President's Perspective

"What a difference a year makes" has been a much used statement over the years. It has been used to describe a changing world to a change in our personal lives. This statement hit home during our past 57th Anniversary at the Boys Ranch while I stood and addressed the crowd from the podium box as the new President of the Youth Ranches. While standing there, I remembered that only a year ago I was watching from the far side of the arena like I had been doing for the past 29 years. Now I was the one being watched. I do not mind telling you that my anxiety level was high. In fact I was just plain scared that I might stumble so badly that it would reflect poorly, not only on me, but the entire Youth Ranches. Then a small miracle occurred and everything seemed to fall into place.

The miracle moment was when three young men sitting proudly in the saddle of their horses rode into the arena carrying the flags representing our Country, the United States of America, our State of Florida and our Boys Ranch. Afterwards, another five young men joined them and commenced to put forth a show of true horsemanship. Many of these young men had never ridden a horse before coming to live at the ranch. Yet here they were putting on an exhibition that would make any experienced rider proud.

Miracle moments happen every day here at the Youth Ranches! It may be the moment a young boy or girl receives their first "A" on a report card, or praise for job well done. It could be when a child realizes that someone truly cares what happens to them. Or it could be when their cottage parents say the words that so many children long to hear, "I love you". My miracle moment that day on the podium was remembering that everything we do is for

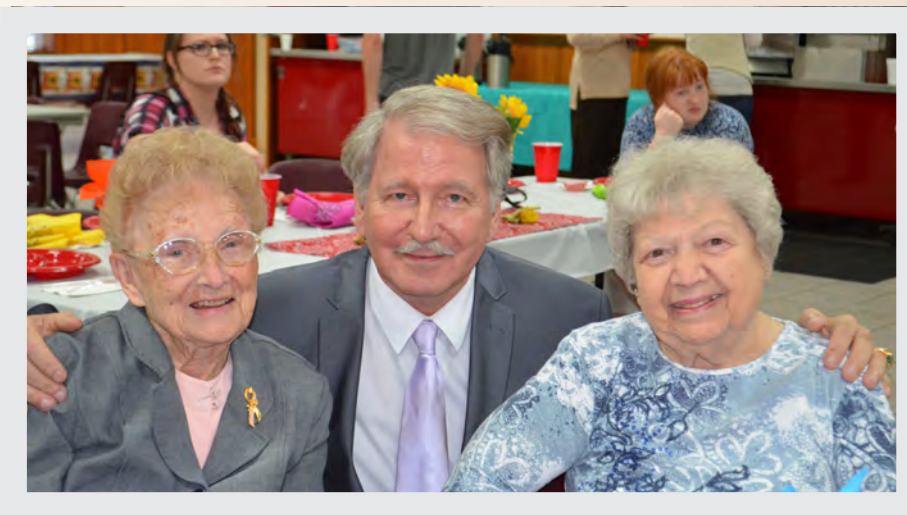

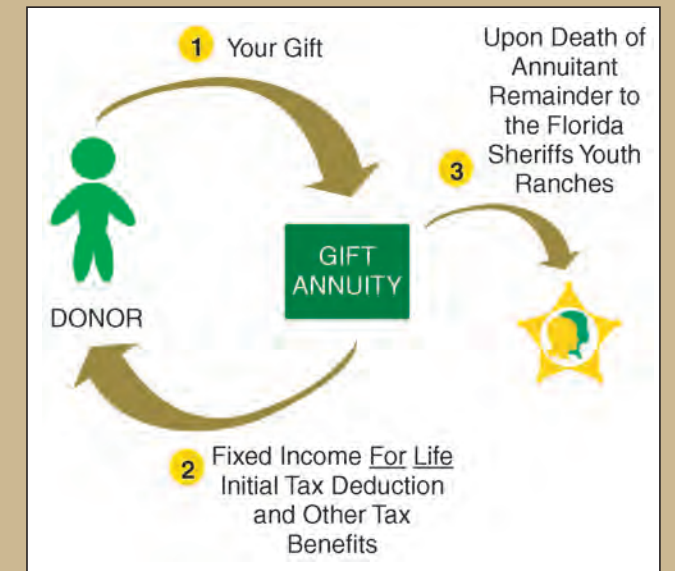

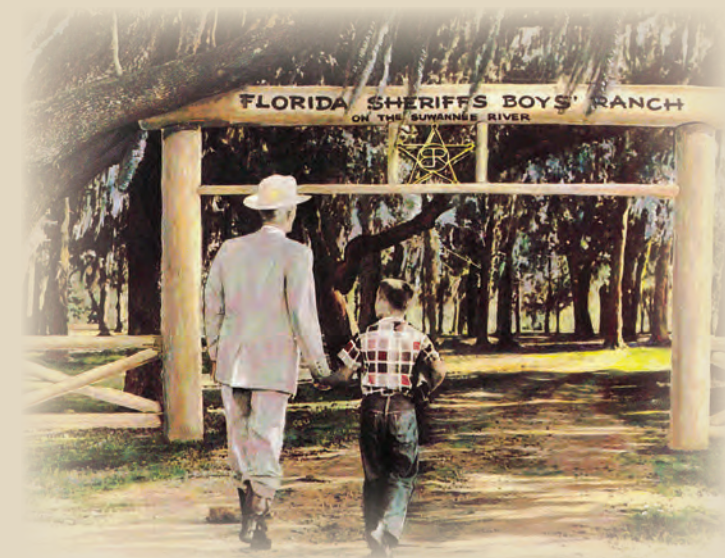

Family Legacies Come in Many Forms

Visiting with different donors, we get ideas about how they want their family to be remembered. Some chose to leave all their money and property directly to their family, hoping they will continue to support favorite charities. Others have made specific plans to ensure their charitable wishes are followed.

Here are a few of the more creative ideas we have seen in recent years:

- Naming the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches as a beneficiary of a life insurance policy, retirement account or bank account
- Specifying a particular percentage of your estate for the Florida Sheriffs Youth Ranches OR the opposite, specifying a particular percentage or piece of property for your heirs and leaving the remainder of your estate to the Youth Ranches
- Investing in a charitable gift annuity where the remainder after death goes to the Youth Ranches
- Making a cash gift of \$1,000 or more to the Youth Ranches in honor of a family member and request they be made a Lifetime Honorary Member of the Florida Sheriffs Association

- Contributing a minimum of \$10,000 and creating a family named endowment fund at the Ranch
- Establishing a Charitable Remainder Trust where distributions (set amount or %) are made to family members for a period of years and once complete, the balance is donated to the Youth Ranches
- Establishing a Charitable Lead Trust where a distribution (% or set amount) is made to the Youth Ranches for a period of 10 or 20 years, then the balance is distributed to your heirs when they are older and better prepared to receive these funds

These are just a few options to consider. As always, we encourage you to discuss this with your personal attorney or advisors to chart the best course for your future and remember to update your will annually as things and people in your life change!

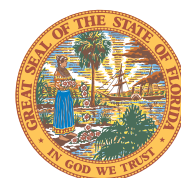

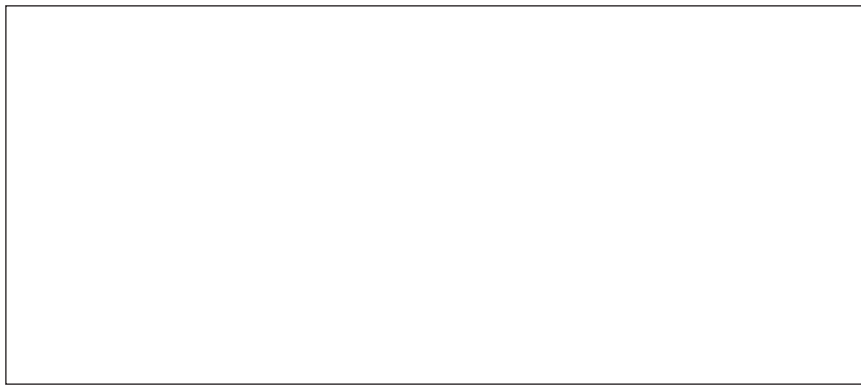
