# President's Perspective

As 2013 winds to a close, I can't help but be amazed at how quickly another year has gone by. It seems like such a short time since we began the year and now we are looking back at the months behind and the children who came to us for help.

During the past year, we cared for 292 boys and girls in our residential programs. Ages ranged from 3 through 18 and they came to us from all over the state of Florida. Many came from abusive or neglectful home situations while others were heading down the path toward trouble in school, home and in their communities. We are also seeing an increase in children who had been adopted but experienced serious problems in their adoptive homes and need our help.

We also provided camping experiences for over 4,000 boys and girls at our residential camps as well as our community based mobile day camps. This partnership with county Sheriffs Offices not only provided children a fun filled week of positive activities but also gave them a new image of the law enforcement officers who worked with them.

One of the areas I am most proud of is the fact that 18 of our graduates are now attending college on Youth Ranches scholarships. The tutoring, counseling and training they received while in our care is helping them better their chances for a successful life as adults.

Unfortunately, we also had to close two of our cottages at the Boys Ranch during the year due to a lack of funds. This means we have twenty fewer beds for children who need residential care. We are working hard to raise enough money to keep all of our beds open but have not reached our goals at this time.

I would ask each of you as we enter this holiday season to consider the many unfortunate children in our communities. There are so many who live in difficult or even dangerous situations. They come to us for help and we rely on your generosity for the money needed to care for them and give them the tools they need to become productive in the future. Please consider a gift to the Youth Ranches as a part of your Christmas list.

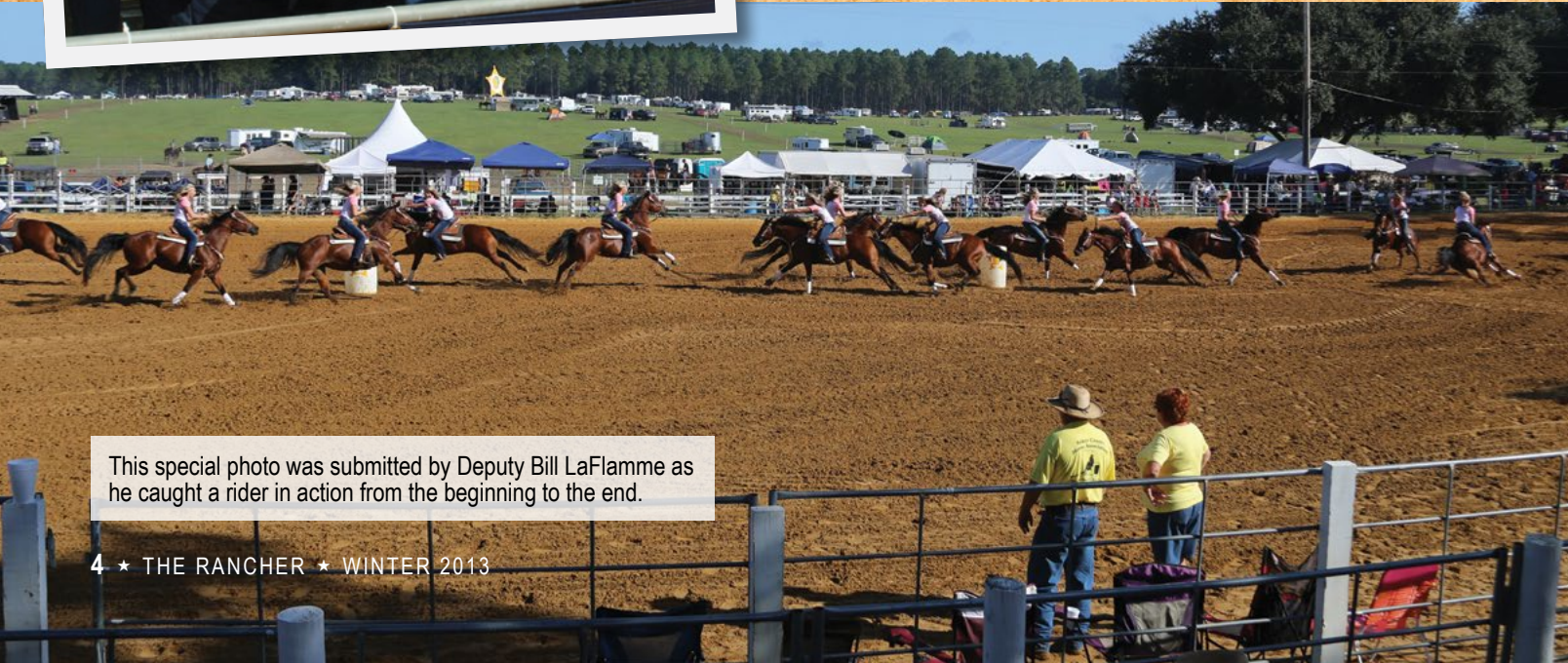

## Wyatt Wins the Tweed Award!

**H**ello everyone my name is Wyatt and I have been at the Ranch now for 2 years. I came to the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch on a very dark and gloomy day, the 7th of December which also happens to be the anniversary of the attack on Pearl Harbor. I had many preconceived notions of the Ranch, mostly negative and unpleasant; the only glimpse of light in this dark time of my life came from the words of my Uncle, and former Rancher, Buddy Rollison who summarized his time on the ranch as simply "the best years of his life." Today, 2 years after my admission to the Ranch, I stand here before you on this occasion and

the words that come most naturally to me in describing my time on the ranch are simply "these are the best years of my life."

The Tweed award has been an ultimate goal for me since I discovered its importance and purpose, and today I gladly accept this recognition. This award means a tremendous amount to me; not only does it recognize my skills in horsemanship but also signifies accomplishment, my accomplishment, my determination to overcome all the odds, my never ending endurance that encouraged me when knocked down get back up, when broken down rebuild and succeed, adapt and overcome no matter what. The things I



have learned on this journey have changed me for the better and those around me I have influenced.

There are many people who have made this honor possible for me. First and foremost, Mr. Jeff Parker, and his wife, Mrs. Patrice Parker who have taught me many skills and life lessons. The most apparent is the development of my skills in horsemanship. Learning these skills has broad-

ened my horizons in my choice of lifestyle and career development. Being a horseman has also presented a variety of opportunities that occupy the majority of my free time. Time that in the past would have normally been spent getting in trouble or making poor decisions. Furthermore, working with horses has taught and strengthened many life lessons such as patience, compassion, commitment, and follow-through. Mr. Jeff has also taught me about the anatomy, dietary needs, tendencies, and mentality of horses through both equine activities and the educational course that he instructed on the profession of Farrier. As a result of learning these valuable skills and life lessons, I have received awards from the Florida Sheriffs Boys Ranch recognizing my skills in Agriculture, improved Horsemanship, and now today the Tweed Horsemanship Award.

Another person who has had a substantial influence in my progress as a horseman is Mr. Cedric Perry. He taught me one very valuable social skill—the skill of discretion. I have learned that no matter how mad someone makes me or how much I may disagree with something they say, if it’s not my place to say something, don’t say anything!



Two more and possibly the two most influential people in my life are Mom and Pop Bryant. Mom Bryant has been a second mother to me that has given me many second chances and Pop Bryant has been the Father I never had. Together they have taught me everything I need to know to become an honorable man and productive member of society. Integrity, sincerity, accountability, time management, and the endless pursuit of wisdom are just some of the countless characteristics that they have instilled in me to make me the person I am today and for this I am thankful.

I would also like to take just a moment to thank a few of my closest friends and family who encouraged me greatly to achieve this award; Devin, Tim, Tank, Jacob, Morningstar, Mom and Pop Lawrence, and my Mom Sheila. Thank you all for your faith in my ability to succeed. I would also like to give a very heartfelt and sincere thanks to Carlton and Suzanna Tweed, Bobby Vincinzi and his family even though they may not be here with us today. # Nekesha's Journey

We have several opportunities each year for Alumni or youth to speak about their time at the Youth Ranches. This summer Nekesha shared her story with our Board of Directors. She has a unique perspective as she is a student at the University of South Florida working on her Bachelor of Science Degree in Behavioral Healthcare. She remarks one day she might work for the organization that made such a difference in her life. Please read her story, in her words.

"This year, as part of my course requirements, I took two classes titled Disciplinary Issues in Behavioral Healthcare and Introduction to Applied Behavior Analysis. These courses teach that children and teens tend to react well to different behavior modification programs that run effective positive disciplinary procedures in the instances of bad behavior. This is based on the idea that there are no bad children, just bad behaviors and poor decision making.

Everything I learned in those courses, based on my own experience, I can sum up in four words—Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches.

I am at a point in my life where I can understand exactly why I succeeded in completing the program, graduating from high school and moving on to higher education. That reason is – during my stay at the Florida Sheriffs Youth Villa and through the course of my poor behaviors and decision making, all the staff were practicing and implementing the methods of positive discipline out of genuine care and love.

The methods can be implemented all day long, but if the child doesn't feel as if it's genuine or that the staff truly care about the behavior or poor decision making then the methods won't work. I have developed a strong work ethic, sense of responsibility and respect from my experience at the Youth Villa.



My cottage mom would redirect our behavior when observing conflict and then follow-up later to help resolve the issue. She would give me a hug, let me know she deeply cared about me and the decisions I made, and would send me off to bed. Pop would give attention to our appropriate behaviors and taught us how to communicate correctly regarding our needs or wants.

The best thing about this program is there is never a consequence that goes unexplained and positive behaviors were always recognized. Good behaviors beget positive reactions and privileges. This is what being at the Villa taught me. This resulted in my turn around and I am so appreciative of the staff and how they helped me change.

I will graduate with my Bachelor of Science Degree in Behavioral Health Care and a minor in Applied Behavioral Analysis in the summer of 2014. I don't know how to express how appreciative I am for the Ranch and the consistent support and encouragement I have received over the last six years. I am grateful the Ranch is my steady companion on my journey." ★

### Proclamation 2013-2

#### Support for Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches and Residential Programs

**WHEREAS**, the Sheriffs of the State of Florida, through the Florida Sheriffs Association, established the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches in 1957 as a program to heal and care for young people in this state; and

**WHEREAS**, the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches is a nationally recognized, licensed and accredited nonprofit program providing services to over 135,000 children since inception; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs provide a safe 24/7 supervised living environment where boys and girls grow up in a loving family home where they remain free from harm and are provided support and encouragement from loving staff who recognize each child entrusted to their care for their individual accomplishments while substituting in place of the youth's natural family; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs provide vocational opportunities that promote growth and development offering a diversity of programming along with a milieu of therapeutic services that promote personal growth in the healthy development of self-confidence, self-esteem and self-appreciation aimed at facilitating future success and independence; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs seek to maintain whenever possible, positive connections with families, promoting changes in the home, providing positive parenting techniques with the goal of successfully reuniting the child with their biological family or a relative caregiver; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs provide opportunities to establish and maintain positive relationships with a multitude of adults which afford a child the probability of establishing long term and long lasting relationships with positive adult influences, while providing opportunities to develop a mastery of skills which will remain with the youth throughout their lifetime; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs provide opportunities for spiritual growth and development in a setting where morality is consistently modeled by the adults who work and live with the youth within the residential community; and

**WHEREAS**, residential programs can provide on campus education that promotes educational consistency thus increasing academic and vocational success through the inclusion of school enrichments like sports, recreation, arts, tutoring, counseling, and access to college scholarships.

**THEREFORE**, the Sheriffs of Florida represented by the Florida Sheriffs Association do hereby declare their unyielding support for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches and the residential programs they provide. We strongly support these types of residential programs as an option for children and youth, both privately placed as well as those in care and custody of the State of Florida.

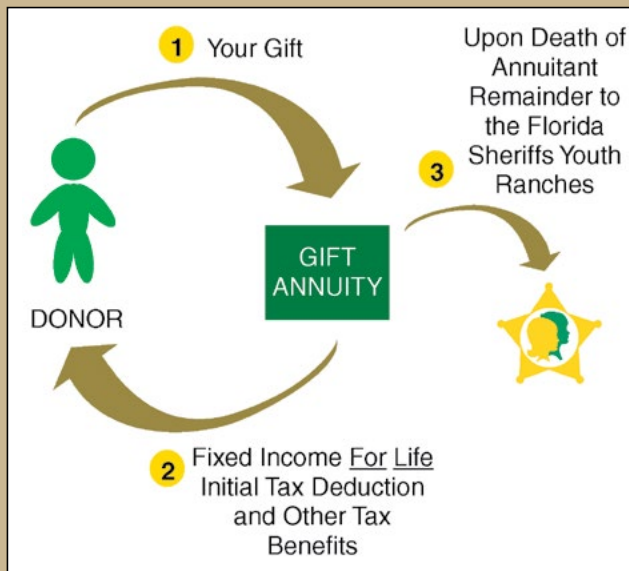

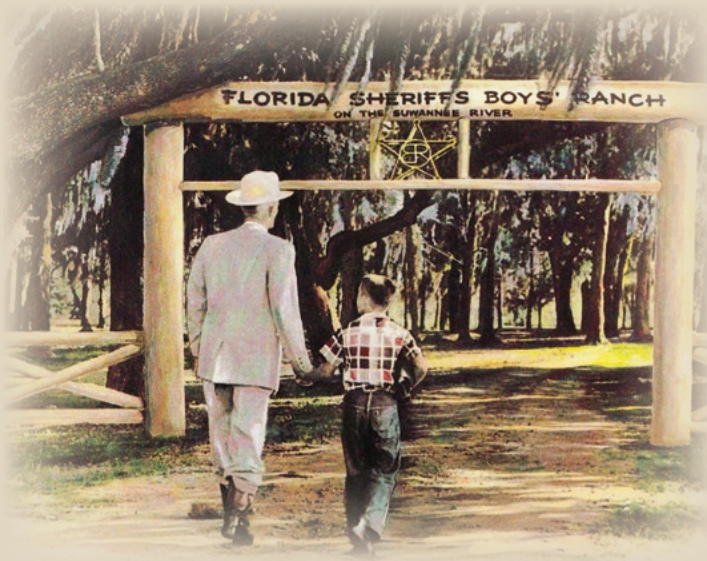

# Family Legacies Come in Many Forms



Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some chose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association

- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch
- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

These are just a few options to consider. As always, we encourage you to discuss this with your personal attorney or advisors to chart the best course for your future and remember to update your will annually as things and people in your life change!

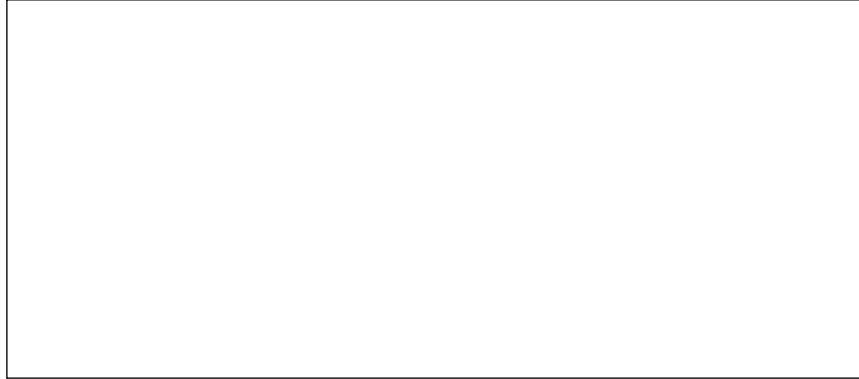
