Law Enforcement Officers are Our Friends!

Imagine it is late at night and there is hammering at the door. You open your eyes and there are blue lights flashing just outside your window. You peek out the bedroom door and see your mom sitting on the couch crying while your dad is being put in handcuffs and taken away by a man in a green uniform.

Now imagine, you are walking home and you see in the distance the neighbor who looks after you when

your mother is at work. He is being put in the back-seat of a Deputy Sheriff's car. You begin to run and scream for the man in a green uniform to let him go, only you are not heard and now watch helplessly as the car drives away.

Today, your best friend was walked out of school by the School Resource Officer who wears the green uniform.

Often the children we serve don't trust the per-

son in the green uniform. They don't know the "why" behind the arrests they observe. Many times our children only hear the anger and the blame, or watch as the tears flow afterwards. The men and women in the uniform become the enemy; the uniform is now the barrier to building relationships with youngsters.

At the Youth Ranches Deputies leave their uniforms at home. They put on shorts and t-shirts and

come to have fun with our boys and girls! We are fortunate to have hundreds of Deputies volunteer at our programs and in summer camp each year. They teach kids how to swim, ride bikes, canoe, play dodgeball and so much more! Deputies teach children how to be safe and what their jobs are all about.

Boys and girls get to know the individual behind the uniform and when the uniform goes back on, they only see Deputies as ordinary people, moms and dads who make their communities safe. These positive interactions make a difference in their home and neighborhoods. Boys and girls learn to trust the man or woman in the green uniform. They know they can go to them when they need help, like when drug dealers try to move into their

A Day in the Life of a Cottage Parent

Majestically welcoming all visitors to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch, the wise old live oak tree illustrates the primary reason for our existence: “Every acorn can become a majestic oak; every boy can become a successful man!”

Offering a positive new day to each of the youngsters in our care is both a privilege and a challenge.

Our Cottage Parents are on the front lines (and sometimes the firing line!) and it is a labor of love. There really is not a “typical day”, so to offer you an idea of the important role we play in the lives of troubled teens, come along and experience a day in the life of a Cottage Parent.

This work is a calling, a ministry and a commitment. We live with the chil-

dren 24/7, with eight days on and then four days off. The keys to success are consistency, fairness, patience and perspective. We seek to create a family friendly, homelike environment that is secure, stable, predictable and encouraging.

The children come to the Ranch with problems and have often been mistreated, neglected, abused

or abandoned. Behind academically, they struggle because of a lack of study, social and life skills. The coping skills they have learned from the “streets” are often unaccepted in the broader society. They are angry at parents, authority figures, peers, themselves and life in general.

The Ranch team offers solutions by working together with parents or guardians, teachers, cottage parents, unit directors, therapists, nurses, clinical director, workplace supervisors, case managers and administrative staff to implement a specific, personalized treatment plan. Our goal is to meet each youngster where they are and show them a more excellent way forward. Utilizing flexibility, adaptability, tenacity and perseverance, we strive together to assist in building a bridge over troubled waters, resting on a solid foundation of character and integrity.

But, we often get asked, what does a Cottage Parent actually do all day? Come along with me to experience one day in a cottage with 10 boys (or girls)!

5:00 AM: My alarm sounds and the morning routine begins. The coffee is made, messages checked and schedule reviewed.

5:40 AM: Boys who attend school in town are awake and begin their morning routine of cleaning their room, getting ready for school, doing chores and



occasionally, cramming for tests. They eat breakfast, we do group devotions and they pack their back pack. The telephone is already beginning to ring.

6:30 AM: Town school boys head for the bus. Those who attend the school on campus wake up, check in, clean their rooms, get

dressed and do their chores.

7:00 AM: Breakfast is served as problems are solved, issues and questions are answered. Morning devotions are held, encouragement and daily motivation echoes through the house.

7:45 AM: All boys are out the door and off to school. On the way, we empty the



daily trash.

8:15 AM: ALL RIGHT!! Boys at school....time to relax, enjoy the morning and do nothing until they get out of school, right?? NOT REALLY!!

8:30-9:30 AM: Daily reports and meetings with the Unit Director and Therapist to discuss the previous day. Discuss problem solving and conflict management issues.

9:30 AM: Back at the Cottage...Room inspections, check chores, etc.

10:30 AM: Time for training, various other meetings or supply runs. Some days, we may go as far as 100 miles with a child who

needs to see a medical specialist not available locally.

12:00 PM: LUNCH TIME!!

Noon until 2:00 PM it is QUIET Time at the cottage. No phone calls, visits or other disturbances.....NOT REALLY!!! Like most kids, some call or return to the cottage for books, papers, gym shorts, projects, etc.

2:30 PM: Boys from the school on campus return home and MUST have an afternoon snack! Then they are off to their work sites on the Ranch. Some boys work cottage crew and afternoon work projects often require supervision.

3:00 PM: Boys participat-

ing in sports, music lessons or other activities are dropped off in town. We also work with the kids on grocery shopping, clothes shopping, balancing the checkbook and budgeting, planning home visits, meeting with guidance counselors or therapists and writing thank you cards.

3:45 PM: The local school bus arrives at the Ranch. These boys MUST have a snack before they go to their work sites. The Clinical Director calls about a boy who has a Treatment Plan Review or therapy session.

4:30 PM: Another Town run to pick up everyone who has

been dropped off at schools, Thrift Store, work, music lessons, etc.

5:30 PM: Family dinner together at the cottage around the dinner table. This is time to catch up, tell stories and discuss pressing issues.

6:00 PM: Evening chores, laundry, phone night and two hours of FREE TIME... if "BOB" (Based on Behavior) says it is Okay! Otherwise, all consequences must be done before any free time. The boys may go to the gym, pool, bowling,

their snack. There are usually many unique and interesting discussions each evening near bedtime.

9:00 PM: All Ranchers to their rooms, with lights out at 9:30. Only now do the boys remember they need sunglasses, a book, a shirt for tomorrow or any other excuse to come out of their rooms. One warning, then everything gets relatively quiet.

10:00 PM: Cottage parents start on required paperwork, review schedules and appointments for the next

for recent pictures of our grandchildren and the latest from friends. Then this schedule repeats itself for seven more days in a row.

During our first week "on our own" in a cottage, we heard glass breaking in one of the boys rooms. He hit the window with his fist in anger. An experienced Cottage Pop came over, walked into the room, began to pick up the glass as he calmed the boy down and put some cardboard over the window. He later told me, "If each boy goes to bed at night

with ten fingers and ten toes, you have done a great job!" That put things in perspective and has really helped me over the years.

We know our every word may have an impact on a young man's life. This snap shot of the ever-changing days on the Ranch is meant to honor the commitment and dedication of each and every Cottage Parent, past and future. They may never know (on

this side of eternity) the vital and important work they do every day!! ★

Spring is in the Air!

At the Boys Ranch in Live Oak, spring always means preparing for the heifer show at the county fair. Each year, after Christmas, a group of eager young men go out to the Van Ness farm. They walk among the calves and each pick one to work with for the next four months. They have to make friends with their heifer. The animals must be halter broke. This means they will wear a halter and walk on a lead with a young man. It takes a seriously determined young man to complete this project.

Each year around fifteen boys start the program. They work with cows that have been roaming the fields and not used to human hands and halters. After bumps, bruises and scrapes acquired from training

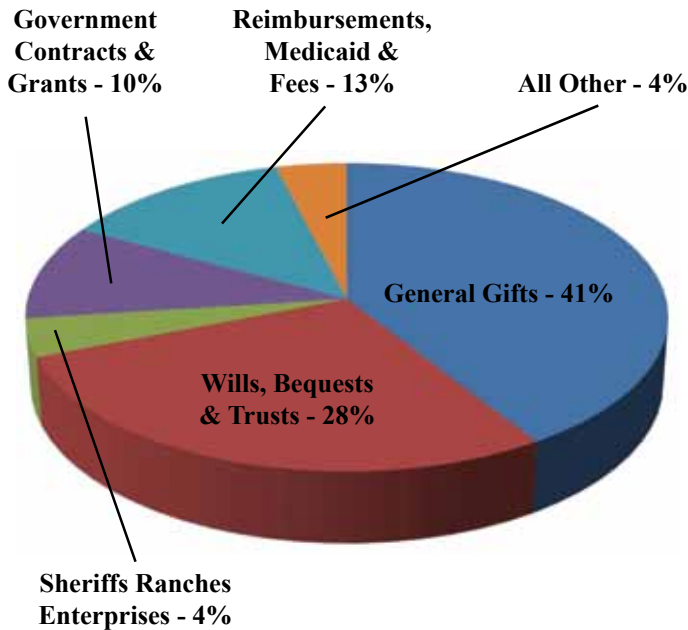

the cows just a handful of dedicated youngsters remain in the program. The boys have an opportunity to exercise patience and determination as they work with their cows. Part of the program includes knowing details about breeding and raising of cattle, what a good specimen looks like and how to show a cow. The heifers the boys showed this year are a Braford/Longhorn blend. They were sired by bulls donated a few years ago by Adams Ranch. This spring the Adams' donated two more bulls to accompany their earlier donation. With these strong sires we expect our herd to continue to grow and provide teaching opportunities, income and meat for our campuses. ★

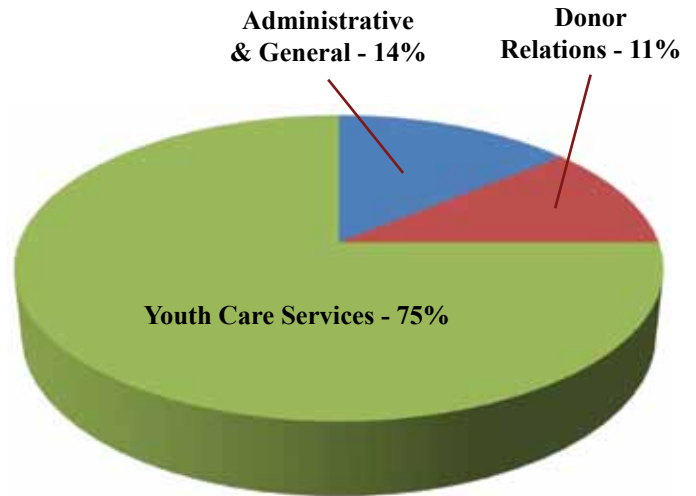

Negative adjustments to real estate values of \$573,817 were offset by investment income of \$689,539 and realized and unrealized gains of \$2,977,983 resulting in a net gain on investments of \$3,093,705. Most of this gain occurred in Restricted Funds, and is not available for operating expenses.

This report is a summary of our financial activity for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2013. A complete audit prepared by Purvis Gray & Company, Certified Public Accountants, Gainesville, Florida is also available. The audit was conducted in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America.

Harmony in the Streets® is a mobile camping program that brings the four “R’s” to your neighborhood. Our staff and law officer volunteers teach children to Respect Themselves, Respect Others, Respect their Community and Respect the Environment. Harmony in the Streets brings this unique service directly into local communities which may be socially and/or economically challenged.

Harmony in the Schools is much like our Harmony in the Streets mobile camping program in that it brings the leadership, cultural understanding and team building skills directly into the schools. It encourages building relation-

ships between students and peers, as well as with school staff.

Summer Camp includes many different therapeutic camping activities. Canoeing, archery, swimming and other activities allow youth the opportunity to build basic teamwork and peer communication skills. Additionally, deserving boys and girls spend a week enjoying the beautiful, tranquil outdoor environment.

Our camps also provide centralized locations for additional leadership training and educational opportunities for our children in residential care.

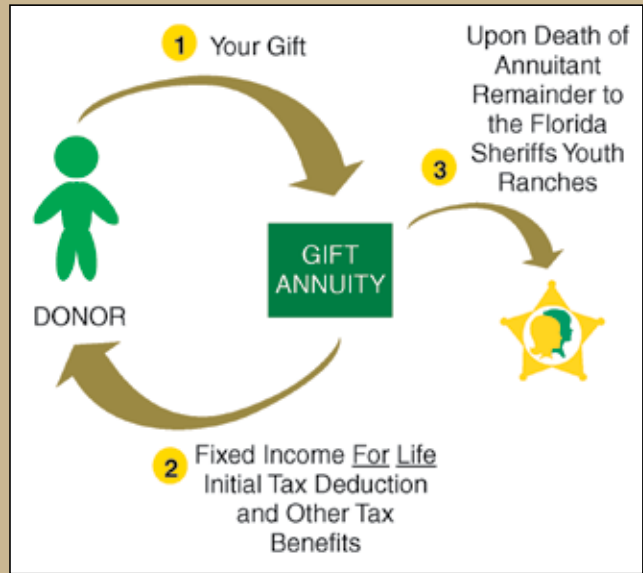

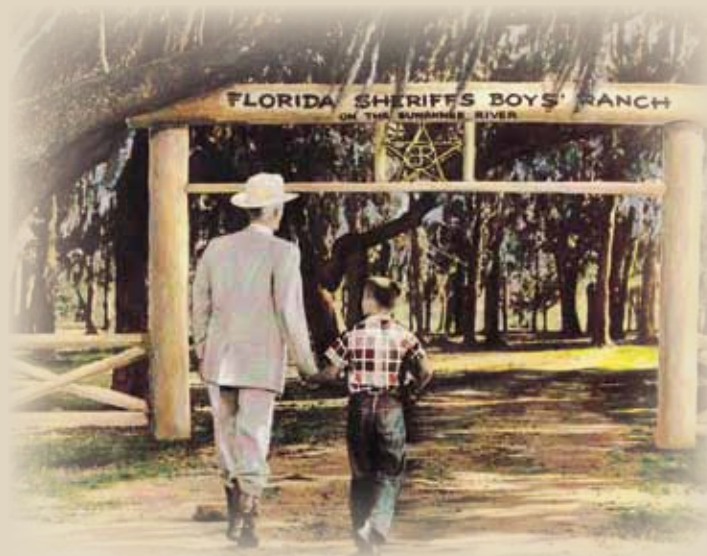

Family Legacies Come in Many Forms

Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some chose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association

- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch
- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

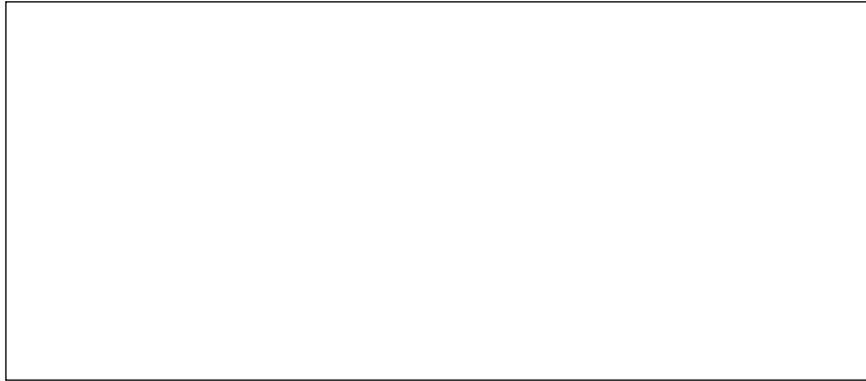
