# President's Perspective

On my office wall for many years hung a framed poster depicting a curved blacktop road sprinkled with leaves in varying colors from the large maple, hickory and red-oak trees that lined the roadway. The quote at the bottom of the poster was the one above. I must admit that I truly love fall — there is nothing more beautiful than seeing nature’s colorful display as leaves change, especially on a bright, crisp fall day.

However, even the bright colors of fall simply do not compare to the bright smiles, echoes of laughter and joyous voices of singing children. These are what I cherish the most, especially on a summer’s day as children participate in one of our camping programs.

Since 1983, the Youth Ranches have been providing summer camp programs to needy, impoverished and, at times, abused children from all over Florida. As a former summer camp director, I have seen firsthand what it means to a child to attend one of our camps. I have watched children come out of their shells, get excited, laugh, sing, get involved and build relationships that will last a lifetime. For the first time in many of their lives, it is an opportunity to establish a positive relationship with an adult and a law enforcement officer. Instead of running away when seeing a Deputy Sheriff, they begin to run to them, knowing that they have someone in that uniform who truly cares.

I remember all too well when a little girl of 11 pulled back on her bow during archery class and let loose an arrow that struck a bull’s eye. As others yelled “Way to go,” the little girl dropped her bow, placed her hands to her mouth and stared in amazement. The tears flowed down her small cheeks and she began to laugh with excitement. During awards night, she received the “Best Archer” award.

# It's All About Attitude

**K**aleb is very matter of fact about the heifer program: "It is hard work." Each year, a large group of young men spends the winter working with heifers after our cows have spent the summer and fall grazing in the fields. Once they are rounded up, the boys chose one to work with through the winter to prepare for the fair. The goal is to be able to lead the heifer on a line and talk intelligently about breeding and cattle in general.

We have an active ranch program due to the life lessons that can be learned through working with animals. They teach us so much! We all know how much attitude can impact our lives.

"I started the heifer program the first year I came to the Boys Ranch, and I quit," Kaleb recalled. "My heifer had a bad attitude. I didn't have the right attitude, either."

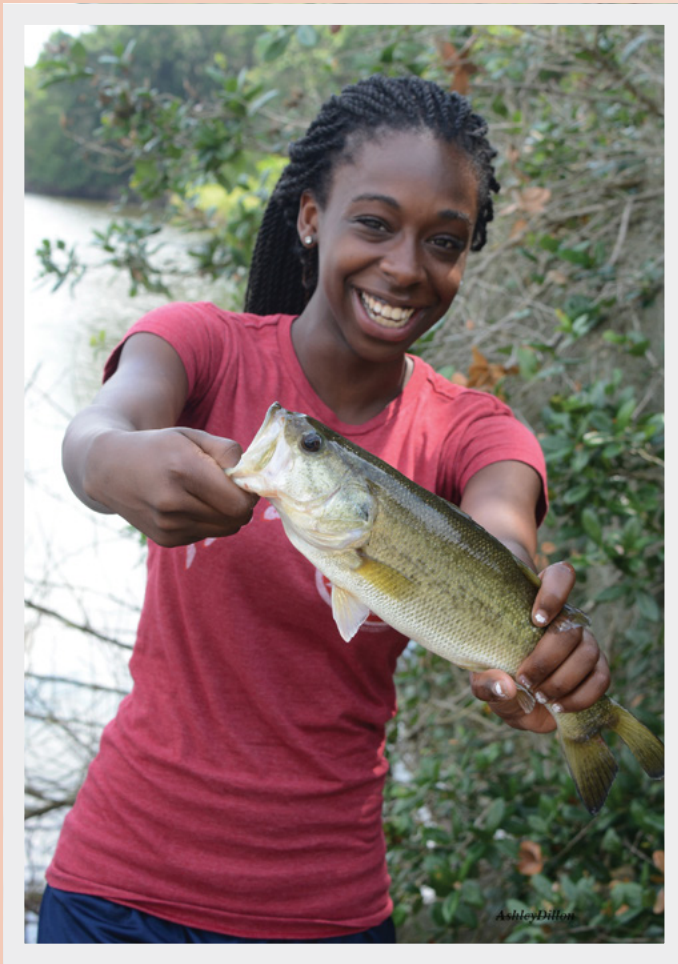

# Changes Lives One at a Time

**H**ave you ever been called a name, been made fun of, been laughed at because you stuttered or had a birthmark, an overbite or big ears? You aren't alone. **Here is Freddy's story about how summer camp changed his life.**

**Freddy was laughed at and kids called him "Fat Freddy."** He had issues with his weight, self-esteem, self-confidence and social awkwardness. Then his family learned about the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches summer camp. Freddy said he would like to come but, as the summer camp date approached, he got scared.

Who could blame him? **He had experienced enough cruelty at school and in his community as the victim of jokes and name-calling.** Now he was going to meet new kids. Like many young boys and girls facing a new environment, Freddy was scared that he might not be liked.

When he got to camp, Freddy found all the kids had something in common – they were all broken. For some, it was poverty; for others, abuse, neglect and abandonment; for some, it was awkwardness in social situations. Many



had been bullied and some were simply different. I watched as Freddy began laughing

and participating in all of the activities.

Even with the challenge of his weight, we saw his self-esteem, self-confidence and interactions with others improve significantly. **Because of his gentle and friendly nature, Freddy was one of the most-liked kids in the group.**

His grandparents cried over his transformation. He was no longer a frightened boy who felt unwanted, but now was a happy boy full of delight who knew he actually belonged.

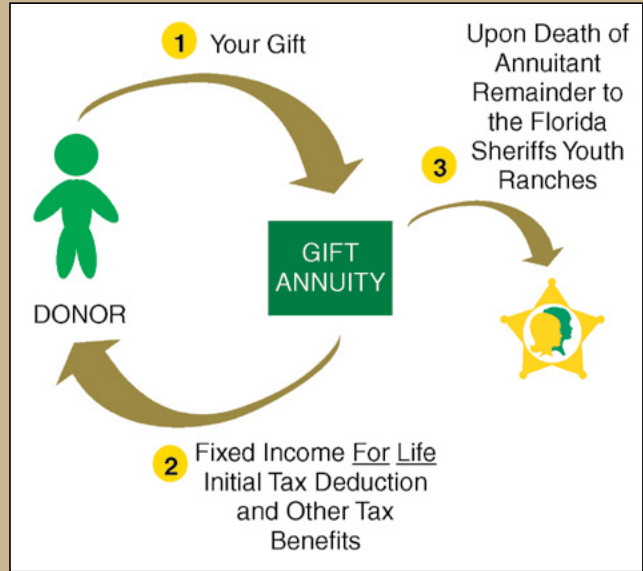

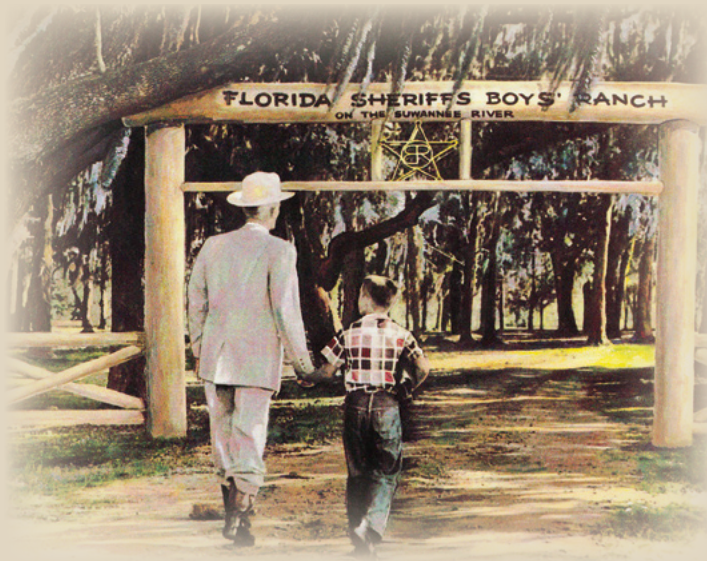

# Family Legacies Come in Many Forms



Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some choose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association

- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch
- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

These are just a few options to consider. As always, we encourage you to discuss this with your personal attorney or advisors to chart the best course for your future and remember to update your will annually as things and people in your life change!

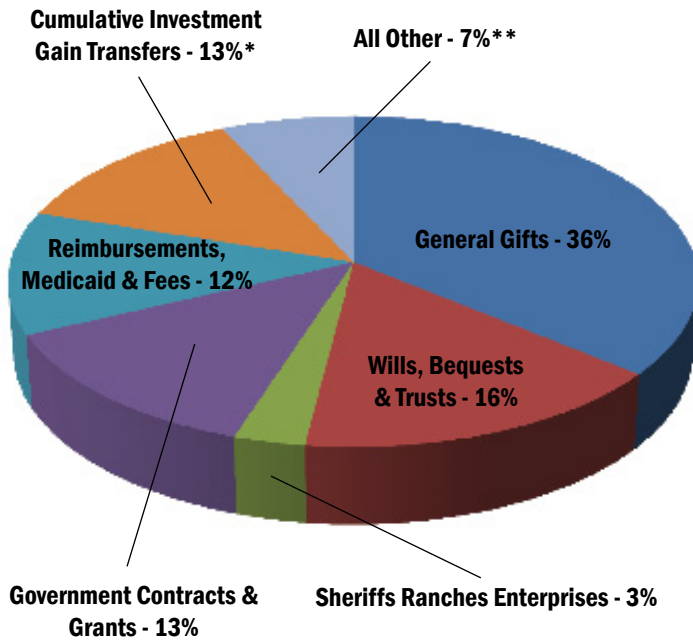

## Expenditures 2013 - 2014

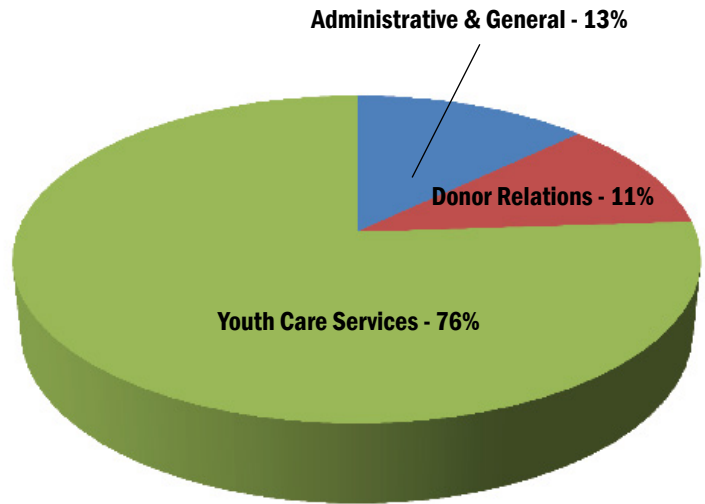

## Camping Services

**Harmony in the Streets®** is a mobile camping program that brings the four “R’s” directly into local communities which may be socially and/or economically challenged. Our staff and law officer volunteers teach children to Respect Themselves, Respect Others, Respect their Community and Respect the Environment.

**Harmony in the Schools** is much like our Harmony in the Streets mobile camping program in that it brings the leadership, cultural understanding and team building skills directly into the schools. It encourages building relationships between students and peers, as well as with school staff.

**Summer Camp** includes many different therapeutic camping activities. Canoeing, archery, swimming, arts and crafts and other activities allow youth the opportunity to build basic teamwork and peer communication skills. Additionally, deserving boys and girls spend a week enjoying the beautiful, tranquil outdoor environment.

Our camps also provide centralized locations for additional leadership training and educational opportunities for our children in residential care.

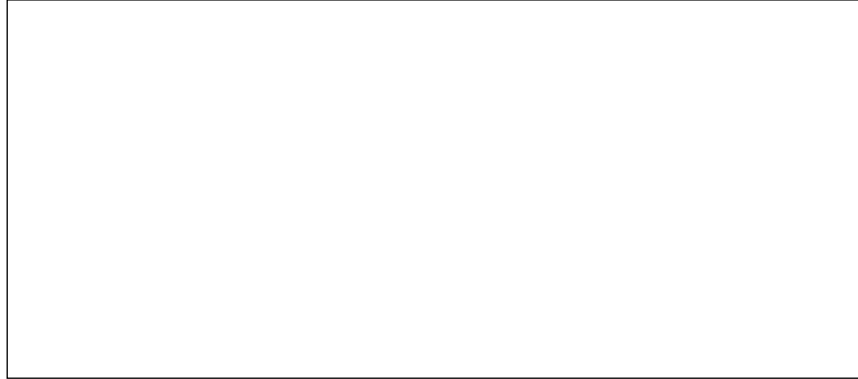
