## President's Perspective

The quote, attributed to King Solomon, was written almost 3,000 years ago. It was incorporated in one of Pete Seegers's songs in the 60's and has rung true through the ages. It reminds us that life is made up of seasons and nothing is permanent. It is our job as human beings to recognize these seasons and to flow with them in dignity, productivity and grace.

After 40 years of working with children and 23 years with the Youth Ranches, I have begun working with our Board on a plan for retirement. Although I don't plan on moving on until September 2014, the Board and I have been actively developing a detailed and comprehensive transition plan.

Last August, the Board of Directors selected Mr. Brad Gregory as my replacement and in January of this year, he became Executive Vice President. Brad has been with the Youth Ranches for 20 years, beginning his employment as a Recreation Director at Youth Ranch/Safety Harbor while working on his Masters Degree. He was promoted to Director of the Early Delinquency Intervention Program where his program received the highest honors given by Department of Juvenile Justice.

In 2001, Brad was promoted again as Program Director of the Youth Villa in Bartow. In 2006, he moved to our largest program, the Boys Ranch, as Program Director. Brad holds a B.S. in Criminology from Florida State University as well as an M.S. in Mental Health Counseling from Nova Southeastern University.

In each of his positions, Brad has done an outstanding job and provided leadership and direction for youth and staff.

I can report to you the transition is going well. Brad is spending his time learning the "big picture" view of the Youth Ranches and as we move forward, many of you will have the opportunity to meet him and get to know him better.

There are always mixed feelings when a major change is going on in our lives and I can tell you I certainly have them. Since 1973, my wife and I have worked with children in one way or another. It has been an amazing career and the Youth Ranches staff, Board, Sheriffs and children have become like family. I look forward to the next year and a half as we all prepare for the next phase in Youth Ranches history. I am pleased to see the long history and proud tradition of service to children continue and gain strength in the years to come.

Skipping school, being irresponsible and very disrespectful had been the path of Jamous' young life. By his own definition, he was defiant, immature and his grades were terrible, failing, in fact. Something had to change or he would likely end up in jail or worse.

He was given the chance to come to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch to work on some of these issues and turn his life around. Initially hesitant, Jamous thought about his options at home and decided the Ranch might, just MIGHT, be a place for a fresh start.

Being at the Ranch has changed Jamous. He is especially thankful for his Cottage Parents, Mom and Pop Nathey. "They keep pushing me to do better. I can tell they really care about me. They are very fair and always call me out when they know I am trying to get away with something or slipping back into my old ways. I want to make them proud of me... I want to be proud of me."



Jamous is a fourteen year old freshman who has already received some nice press and is ranked third on the varsity tennis team. He has faced some tough challenges in his young life, but now he is determined to try to do what is right and "find a way to win!"

Jamous has expressed his appreciation for the Boys Ranch and the people who gave him a home. "I see this is a place I needed... a good thing in my life. I was going down the wrong road and I can truly tell any kid coming in 'You will have a better life here. It's not always easy but it is worth it!'"

Now, a year and a half later, Jamous is doing quite well. His GPA is a 3.0 and he is one of the youngest members of the local high school tennis team. "I just love to play tennis. I can hit the ball as hard as I want and get out some of my anger and frustration," he said with determination. Then, softening a bit, he added, "I love the rhythm of the sport. It is a game of control, patience, and rules. There are expected behaviors and standards, just like my life. Every point scored is a win or a loss. You can easily defeat yourself when things go wrong or you can find a way to win!" ★

## Please Meet our “Chosen Child!”

The announcement was the size of a large post card complete with three beautiful color photos. The headline read “Introducing With Great Joy...OUR SON STEVEN JAMES DUFALA.” Most would then expect to see a tiny bundle of joy wrapped in a blue blanket. Not so...instead the simple, satisfied smile of a 16 year old boy with his new family graced the wonderful announcement. Great Joy indeed!

Steven arrived at the Youth Ranch at the tender age of 12. His family was in shambles, torn apart completely and no one was left to care for the boy. No one at all.

During the next three and a half years, Steven found comfort in his Ranch family. He won awards, buckled down in his school work and began to develop an interest in music, specifically the guitar and drums.

Steven’s Guardian Ad Litem/volunteer child advocate, Jean Walder said he needed some permanency in his life. “The Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch is the ‘gold standard’ of care in group homes. Steven was able to stay in one place where he received guidance and love. The model you have (with Cottage Parents, not shift workers) is vital because the same person who tucks them in at night,



wake them up in the morning and is there for them when they get home from school. Steven found a place to grow up, put down roots and develop trust again. I am convinced the pro-

professional caring people at the Ranch helped Steven become ‘adoptable.’”

Steven was featured at the Heart Gallery which promotes emotionally safe ways to explore adoption. ([www.heartgallerykids.org](http://www.heartgallerykids.org)) It was during a Heart Gallery outing to a local music event that he met his future forever family.

The Martins already had one teenaged son at home and a little one-year-old, but after meeting Steven, they immediately knew they would be expanding their family again with their “Chosen Child!” Once the adoption was complete, Steven had a mother, father and two brothers... a real family, a forever home!

Now 17, Steven was asked about his years at the Youth Ranch. “I was a hyper crazy angry young dude! I never ran away because I knew I was safe, but I never thought I was worth being adopted! At the Ranch, I was given the chance to change my behavior and my life. They helped me grow up.... Now, I am Mr. Mellow and can’t wait to teach my little brother how to play the drums!”

You can see the gratefulness in Steven’s eyes. You can hear it in his voice. Most importantly, you see it when he comes back to volunteer at the Ranch.

**A**s a young teenager, Cathy was one of six siblings. With no father in the picture, her mom was stretched beyond limits emotionally, financially and in many other ways. “We simply had very little...if I missed the school bus, I just didn’t go to school. Rules were easily broken because there is only so much a single parent can do,” said Cathy reflectively.

“I was 14 when I came to the Youth Ranch. Before I arrived, I thought it would be more of the same, since there would be nine other girls in the cottage. I quickly learned that was not the case.”

Mom and Pop Orkney were full time parents. Going to school was happening whether you missed the bus or not. “All of a sudden, there were rules, schedules, chores, family dinners and plenty of expectations,” she said as she smiled. “We were praised and rewarded for doing well and we learned valuable lessons from our mistakes.” The four years Cathy lived at the Youth Ranch proved to be the turning point in her life.

She graduated high school with honors and thanks to the Youth Ranches Scholarship program, she has just obtained her Bachelor’s Degree in business from Stetson University. Already, Cathy has achieved more than she ever thought possible. “The

Next you might visit the kitchen, peek inside the pantry, see the daily chore list for each member of the house and hear the youngsters explain living with nine other kids. “Dinner time is pretty busy. Mom and a few helpers are in the kitchen, others are setting the table and everyone is chatting about what happened at school that day.” With that said, the Cottage Mom leaned over, winked and said, “It’s my favorite time of the day!”

Walking down the hall, you will notice the rooms are clean, beds are made, and the kids take pride in telling you they did it themselves. Our guide shares “Everybody has to keep their room clean. 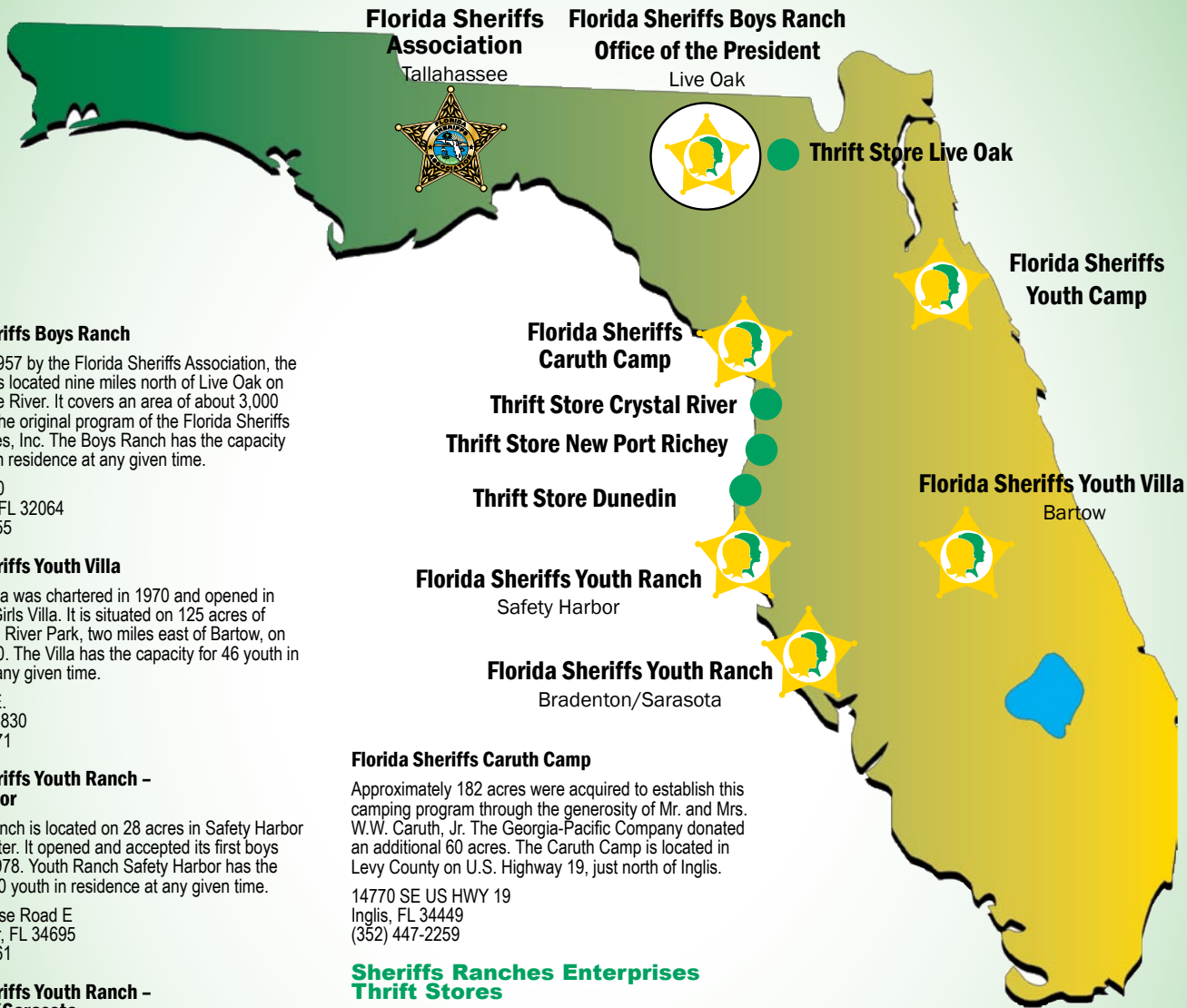

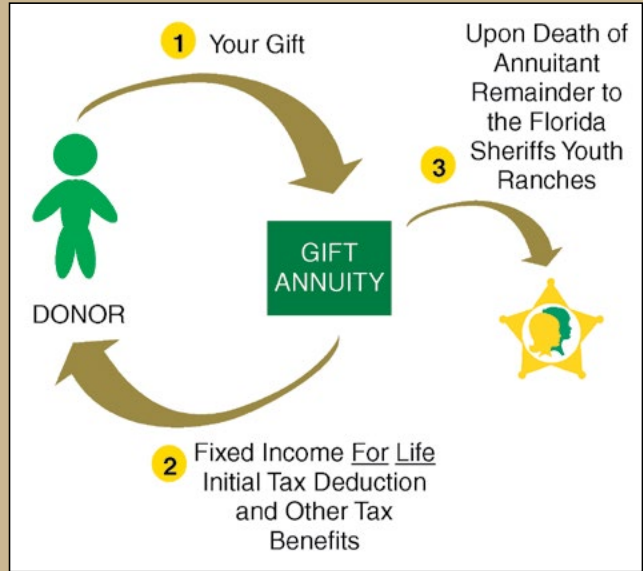

# A Lifelong Commitment

Mr. and Mrs. Friend\* were married in 1943. He was a Marine; she was a secretary. Mr. F joined the US Marshal's service and they relocated to Miami. He eventually served as the United States Marshal for the southern portion of Florida.

In the late 50's, Mr. F attended a conference of the Florida Sheriffs Association and while there, he chipped in 50 cents to help support a "Boys Ranch" in North Florida. He told us he did this just to "appease" a friend at the conference. When he returned home, a local restaurant owner mentioned the Boys Ranch and our donor told him of his "contribution." His buddy immediately challenged him to give at

least \$10 to help those poor kids. Mr. F responded with "I'll do it!" and he wrote out a check to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch for \$10. That began a lifelong commitment of giving lasting 55 years. Even today, Mr. F makes a sizably more generous annual gift to help the children in our care.

When Mr. and Mrs. F relocated to Central Florida, they became more involved with the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa. As they got older, they decided to leave the bulk of their estate, including their home, to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Mr. F lost his beloved wife in 2005 and asked that we hang her incredible "Last

Supper" needlepoint in the Chapel of the Boys Ranch. It was an honor to do so.

Now 94 year old, Mr. F doesn't get out much, but he always makes time to attend the Youth Villa Annual Awards banquet. "You people will get all I have and I am going to keep tabs on you until the end,"

he says with determination. "I made a commitment to see this through and I know my wife would want me to stay involved as long as I possibly can, so I will. When you give someone your word to support them, you do it!"

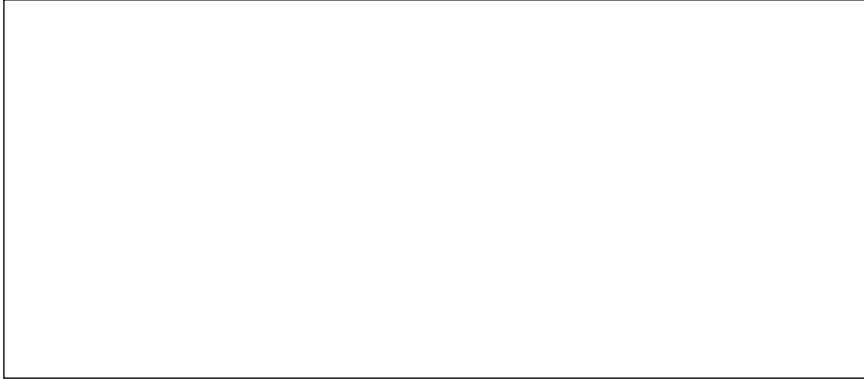
