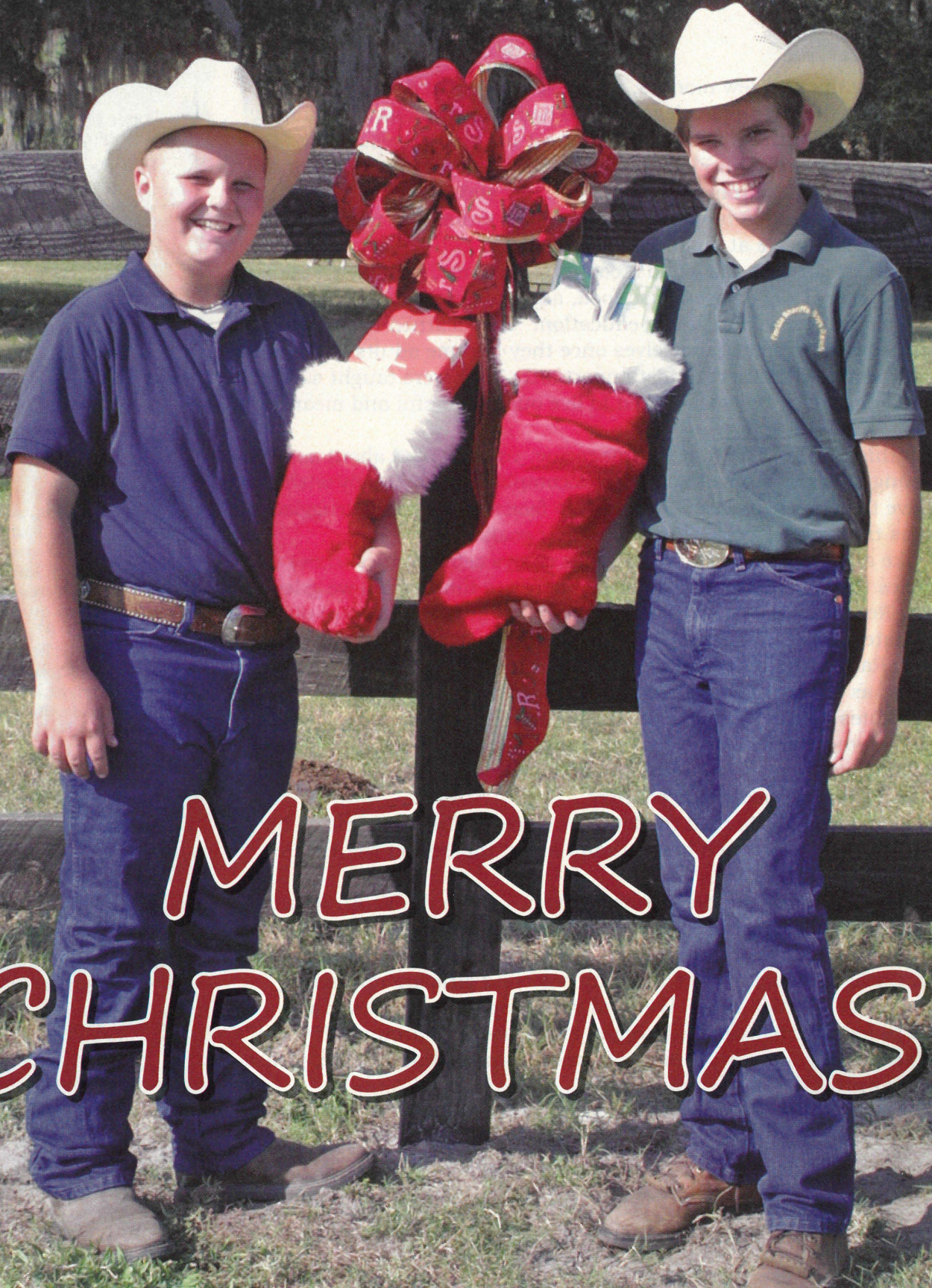




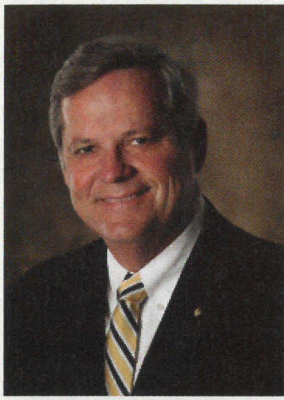

President's Perspective

During the past few months, I have spent a great deal of time thinking about the young people who have had their lives so dramatically impacted by the Youth Ranches. Although we are sometimes referred to as "The Best Kept Secret in Florida," the Youth Ranches has cared for over 112,000 boys and girls from every county in our state. Day in, day out, for 53 years, we have been a haven for children who either had no home, or who were unable to live at home.

While in our care, they had a comfortable home, with loving staff to care for them. They enjoyed good food, adequate clothing, medical and dental care, and received a quality education. They learned the skills necessary to help support themselves once they became adults and learned how to get along with others. Most importantly, they were taught solid values and character traits they need to live out successful and meaningful lives.

In this issue of The Rancher magazine, you will read about some of these young men and women and their accomplishments. I only wish you could have the chance to meet them face to face and hear the struggles and challenges they have overcome to reach their goals.

Like any family, the Youth Ranches enjoys celebrating success and joyful times together. Also, like a family, there are times when we grieve together. Recently, our Youth Ranches family mourned the loss of one of our graduates. Lance Corporal Nathaniel Schultz spent a year and a half at our Youth Ranch in Safety Harbor. He distinguished himself with awards and honors as a leader in that program. Following his dream of becoming a United States Marine, Nate completed his training and was deployed to Afghanistan where he tragically lost his life to a roadside bomb. Although we are saddened by the loss of this young life, we are so proud of the man he was and of his service to our country.

I would ask you to read the letter on page 13 that was written by Nate's sister. She tells much better than I about the impact the Youth Ranches had on Nate's life.

If you have ever wondered whether your gifts to the Youth Ranches make a difference, this letter should give you encouragement to continue your support. Because of the economy, we have closed five of our eighteen cottages, which means that fifty boys and girls are not having the opportunity afforded Nate. We need your help more than ever as we continue to help young men and women turn their lives around. 53rd Anniversary and Boys Ranch Open House

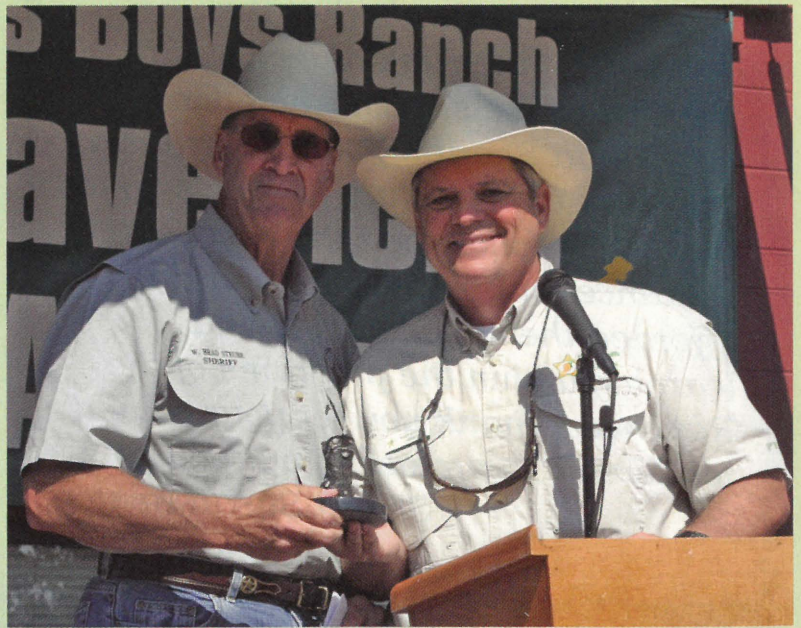


Riding Ranchers love to pose for photos wearing their Open House western clothes.

Bright sunshine and cool breezes welcomed over 2,000 people and nearly 850 horses as the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches celebrated our 53rd Anniversary with our annual Horse Show and Open House. Families and friends gathered with several of Florida's Sheriffs who marked this very special occasion with an incredibly generous gift of a \$190,962 check from the Florida Sheriffs Association.

The festivities continued with the Grand Entry Horse Parade led by Grand Marshal Manatee County Sheriff W. Brad Steube who began his career in law enforcement in 1976 with the Longboat Key Police Department, where he was named Police Officer of the Year. In 1978, he joined the Manatee County Sheriff's Office where he has held the rank of Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain, Major and Colonel. In April of 2007, the Governor appointed him

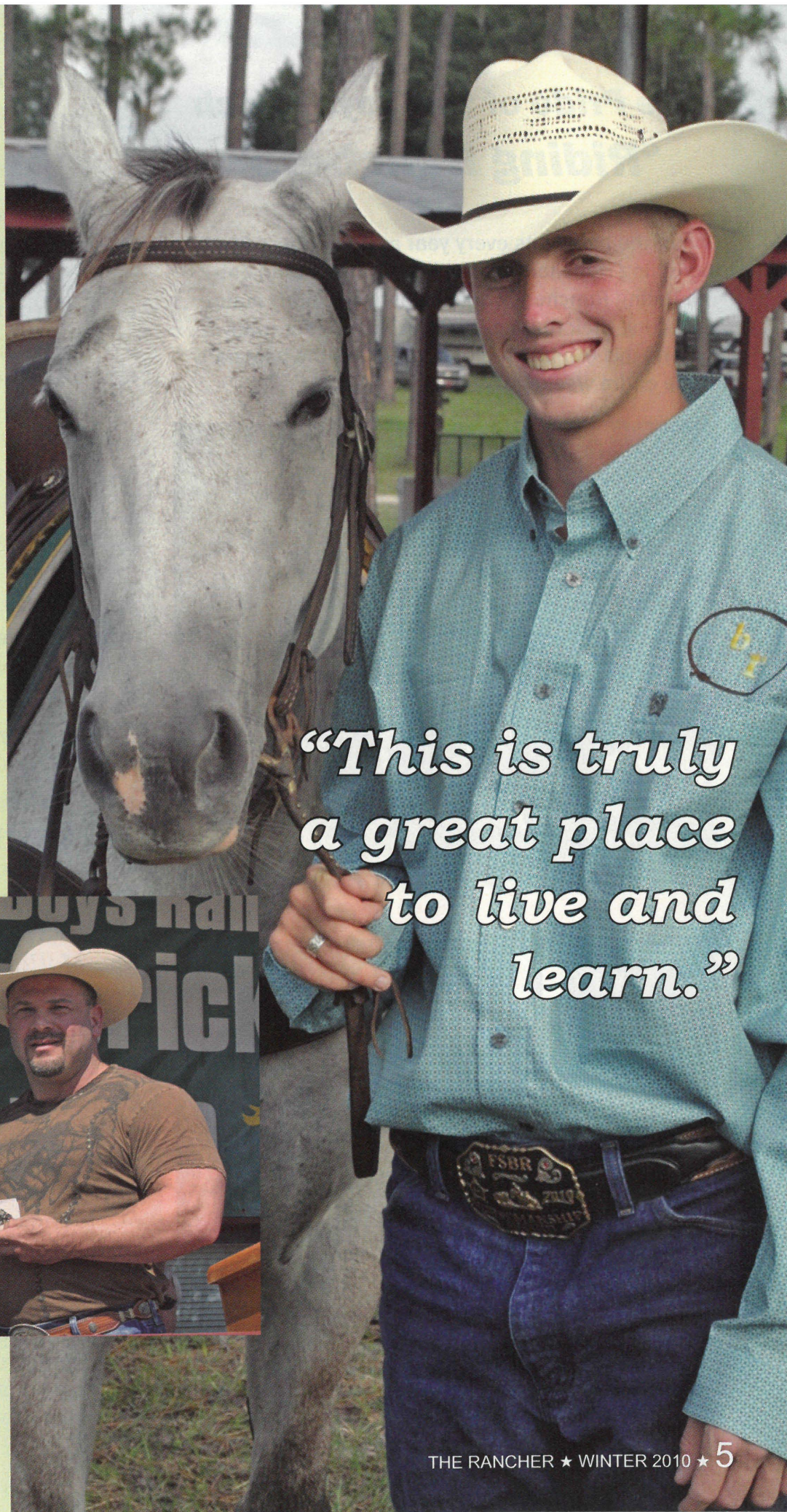
Sheriff Steube made a very special introduction of the Tweed trophy winner Ty, who then spoke to our guests.

I would especially like to thank the donors for giving graciously so boys like me can get our lives right before it's too late. Thank you for this honor!"

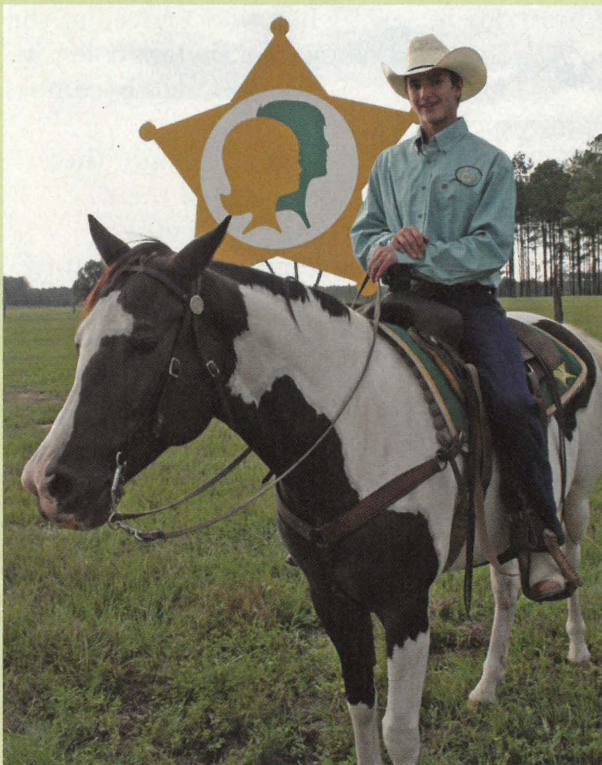

Her mother died when she was very young, and her father passed away in 2008. Ally was only 15. She went to live with other family members, but nothing fit quite right. Her grades fell dramatically (1.8 GPA) because she was truant from school.

Sitting on the fence, Ally realized she could jump off into a life of negative behavior and rebellion, or choose a new path for her future. After considering several options, Ally agreed it would be in her best interest to live at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch.

“Moving to the Ranch meant I had to give up several things, including driving privileges and my phone...that’s pretty tough to do for a teenage girl, but I knew I would be better off here. I look at my time here as a small brick in the wall of my entire life. I may not have as many ‘things’ but it has opened up many new opportunities for me.”

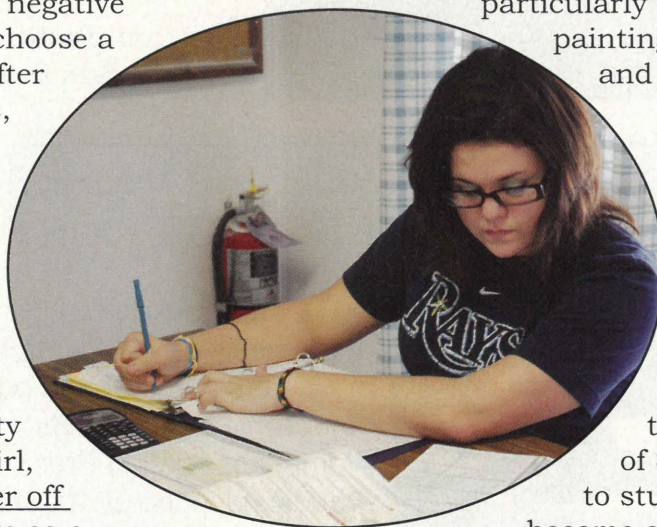
“Here, I can work on myself, improve myself. I have already pulled my grades back

up. Last grading period I made the honor roll with all A’s and one B,” Ally exclaimed with pride. Before, I was a good person, now I am even a better person!”

Ally has immersed herself in life at the Ranch. She now has nine other “sisters” and enjoys playing volleyball and other activities, particularly musical theater, drama, painting and pottery projects in arts and crafts.

She is an outgoing, friendly young lady who is very enthusiastic about her future. “I am so proud of the grades I have achieved while here at the Ranch. I will graduate this spring and plan on attending a local community college and then transfer to the University of South Florida. I would like to study forensic science and then become a Crime Scene Investigator.”

Ally expressed her sincere appreciation to the donors who support the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches. “This is not a waste of your money. This program has helped me move forward with my life and given me opportunities I didn’t think were possible. **Thank you for caring about kids like me!”**

"I am so ready for this chapter in my life to begin," said this bright honor student. "College will be a challenge I can and will conquer."

Her first semester is going quite well. She lives on campus and has become fast friends with her roommate. Jeanely also works on campus in the athletic department and has already been "on the field" tending to the health needs of the players. "I love this. It is exciting to be a part of the Florida Southern program, and to get real life experience in my field of study."

Like any typical college student, Jeanely has occasionally called back to the Ranch for some extra financial support to buy a specific calculator for her Algorithms math class and a new college shirt to wear as a uniform when she is at official sporting events. Fortunately, between her work money and the Youth Ranches scholarship funds, we can meet her needs. Imagine 21 Kids in College at One Time!



It is with a heavy heart that Florida's Sheriffs and the Youth Ranches family mourn the loss of Sheriffs Ranch Alumnus and United States Marine Lance Corporal Nathaniel "Nate" Joseph Schultz, age 19, who was killed in Afghanistan. Lance Cpl. Schultz was assigned to the 2nd Battalion, 6th Marine Regiment, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, Camp Lejeune, N.C.

Nate was a resident and honor student at our Safety Harbor campus for nearly two years and graduated from our program at the same time he graduated from Countryside High School in 2009. After graduation, he fulfilled his dream of joining the Marine Corps. Nate was an honorable and goal oriented young man who received the leadership award on campus, along with several other awards. He was featured in THE RANCHER magazine which specifically highlighted his desire to serve our great country. In that interview, Nate stated "Everybody here helps you...They know who you are and see what you can become. They help you make better decisions about how to act which has helped me a lot."

Over the 53 years since the founding of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches, we have seen hundreds of our graduates serve our country in the Armed Forces. Currently, we have graduates proudly representing us in all branches of the military. We are saddened that our young hero had to make the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom and our country.

Nate stopped by the Safety Harbor campus just weeks before he was deployed to Afghanistan. He was able to reconnect with many of the staff and residents as he shared with them some of his experiences as a Marine.

Although all of us who knew Nate are heartbroken by the news of his death, we also know he was following his dream and was so very proud of being a Marine. To his Youth Ranches friends, Nate epitomized the Marine Corps motto "Semper Fidelis – Always Faithful."

My brother, Nathaniel J.A. Schultz believed in the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch programs that are offered as a community service to Florida's youth who are at risk for delinquency. My brother was part of the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch family from August 10, 2007 until he graduated successfully from the program on June 2, 2009.

I remember my brother before he entered the program. Like many teenagers his age he had troublesome behavior, which provoked my parents to place him in this alternative living arrangement. Nathaniel (or Nate as his family and friends knew him) was intelligent and bright. Before entering the Sheriffs Youth Ranch, Nate made decisions that led to unlawful and irresponsible acts.

While he was at the Sheriffs Youth Ranch he was able to use those qualities and many others that he possessed for a positive outcome for himself and for those around him. He strived while at the Youth Ranch and was transformed into a very well behaved, well-respected teenager. He was a natural-born leader and had a drive to become exceptional. Everyday he would push his body, mind and soul to become better than he was the day before.

Nate often times came home on his family weekends and explained how he was mentoring other teenagers who were also part of the program. He was genuinely concerned for the wellbeing of every individual in the cottages at the Youth Ranch. He often times confided with me how the others there had come from the same background as he. Nate was excited to help the community and be part of something bigger than him.

The two best things about the Ranch, Nate once said with a smile, "it keeps people on the right track and there is always plenty of food."

Nate was a completely different boy before joining the Sheriffs Youth Ranch and after accepting things that he couldn't change in his life; our family began to see changes in him, positive changes. The level of intelligence, which our family knew he had all along, was reflected in his schoolwork; his grades were excellent and made honor roll nearly every nine weeks. His leadership skills made him extremely likeable and dependable. He worked a part-time job at Sweetbay Supermarket in Safety Harbor, teaching himself responsibility and showing what a hard worker he had become. Nathaniel showed respect to everyone; speaking to someone while looking them in the eye and absorbing what the other person was telling him.

Joining the United States Marine Corp was something that Nathaniel believed in. He

always expressed the need to be the best of the best. He strived to be superior. He wanted to prove, not only to himself but also to everyone, that he was the best. The Marine Corp made my brother complete. Nate was influenced by the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranch to go for his dreams, achieve the impossible and be proud of his accomplishments.



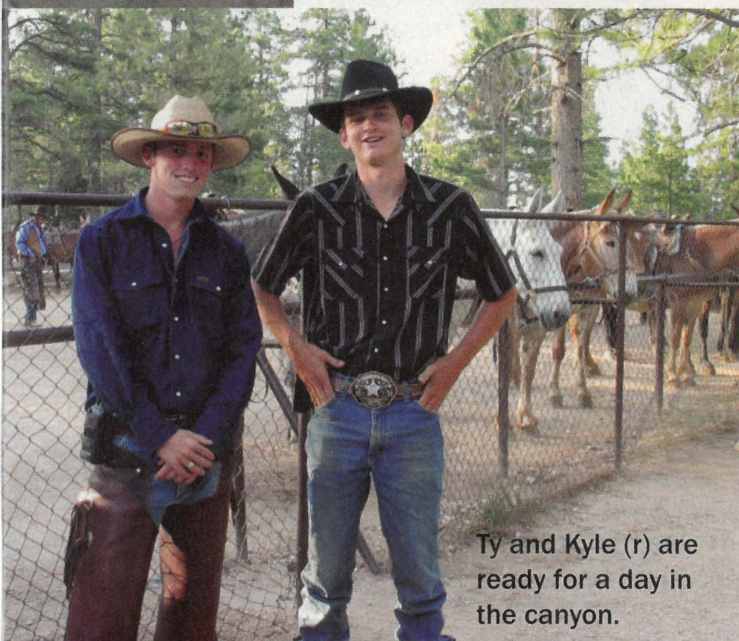

Ironically, some of our donor family actually met Ty and Kyle while on vacation. Here is what they shared with President Bouchard:

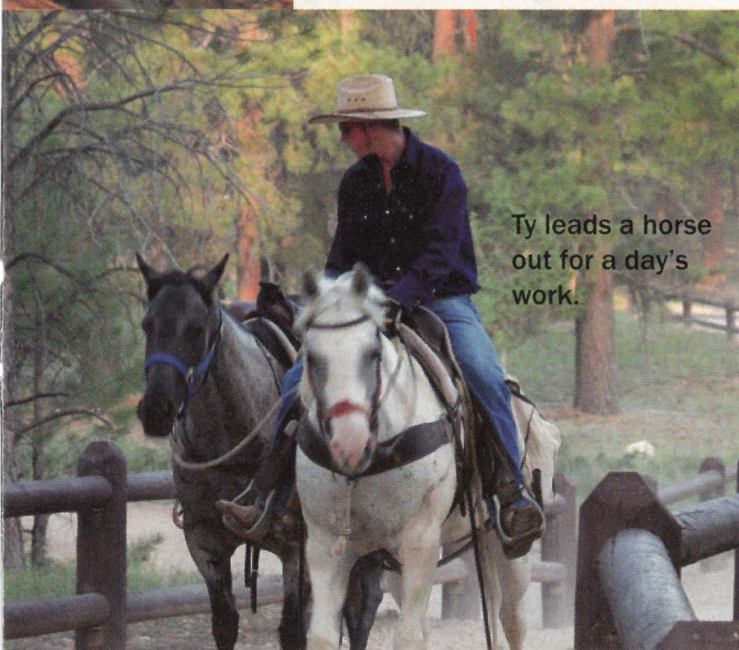

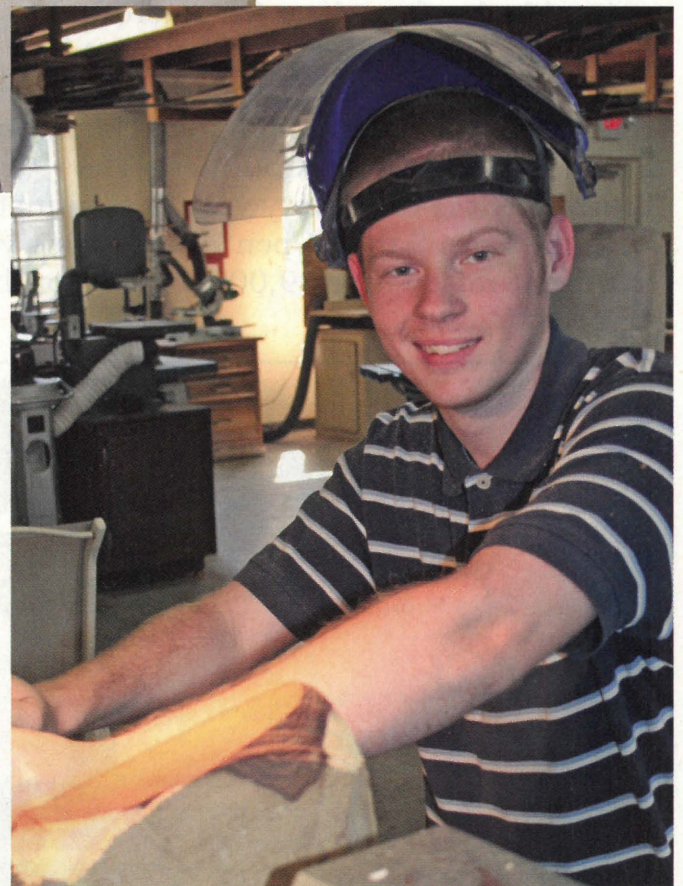
Metro and have fixed it up. I get 44 mpg and it costs me \$17 to fill it up. I also pay for my own car insurance, etc."

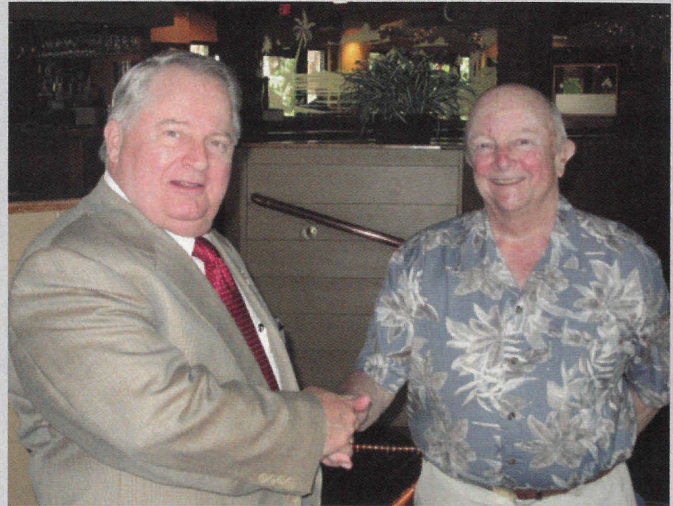
