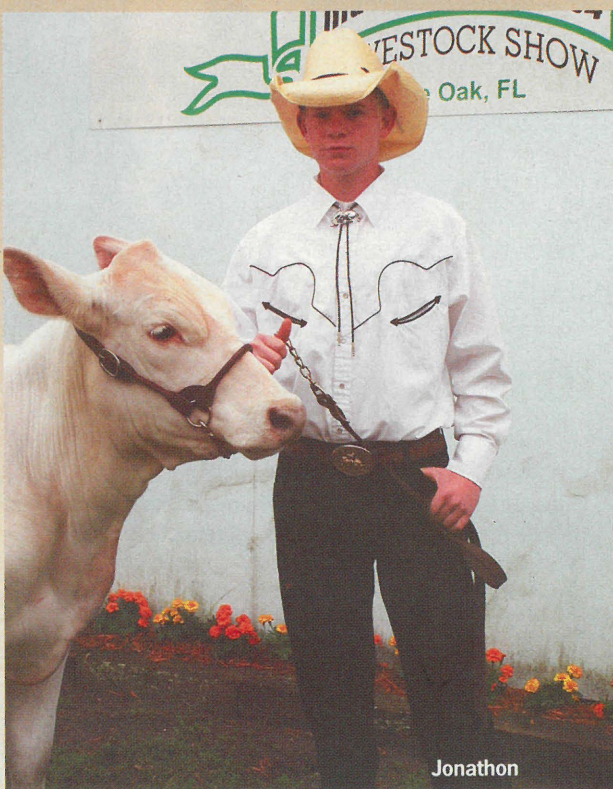

He knew his neighborhood well, perhaps a little too well, and saw little hope for a bright future. Everything changed when this boy from the city began a new life at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch.

Initially, Jeremy was a bit skeptical about county living. After all, the only animals he had ever really known were his two bulldogs, Anna and Dunn. But soon, Jeremy discovered he had a special gift for working with animals, all sizes and kinds.

The Van Ness Farm became his new neighborhood. He spent almost every available minute riding horses, working the cows, feeding the

chickens or bringing in hay. Sometimes grubby, often filthy, Jeremy loved his job at the farm. His bright smile said it all! Regardless of the task, Jeremy was diligent, trustworthy and always willing to learn.

Learn? This boy who failed 7th grade was eager about learning? Without exception! Jeremy had found his future at the Boys Ranch.

During his first year at the Ranch, Jeremy decided he wanted to become a large animal veterinarian. When he found out what it would take – great grades, a strong work ethic and lots of hands on experience – he set those goals in front of him and took charge of his future.

Less than two years later, he won the coveted Carleton F. Tweed

Memorial Horsemanship Trophy given to the boy on the Ranch who consistently displays excellent skills in horsemanship, significant interest in the care and well being of animals, and demonstrates high standards and



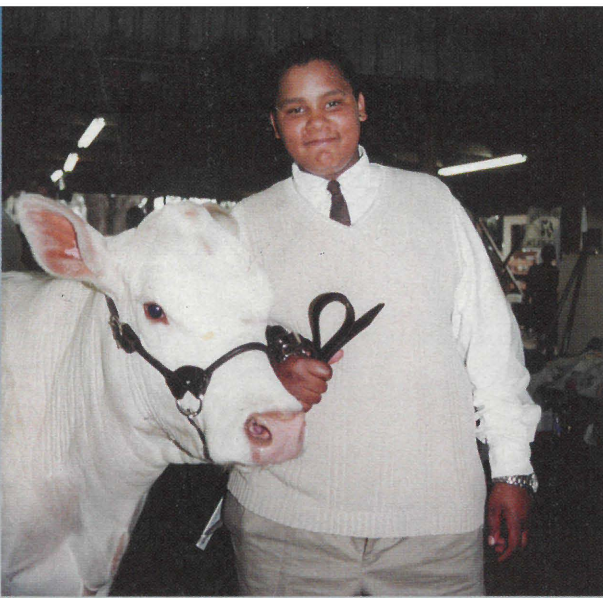

With an apartment, job and school, I will have serious responsibilities and plan to stay far away from any trouble. Then, after two years, I will go to the University of Florida to study animal sciences and then focus on the three additional years it will take to get a degree in Veterinary medicine."

Fortunately for Jeremy, years ago a group of people affiliated with the North Florida Appaloosa Club started a scholarship for a Rancher who wanted to become a Veterinarian. Over the years, this fund has grown and will be earmarked for Jeremy's future education. Remarkably, the Youth Ranches has also been blessed to receive several unrestricted scholarship gifts that will help him with his expenses between now and then.

What a difference the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches has made in the life of this once wayward young man. Because of gifts (past, present and future) from our donor family, Jeremy has achieved and developed into a fine young man. # Siblings Strive to Keep Their Family Together



**A**t 13, Stephen had just been accepted into the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor. He was referred to us from another children's home in central Florida. While exploring the family dynamics, we learned about his sister Mary, age 15.

Their dad passed away when Mary was nine and Steven was only seven. Mom struggled, made some bad choices and soon the children moved in with grandma. After a period of time and attempts to keep them together, Mary went one way, Stephen another – the family really began to disintegrate.

Still, there was contact between the siblings and the ever-present question "Would it be possible to raise them together?"

Nearly 16, Mary already had a taste teenage freedom and was tempted to focus on her own future, leaving Stephen to make it on his own. She had to decide if she wanted to come into the voluntary program and abide by the rules of the Ranch. Mary thought about it long and hard, but knew in her heart she could never leave her little brother and just walk away from what family she had left.

Now, two years later, Mary has just turned 18 and will be the first person in her family to graduate from high school. She plans to attend St. Pete College and

major in Culinary Arts. Ever aware of what she almost lost, Mary holds tight to the dream that one day she and Stephen will own a restaurant together.

Ironically, Stephen does work at a local eatery, but not because he shares his sister's dream. He has a few other things on his mind. Like most typical 16 year olds, Steven wants to save money to buy a GTO muscle car. He likes

working with tools and engines. Stephen thinks a job as a mechanic would be just perfect, as long as it leaves plenty of time to go fishing!

Fishing is a hobby he shares with fellow Rancher Danny. The boys strive to behave and earn the trust of Cottage Parent Mr. Carl so they can do the things they enjoy most. "Mr. Carl is my role model," said Stephen. "When I have bad times, he always there to talk to me...and he really likes taking us fishing!"

Stephen also thinks he might consider being a Cottage Parent, one day. "I've grown up in homes like this. I know what kids go through and I bet I could help them learn how to figure it out and be successful."

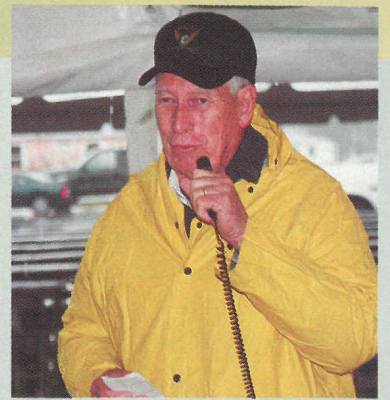

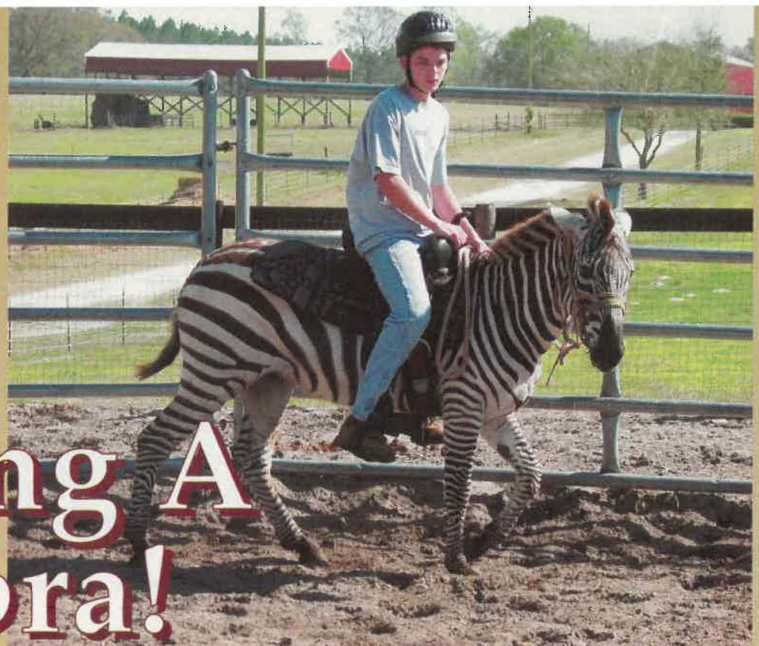
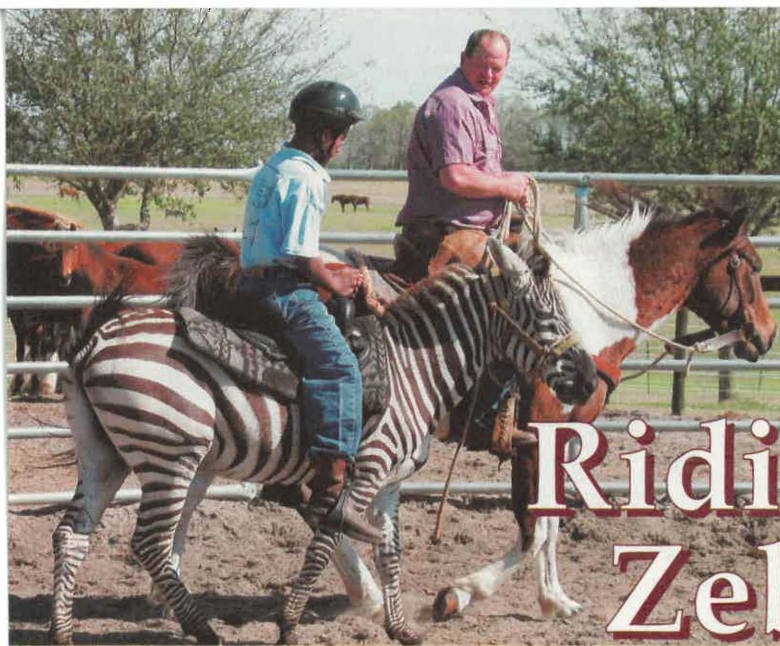

## *A Visit to the Youth Villa*

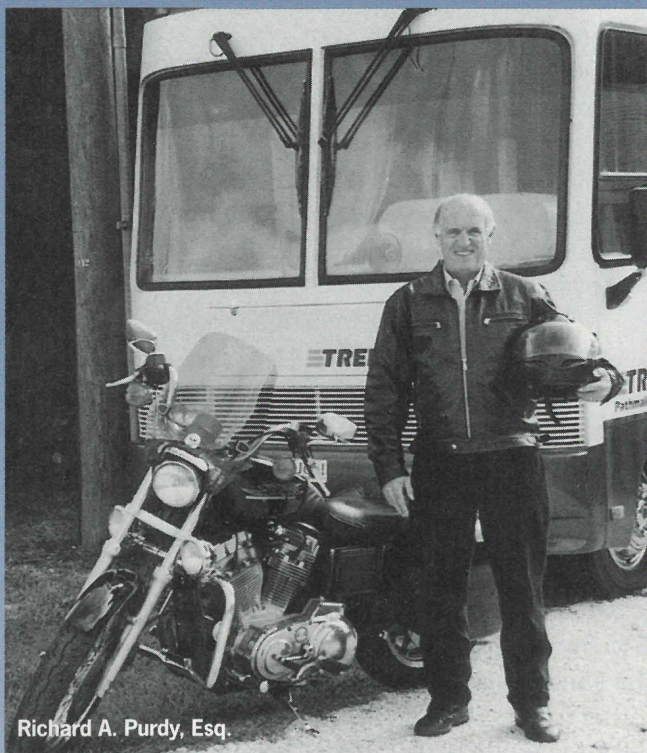

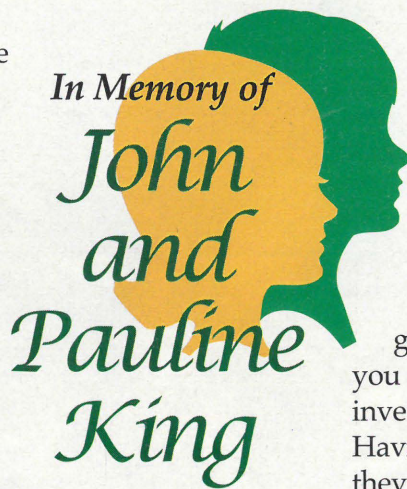

After serving in the military during World War II, John returned to Ohio and married Pauline. While she owned and ran the local beauty salon, he acquired a Nash Rambler franchise and opened an auto repair shop.

Retiring to Florida in the late 70's, the Kings built their own home on five acres of land on Pine Island. Both enjoyed gardening and planting citrus trees. They shared their harvest with many nearby neighbors.

The Kings became involved with the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches in 1986. The relationship developed and their commitment to our children grew. They were particularly pleased with our campus work programs where all youth on campus have a job. John was keenly work oriented. He
