Although past generations made it possible for 50 years of children to get the help they needed, this generation of Sheriffs, donors and staff are responsible for making the Youth Ranches healthy and sound for future children. As we celebrate our 50th anniversary, let's all work together to make certain no child is turned away because of a lack of beds, funds or staff to care for them. Together, we can make sure the Youth Ranches remains a lighthouse in a stormy sea for Florida's youth.

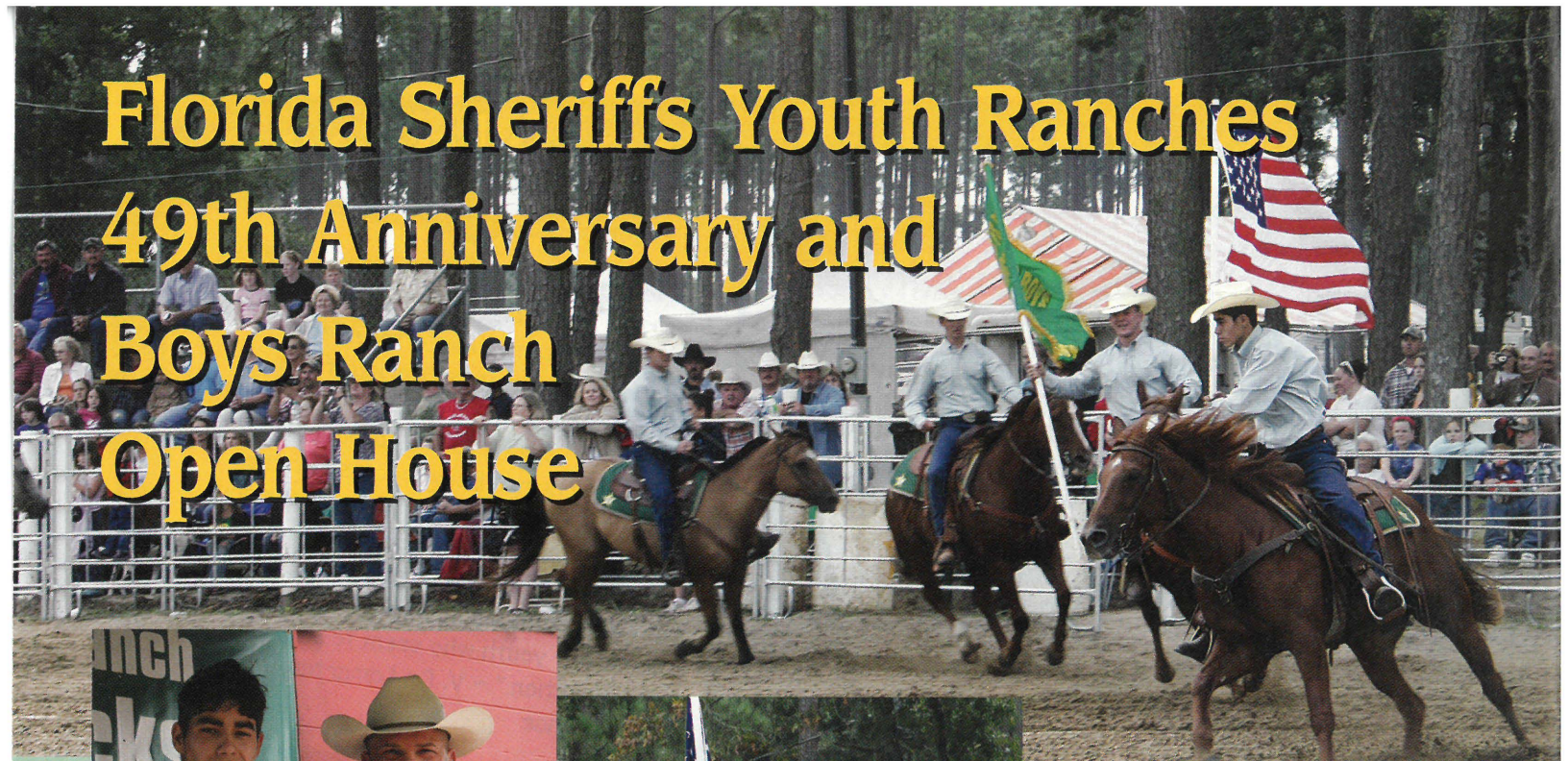

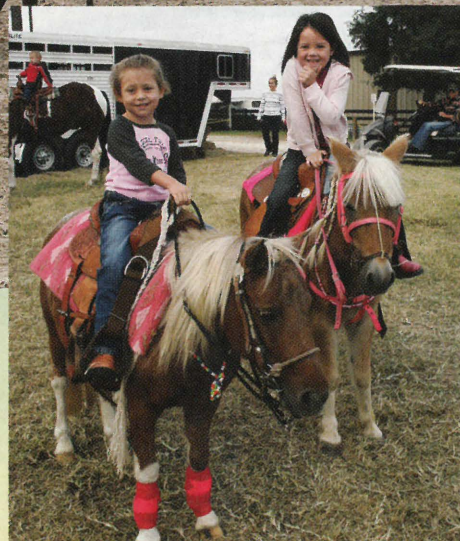

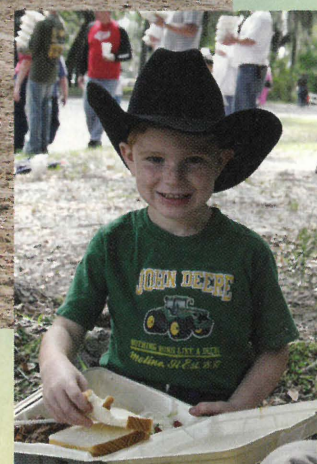

Jim Strayer is known as the Architect of the programs and services offered by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. Jim spent countless hours designing, developing, training and implementing the standards of care we use today.

In 1965, Jim began his career with the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch as our first Social Worker. Later, he worked as Director of Ranch Life, Resident Director and Director of Program Development. He finished his full-time career with the Youth Ranches serving as Assistant Executive Director and Vice President of Youth Services.

On a state and national level, Jim was very active in the Florida Group Child Care Association, Southeast Child Care Association, National Association of Homes and Services for Children and the Council on Accreditation. In 2002, he was

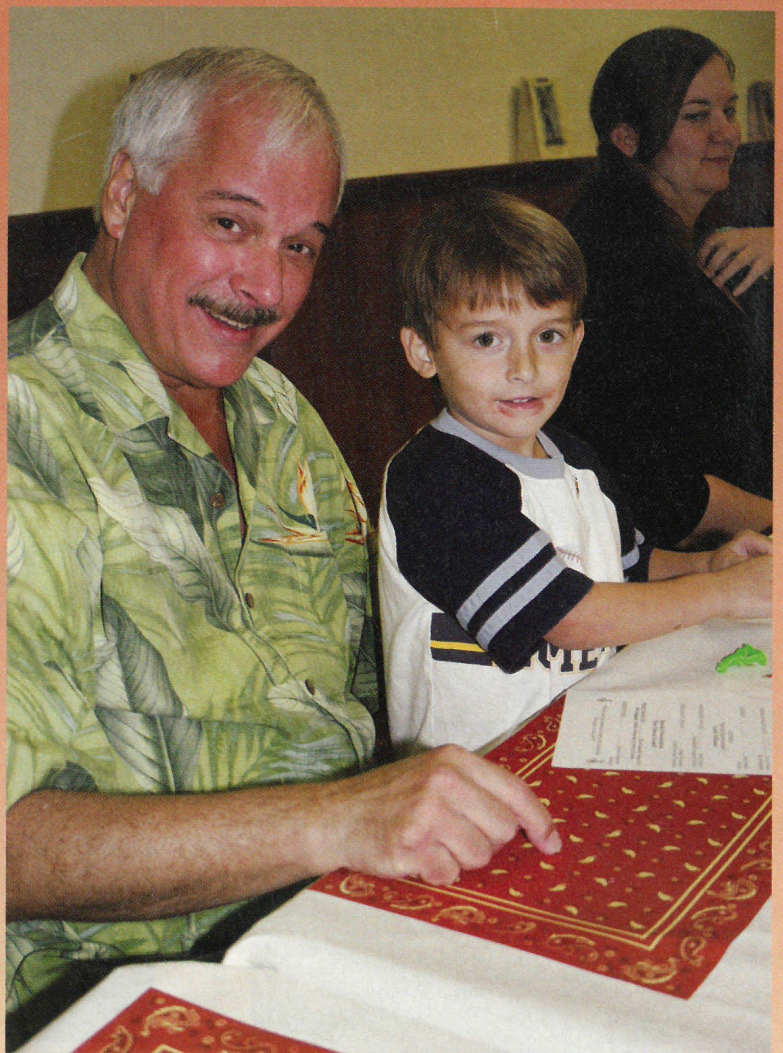

Our Friend Award

Jimmy and Sue Lamb

The OUR FRIEND award is the highest honor given by the Boys Ranch Alumni Association. The recipients become members of a very exclusive group of people who have given outstanding support to the boys in our care. It is not driven by money, power or influence. It is earned by having a genuine heart for children and selflessly reaching out to serve faithfully.

This year, the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch Alumni Association selected Jimmy and Sue Lamb for this prestigious and meaningful recognition. In the 1960's, Jimmy Lamb was the Boys Ranch Farm Manager. He formally started the Boys Ranch Riding Rancher club and took the boys to horse shows throughout the state. When people saw the boys' behavior, knowledge and respect at these shows, they became more interested in supporting the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. Eventually, these relationships led to building the Clay Mavericks Riding Arena and the horse show tradition we now celebrate during open house.

One Alumnus conveyed his thoughts indicating that before he met Mr. Jimmy, he had never achieved anything that made him proud. Then, after a year in the riding program, a picture was taken of the boys on the horses and all the award-winning ribbons were tacked to a sheet of plywood. That sense of pride and accomplishment was something he will never forget.

Sue Lamb, Jimmy's wife, also made a significant impact on the Boys Ranch and Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. When Jimmy served as the Farm Manager, their family lived at the Ranch. Sue learned many stories about the boys and why they were here. She kept those thoughts close to her heart, and years later, conveyed them as the writer for THE RANCHER magazine. To this day, her eloquent words and compassionate thoughts resound in the history of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Alumnus Makes \$50,000 Gift to Celebrate the Start of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches 50th Anniversary

Len Russek was only 12 years old when he arrived as one of the first two boys enrolled at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. Life had not been easy and he longed for a chance to improve his circumstances.

Len recently reminisced about those early years... "Boys learned by doing...and back then, we did everything! Pop would gather us up, teach us how to do something, then, assign a job to each boy. Every day, after school, we had chores to do. Pop taught us about farming, animals and life, leaving Mom to teach us about manners and social graces."

What worked then, still works today! The Youth Ranches still embraces a basic philosophy of "work, study, play and pray" to help keep boys and girls away from a life of delinquency and crime.

Now, nearly 50 years later, Len Russek is a Certified Public

Boys Ranch Alumnus Len Russek knew that several people played a key role in establishing the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch. J. L. McMullen was a local community leader who welcomed the idea of a home where boys can receive love, guidance, a good education and a strong work ethic. Sadly, it was the tragic death of Mr. McMullen's young son, Michael Gerald "Gere" McMullen (February 1, 1938 ~ March 28, 1945) that motivated him to get actively involved and help bring the Boys Ranch to Live Oak.

Because of his leadership and service as one of the original members of the Boys Ranch Board of Trustees, Len Russek has decided to



create the J.L McMullen Honorary Endowment fund. The main gift establishing this fund will forever remain in perpetuity and only the interest earned will be used to further the work of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

Accountant who runs several successful businesses. He has served on the Youth Ranches Board of Directors for many years and recently decided it was time to give back in another significant way.

In honor of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches 50th Anniversary, Boys Ranch Alumnus Len Russek made a \$50,000 gift to establish three new Honorary Endowment Funds and add to the existing funds honoring Hillsborough County Sheriff R. Ed Blackburn, Florida Sheriffs Association Executive Director Carl Stauffer, Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches President Emeritus Harry K. Weaver, Pinellas County Sheriff Don Genung and retired Florida Sheriffs Association Executive Director J. M. "Buddy" Phillips. These funds will be wisely invested and the interest used to further the charitable work of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

"I would not be where I am today if not for my years at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches," said Len Russek. "It is time to give back!"

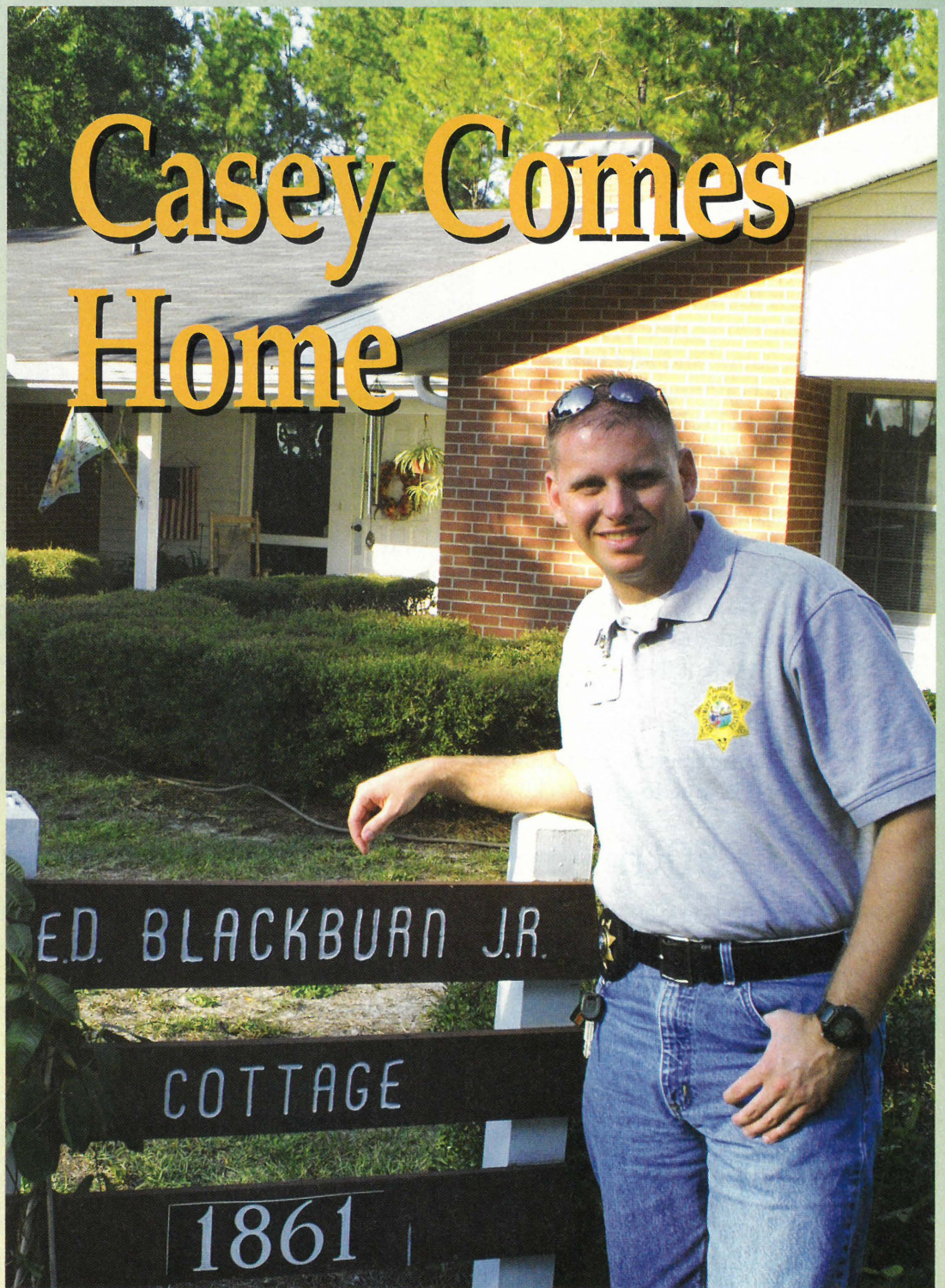


As he approached the entrance to the Boys Ranch his heart beat faster and faster. He had not been back to visit since he left in 1995. Casey suddenly felt peaceful as he drove through the archway. He was home.

In 1994 life was difficult for Casey. He was having problems in school and his mother was getting frustrated. In addition to educational issues Casey and his mom were not communicating well. Casey and his mom needed help and they found it at the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch.

Casey enjoyed Ranch life. He was getting the extra help he needed in school. His cottage parents, the Davis', taught him responsibility and determination. Working on the farm after school was hard, but it reinforced the lessons he learned everywhere else on the Ranch.

Casey found the life lessons he learned at the Ranch very valuable. "I was given a firm foundation while living at the Ranch," says Casey. Today, he is a certified Law Enforcement Officer. He works with troubled children in a high security detention facility. "I know if the kids I work with had found the Ranch earlier in their lives they would



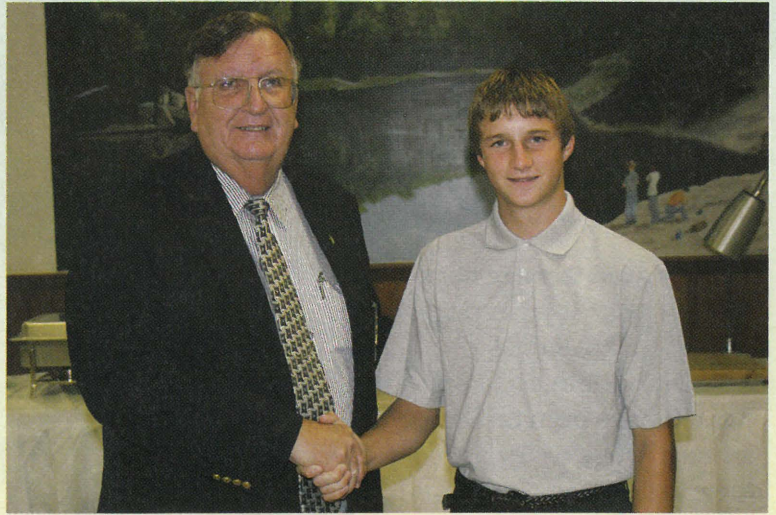
not be in detention now," Casey remarks. He is continuing his education in Juvenile Justice. Casey's goal is to help prevent juvenile delinquency by intervening in troubled children's lives like someone once did for him.

Boys Ranch Wins Award for Conservation

In 1957, the Sheriffs of Florida founded the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch as a place for abused, neglected and dependent boys to grow up and become productive law-abiding men. Beginning with a mere \$5,000 and 120 acres of land on the Suwannee River, they built a working farm where boys could learn to "work, study, play and pray."

Now, nearly 50 year later, the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch consists of over 3,000 acres of planted pines, pasture land and residential cottages that serve as home for so many deserving boys.

At the Van Ness Farm, the boys help care for cattle, horses, goats, peacocks, chickens and a variety of other animals. The farm embraces a sustainable agricultural program producing hay and timber, along with other agricultural products. The Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch tree farm is also a recognized member of the Florida Stewardship program.



Recently, the Southeast Agricultural Coalition recognized the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch for the work they do in agriculture and with the young men at the Ranch by naming the Boys Ranch as the Best Conservation Farm for 2006. Ecologically, 378 acres of the Ranch's riverfront land is protected through a conservation easement to preserve this special part of the Suwannee River.

While the Boys Ranch produces agricultural products, the primary concern of the Ranch is to grow young men. Using hard work, personal responsibility, success and sometimes failure, faith and love, the Ranch teaches young men life skills they will need to succeed in the future.

Creating Family Memories

Raising ten teenage boys is no easy task. It takes patience, love and a great deal of creativity. Mom and Pop Barnett have been on the job for nearly five years...and there is no place they would rather be than with "their" boys.

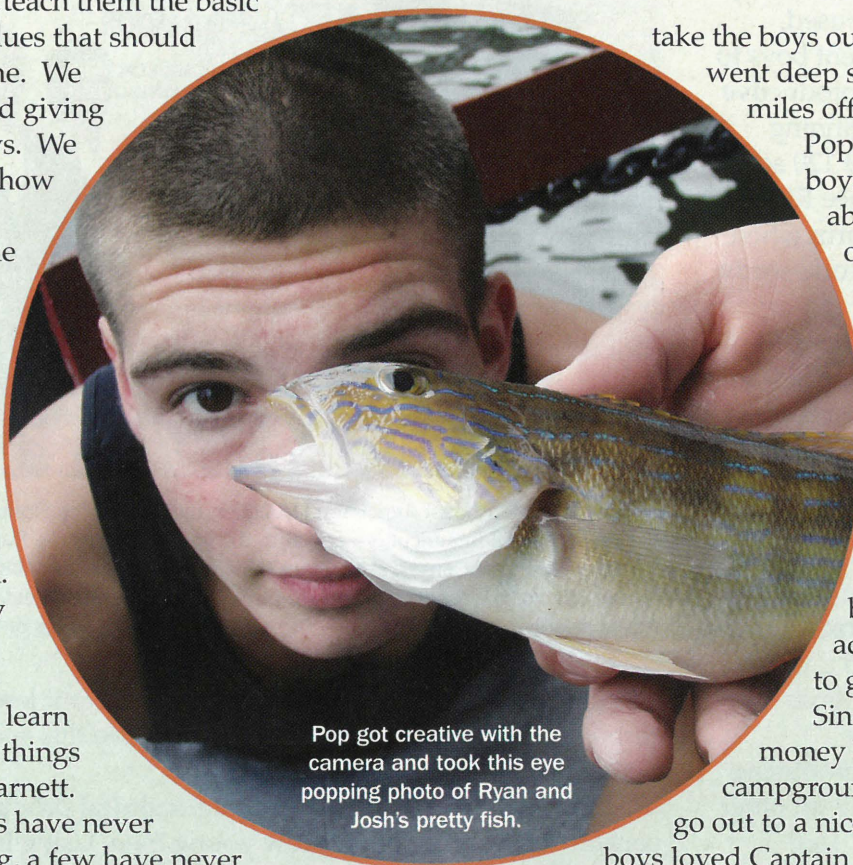
Pop Barnett understands much of what is missing in these boys' lives. He was given up for adoption as a child and never really had any sense of family until he met and married Mom Barnett. "We just raise these boys as our 'own' ...teach them the basic morals and daily values that should be taught in the home. We believe in getting and giving respect with our boys. We want them to know how to raise a family properly, and become good husbands and fathers in the future. We just treat them like family!"

Once a year, like most American families, the Barnetts' plan a little family vacation. "We save our money and try to take the boys some place different so they can learn and experience new things in life," said Mom Barnett.

Some of these boys have never been deep sea fishing, a few have never even caught a fish, so the Barnett's decided to go to Panama City Beach for a long weekend. The Bay County Sheriffs Office helped them get tickets to

take the boys out on a big boat and went deep sea fishing about 15 miles offshore.

Pop was so proud of his boys. "There were also about 45 senior citizens on board for the trip. My boys jumped right in like a bunch of rookie "first mates" and helped bait the hooks or untangle the lines. One man caught a shark...the boys waited until he brought it near then added the extra muscle to get it in the boat!"

Since the family saved money by staying in a local campground, they decided to go out to a nice place to eat. The boys loved Captain Anderson's restaurant where they gained experience in ordering "off a menu" and using their table manners.

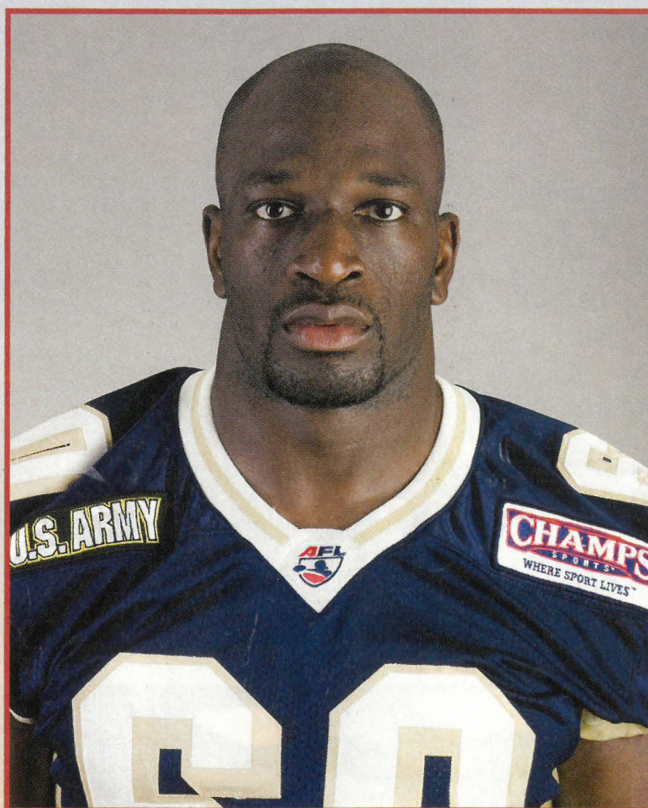
Josh and Ryan give an inquisitive look to the odd underwater creature carrying a camera.

I want to teach these kids the importance of doing well in school and prepare them to compete at a higher level, both academically and athletically."

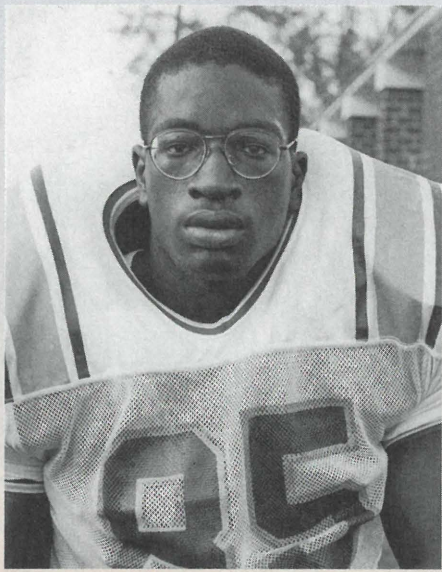

"I am very grateful to the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches for the

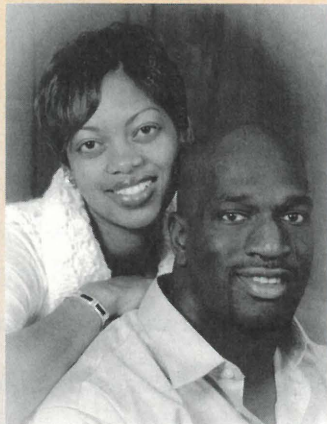


As a young player at Suwannee High, Thad was serious about becoming a professional football player.

Many donors who own their IRA are grateful for this new opportunity to fulfill their intentions to help a charity through a significant distribution (in any amount up to \$100,000 per year) directly from their IRA.
